JESUS' TEACHING ON DIVORCE

Every great religion has sacred stories which account for the beginning of creation and the human race. The book of Genesis has two stories of creation, the second of which we hear in today's first reading. God fashions man of dust from the soil and then breathes into his nostrils a breath of life. God's breath is man's life. When God plants a garden in the midst of the wasteland, this garden becomes man's first address. He inhabits a beautiful place in Eden, but the wasteland still surrounds his domain.

The man God creates is the human race; he embodies in his person the whole of humanity. He is not one human being among many; he is the Human. To relieve man's aloneness, God begins work at creating a helper. Then there is the striking and comical image of God creating all the beasts and the birds which he brings to man to see if he will name any of them "helper." There is a long procession of candidates for the post: man gives names to them all, but none is named helper. After the interviews, man is still alone. Clearly, God has to think again.

That original vision of unity completion is what Jesus calls on in today's Gospel. Some Pharisees asks Jesus if it is against the Law for a man to divorce his wife. When Jesus asks his interrogators what Moses commanded, they reply that Moses permitted it. The Law allowed divorce to the male partner provided that he safeguarded the woman's interest by giving her a writ of dismissal, which freed her to marry again (Deuteronomy 24:1-4). What the Law did not settle was in what circumstances divorce was legal. Divorce was man's prerogative. A woman could sue, asking the court to compel her husband to divorce her; but it was he who divorced her. There was little agreement about the grounds for divorce. The strict school of Shammai interpreted the only ground to be adultery; the lax school of Hillel allowed a man to divorce his wife for trivial causes - if she displeased him, "even if she spoiled a dish for him." Not surprisingly, divorce was common in the time of Jesus, and marriage offered little security for a woman who could be dismissed at her husband's whim. Jesus seeks to change all that.

In his answer to the Pharisees Jesus does not question the validity of the Law of Moses but claims that it was a concession to human sinfulness. He recalls God's original plan for marriage, revealed in Genesis: that man and woman be united in an indissoluble bond. For Jesus, what God intended from the beginning is the norm for every marriage. And in attempting to restore marriage to a serious lifelong commitment, Jesus' argument also protects the woman from being treated as a disposable possession of her husband.

In a world where marriage was taken lightly because divorce was managed easily, Jesus calls everyone to go back to the beginning to uncover the original plan of God. It is a call to return to the roots of marriage, an invitation for man and woman to see their commitment to each other in the light of God's seeing. This is not to punish people with idealism, but to invite them to

live in loyalty to God's original call.

Experience teaches us that things do go terribly wrong. People do make mistakes. Infidelities do happen. Hurt does appear on the agenda. Spouses do become victims and oppressors. Endless silences do happen. Marriages do collapse. There are legions of causalities to prove this, the walking wounded of broken marriages. The Church does try to make provision for human failure and inadequacy, even if the help seems to many to be slow in coming. Nevertheless, the Church must submit to the vision of Jesus, and that vision remains the norm. Because we believe that marriage is a sacrament, we refuse to see it as a casual experiment for adventurous people. In recalling Genesis, Jesus invites all of us to catch up with our beginning.



REFLECT ON THE READINGS

First Reading

The author of Hebrews tells us that we are "brothers" with Jesus in our common experience of suffering and death. In what way do you find comfort in this idea?



BISHOPS EMERGENCY DISASTER FUND: HURRICANE IDA

At the end of August, Hurricane Ida made landfall on the Gulf Coast and continued to the Northeast, killing dozens, damaging churches, homes, and businesses, and leaving communities without power along the Gulf Coast and the Northeast. After Hurricane Katrina, Hurricane Ida is the second most damaging hurricane to hit Louisiana and the sixth costliest in damages. Millions of people were affected by the devastating wind and rain, catastrophic flooding, and tornado outbreak that damaged hundreds of Catholic parishes and schools across the southeastern and northeastern United States.

Countless neighboring communities have risen to aid those affected by the hurricane by driving supplies to areas in need or sheltering refugees. Several states away, in Arizona, the Diocese of Tucson can still support the relief efforts taking place across the nation by contributing financially.

As we respond as a unified Church, please prayerfully consider supporting the USCCB's Bishops Emergency Disaster Fund in a **special second collection on October 17th**. Parishioners are urged to support the pastoral and reconstruction needs of the Church as well as the efforts of Catholic Charities and Catholic Relief Services, the official relief agencies of the U.S. Catholic Church. Local agencies will respond to the dire and immediate needs as well as aid in long-term rebuilding and recovery efforts.

USCCB President, Archbishop José Gomez emphasized, "Despite the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, we know the generosity of our people and their deep care for those in need. I have confidence in their prayerful consideration and generous response."

Prayers continue for all those impacted by Hurricane Ida, some of whom are friends and family of many in the Diocese of Tucson.

ABC'S OF FOSTERING VOCATIONS


L: Let your children see their Baptism pictures. Have the children make and send a card or note to the priest who baptized them promising him they will pray for them. Let your children notice an attitude of openness to God's will in you.

M: Make time for teenagers in your life: your children and their friends, nieces and nephews, babysitters, etc.

N: Name the gifts of each family member on their birthday. Express gratitude for these gifts.

O: On the date of your child's baptism, talk about the life of the saint for whom the child is named (or the saint's day it is). There is plenty of information about the background of saints on the Internet. The saints are people from all walks of life who tried to make a positive difference in the world--a goal as real today as it was for the saints.

P: Pray for the seminarians of the diocese by name if you can find out their names; you may want to "spiritually adopt" one of them.



The Mysteries of the Rosary—Have you ever wanted to explore the life of Jesus and Mary in a deeper way? Each decade highlights a sacred episode: *Joyful Mysteries:* Through the Annunciation (1) and Visitation (2), we get a glimpse at Mary's joyful yes to God. She gives birth to Jesus in the Nativity (3). Mary and Joseph present their son at the temple (4) and bring him there again when he is a teenager (5). *Luminous Mysteries:* Jesus is baptized in the Jordan River (1) before Mary gives him a nudge to his first miracle at Cana (2). Jesus proclaims the Gospel (3), is transfigured on Mount Tabor (4), and institutes the Eucharist (5). The light is shining! *Sorrowful Mysteries:* Jesus prays in agony in Gethsemane (1), knowing his hour of suffering has come. After his betrayal and arrest, Jesus is scourged (2) and crowned with thorns (3). He carries his cross (4), and Mary stands at the foot of the cross as he is crucified (5). *Glorious Mysteries:* Christ is risen in glory (1)! After appearing to those he loves, he ascends into heaven (2). Jesus' followers receive the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (3). Mary, unaffected by original sin, is assumed body and soul into heaven (4), where she is crowned queen, humble mother of Christ the King (5).






