

HOMILY BY REV. RUDY OFORI

A CLASSLESS FAITH

In today's second reading, which comes from the letter of St James, we hear this simple advice: "My brothers, do not try to combine faith in Jesus Christ, our glorified Lord, with the making of distinctions between classes that the well-dressed man who enters the synagogue, with gold ring glinting its own message, naturally deserves more attention and care than the poor man who enters at the same time. If preference is going to be made, it should reflect the declared preference of God: he chose those who are poor according to the world, to be rich in faith and to be heirs of the kingdom he promises.

God's preference for those who are poor according to this world is seen clearly in today's Gospel. Jesus comes face to face with a deaf man who has a speech impediment. The man is doubly afflicted: he is a Gentile, hence regarded by orthodox Jews as

unclean, and is also physically disabled. Jesus takes him aside, away from the crowd, and cures his deafness and his stutter. Mark emphasizes the response of the crowd, who publish their judgement that Jesus has done all things well. Thus, the messianic prophecy of Isaiah heard in the first reading is seen to be fulfilled: "the ears of the deaf are unsealed... and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy."

Out of his infinite passion Jesus' love is available to everyone, without any presuppositions or any conditions. He is not disconcerted by the disabled; neither is he prejudiced against those not of his own race or religion. His own uniqueness is not employed to lord it over others, but to be of service to them. In his presence there is no need to hide one's disability, no one has to remain isolated in a wordless world, no one has to be rejected because of difference. Jesus' acceptance and love open

(cont) up new possibilities; for him, nothing is settled. Prejudice, on the other hand, tries to settle everything.

Jesus knows that people shrink back under indifference, are wounded by prejudice, are hurt when they are rejected. Prejudice handicaps everyone it touches; it allows fear to dress up as social and religious propriety; it sneaks its way into our laws. It is a killer disease.

It is always good to remember that whoever we meet, God has first loved them. So let us be challenged by the words of wisdom: Our first task in approaching another people, another culture, another religion is to take off our shoes for the place we are approaching is holy. Else we may find ourselves treading on another's dream. More serious still, we may forget that God was there before our arrival.




IMPORTANT MESSAGE



PB&J SANDWICH UPDATE

Congratulations to our generous parishioners. Since we started this project over 72 weeks ago, we have collected over 38,700 PB&J sandwiches for Casa Maria. In addition, the Saturday Sandwich Squad has made over 13,800 lunches with 27,600 sandwiches for Casa Maria. The need continues to exist.

Please follow clean techniques, place the PB&J sandwiches into an individual Ziploc bag, then replace into the loaf wrapper. Also starting immediately, as the temperatures are getting warmer, we cannot safely accept refrigerated / perishable items, such as Yogurt, at the outdoor table.

In addition, there is a need for sneakers or sturdy shoes, no heels or dress shoes. A labeled box for the shoes will be under the sandwich collection table outside of Church on Tuesdays and Fridays from 7:30am to 11:00am.

who ran into danger to be of aid.



NEW SCULPTURE INSTALLMENT AT THE MARY UNDOER OF KNOTS SHRINE ON MOUNT LEMMON

August 27, 2021



The Mary Undoer of Knots Shrine on Mt. Lemmon has now installed their newest sculpture. It depicts the Theophany which is known in the Western Catholic Church as the Epiphany. It is placed on the baptismal font that runs through the grotto.

"The baptismal font and the grotto are set into the creek that runs between the chapel and the bell tower. There is a walkway down from the chapel into the creek and then another walkway out of the creek to the bell tower. This allows for a full procession from the chapel to the baptistery and a return to the chapel for the liturgical celebration of Baptism, the Eucharist and Chrismation."

The artist, Brian Donahue, is also known for making a lot of the artwork at St. Augustine Cathedral, Tucson AZ. He says his inspiration for this new sculpture came from the shrine itself.

"Since the shrine is Byzantine, I felt it was important to maintain that style of art. So, it blends in with all the other beautiful iconography found throughout the complex. Due to the size and shape of the stone Baptismal grotto, I felt a bronze relief would fill the space better than a statue and allow for a more complete story of the Baptism of Jesus by being able to include more figures and elements. Plus, the grotto only allows for a front view. A three dimensional statue would have been a waste since only two dimensions are visible," said Donahue.

"I transported it to the shrine on Mt. Lemmon in the back of my son-in-law's pick-up truck. With the help of friends and family we had to hand-carry the art down the steps and into the grotto to do the installation by hand," stated Donahue. Donahue says creating this sculpture was a spiritual journey for him; a journey that he hopes will bless others.

"I hope the work I have done will bring an added joy to those who visit the shrine for Mass or other Sacraments. This was a very spiritually rewarding project for me. The kindness of the Kinghorn's and the beauty of the shrine made it a real pleasure. I

strongly recommend everyone to visit the Mary Undoer of Knots Shrine," said Donahue.





