

HOMILY BY REV. RUDY OFORI

POWER AND SERVICE

Jesus tells the two brothers that they don't know what they are asking. He has already spoken about how he will be handed over to the religious authorities, who will condemn him to death and hand him over to the pagans, who will mock him and scourge him and put him to death. The two disciples mention nothing of all this. Their request is to share Jesus' power when he comes into glory, so timing their appointment to begin when the suffering is done. Jesus brings the conversation back to what happens before the glory.

Jesus' kingdom is not about who wears the crown, but who bears the cross. So, he asks the power brokers: "Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptized with the baptism with which I must be baptized?" They boast that they can. Jesus

tells them that they will have a share in his sufferings, but it isn't for him to assign who sits where in the kingdom. The message is clear: there is no shortcut to God's favor.


Not surprisingly, there is trouble when the other ten disciples hear how the two brothers have tried to set up a junta. So, to avoid more conflict, Jesus reflects on his own image of religious authority. The model for religious authority must not be the pagan rulers: they lord it over others and make their authority felt. Jesus' command to his followers is unambiguous: "This is not to happen among you." Before anything else is said, his followers must not imitate those whose standard of greatness is how much power and control they have over people. That has nothing to do with the Gospel.

Jesus' image of authority is

the one who is servant of all. If there is primacy in his community, it is a primacy of service. Jesus' image of greatness is service" is not some advertising gimmick, more ingenious than accurate. It addresses real problems. We all know people whose image of service is indistinguishable from fascism, whose insecurity makes them lord it over others, to make sure that their authority is keenly felt. As someone who fled when people wanted him as their king, Jesus is suspicious of people who need to arrange their own enthronement.

Jesus does himself what he asks others to do: to serve, not to be served; to give love freely, not to exact everyone's worship;

to reach out to those in need, not to wait for adoring approval. Christian discipleship is a service industry in which there should be no unemployment. There is work for everyone. And as we become more aware of the giftedness of all God's people, we see many new ministries arising in the Church. This should continue, until all Christians feel that their service is not only called for but is actually wanted in the Church. When that happens, we shall be a serving people.

Gospel


Jesus uses the request of James and John as a teachable moment for his disciples on the importance of humility and service to others. What other qualities do you think are necessary for true discipleship?

We are defined by what we give when we have no hope of being reimbursed, rewarded, or recognized. The Apostles understood this, *eventually*, and they gave accordingly. Most of them gave their very lives. Remember, they're just like us. If they can do it, we can too.

CATHOLIC Q&A

PSYCHICS AND MEDIUMS


Question:

Are Catholics allowed to visit psychics? Why or Why not?

Answer:

It's part of human nature to experience some sense of unease and fear about the future. This can lead some people to seek out the services of psychics or consult horoscopes or turn to other occult practices or resources (e.g. Ouija boards or tarot cards). The Catechism of the Catholic Church is very clear that Catholics should avoid such practices: "Consulting horoscopes, astrology, palm reading, interpretation of omens and lots, the phenomena of clairvoyance, and recourse to mediums all conceal a desire for power over time, history, and, in the last analysis, other human beings, as well as a wish to conciliate hidden powers. They contradict the honor, respect, and loving fear that we owe to God alone" (no. 2116).

Despite the uncertainties we might feel, we are called to have faith and trust in God, confident of God's desire for what is best for us. This means that **we are called to surrender, to pray and to reflect on how we can best move into the future in hope, knowing that God is with us.**

Saturday, December 11 at 9:30am. This morning workshop will be hosted by Most Holy Trinity Church in Tucson.
OR Saturday, December 11 at 5:00pm. This evening workshop will be hosted by Salpointe Catholic High School and held in Foundation Hall.

Guadalupe is both a painting and a text and understanding these dynamics takes much more than a few minutes of contemplation. It is important to know the two languages that shaped it: Catholic theology and pre-Hispanic mysticism. This workshop by Fr. Emanuel Franco-Gomez, O.Carm., will be an opportunity to explore the rich symbolism that has shaped the spiritual life of millions of people for five centuries. Participants will have an

opportunity to stop and contemplate the image, going beyond the mysterious apparition to go deeper, behind the lines and colors, the shapes and the details. The tilma of Guadalupe is a mystical poem that can transform the hearts of those searching for God through the "the flowers that never fade and the songs that never end." About the presenter: Fr. Emanuel ("Manu") Franco-Gomez is a Carmelite priest currently serving as the chaplain of Salpointe Catholic High School in Tucson, Arizona. Originally from Jalisco, Mexico, Father Manu has completed degrees in philosophy and theology and is currently pursuing a Master of Fine Arts in illustration. An accomplished artist, composer, and writer, he is known mostly for his illustrations for the Missal Romano, commissioned by the USCCB and published by Liturgical Press in 2018.


