

The Public Beginning

just as we rarely think of Jesus needing help. But in today's feast we celebrate those two things: Jesus makes a big beginning to his ministry, and he receives help in the power of the Holy Spirit.

All the Gospels agree that John the Baptist was very important in the life of Jesus. It is the towering, fearless of John that stands between the hidden life of Jesus and his public ministry. Before Jesus goes to John, he is known by the local people simply as the son of a carpenter, who stays in the small town of Nazareth. After his time with John, Jesus becomes widely known as a wandering preacher with a unique prophetic mission. Clearly, something happened to Jesus while he was with John. He underwent a change that gave his life a new direction.

While he is with John, Jesus makes his big beginning. As Peter says in the second reading, "Jesus of Nazareth.... Began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism." John was a very important turning point in the life of Jesus - so important that Jesus says of him later: "of all the children born of women, there is no one greater than John" (Luke 7:28). And in the fourth Gospel we are told that the first disciples of Jesus are ex-disciples of

In fact, John was so important that some people in the first century thought that he was the Messiah - as Luke tells us in today's Gospel. One of the reasons they thought that was because like many people Jesus went to John to be baptized. Perhaps that is why Luke has the baptism in prison before he tells the story of Jesus' baptism: to assure his readers of the

supremacy of Jesus!

In today's Gospel we heard how after We rarely think of Jesus as a beginner, his baptism Jesus is at prayer. The opening of the heavens is a signal for the descent of the Spirit. You can see the Old Testament backdrop for this scene in Isaiah when he writes: "Look down from heaven, look down.... Do not let your compassion go unmoved, for you are our father.... Oh, that you would tear the heavens open and come down" (63:15-

> Now Luke celebrates the time when God no longer holds back but rends the heavens to signal the beginning of Jesus' ministry. Jesus is anointed for his prophetic mission by the Holy Spirit, the great enabler, the one who helps people to achieve God's plan. So, Jesus is not alone when he makes his great beginning. He begins his journey in the power of the Holy Spirit and in the love of the Father. He starts out on a difficult road that will eventually lead to an appointment with death.

> As we celebrate Jesus great public beginning, we look at our own beginnings. And if some of them look a bit shabby now or half-hearted, we take consolation from the Gospel challenge to begin again. There probably won't be any doves or voices from heaven, but as Gospel people we make our beginnings like Jesus. We are not alone. We make them in the power of the Spirit and in the love of the Father. So let us take courage to face our own road.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS I HOPE I AM LIKE HIM

"Who is this Christ? Is he like you?"

Perhaps you've heard this story, often attributed to the life of St. Teresa of Calcutta. A sick man asked her this question, as he marveled at her tireless service to himself and others in the name of someone named Jesus Christ.

"He is nothing like me," the saint is said to have answered. "But I hope I am like him."

Though the authenticity of this exchange cannot be verified, its message rings perfectly true: all the value of our stewardship lies in its relativity to the one in whose name we perform it.

Consider the figure of John the Baptist — a magnificent, towering character even purely from a literary or historical perspective. A martyr who fed on wild locusts and boldly spoke truth to power — a man so great some mistook him for the Messiah.


But why is he great? Because he prepared the way. All his accomplishments and escapades mean nothing if they are taken out of the context of salvation history. He only makes sense relative to Christ — and this is exactly as he wanted it. "One worthier than I is coming," he insists. And because of that humility and that total embrace of God's will, he is given one of the greatest honors in the New Testament — he baptizes the Son of God.

Let's examine our lives in the light of their relativity to Christ. How do we prepare the way? When Christ comes to us, what do we do? How do we leave ourselves open to be actors in God's plan?



Forgive us our isolation.


Help us to see with your eyes: eyes which notice one another and help us understand.


=Live the Liturgy=

Saint Story of the Week St. Hilary of Poitiers January 13

Born a pagan, St. Hilary (c. 315 – c. 367) studied philosophy and the meaning of life, eventually making his way through the bible. He became a convert and was appointed bishop of Poitiers in 353. Sometimes referred to as the Hammer of the Arians, St. Hilary defended the Nicene Creed against a popular heresy, Arianism. He was exiled to Phrygia for opposing Roman emperor Constantius II, who preferred the heresy which denies Christ's divinity. From Phyrgia St. Hilary fought with his pen, zealously writing against the heresy.

Eventually he was allowed to return to Poitiers, but did so by a circuitous route, preaching against Arianism all the way. St. Hilary was likely the first writer of hymns in the West, his writings on the Trinity, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew survive today. St. Hilary was created Doctor of the Church, a title given to those who provided important contributions to theology and doctrine, in 1851 by Pope Pius IX.

Report of St. Mark's Financial Position for the 2020-2021 Fiscal Year

December 2021

Fellow Parishioners,

Herewith you will find the details of our 2020/2021 year end fiscal position. We wanted to share the good news with you. It was a very difficult year for all our parish families as well as our parish "family", those working for the parish as well as all the wonderful volunteers that make our parish so special. A blessed thank you goes out to Father John and Father Rudy for their spiritual guidance as well as Father John's special attention to the shepherding of our flock in very trying times.

As we look back at a year well lived in the St. Mark family, we especially thank our parishioners for their continuing support of the parish and all that it provides. We are building up a reserve for future expansion of our facilities when construction might make economic sense.

The best to you all for all your support and heartfelt contribution to the life of our parish.

Statement of Financial Position (Balance Sheet)

Assets: St. Mark Assets include cash in our savings account, representing a three-month reserve of ongoing expenses, cash in our General checking account, provided by Offertory collections, and utilized for operating purposes, a Restricted checking account funded by pledges and Building Fund donations to be used only for debt reduction, and Other Restricted Cash to be used only for purposes specified by the donors. The other primary Asset is the value of our land, buildings and equipment.

Liabilities: represent the amounts we owe others or are for specific earmarked purposes. Liabilities include the current balance of the loans, and the remaining amounts to be expended for specified purposes from the Other Restricted cash donated by generous parishioners.

Equity: is the amount Assets (what we own and have on hand) exceeds Liabilities (what we own).

Statement of Activities (Income Statement)

Revenues: includes Contributions, Grants & Bequests which covers various offertory contributions; Fees for Service is comprised of Religious Education and Little Tots fees and other contributions generated from Mass intentions, Weddings, and Funerals; Activity revenue includes fundraising and Candle donations; Investment Income covers building fund interest; Flowers and Decorations and Religious Ed-Other fundraising are as titled, and tracked independently.

Expenses: is comprised of Employee compensation and benefits. Personnel Residency includes our Priest's meals, utilities, and phone. Office Administration includes office supplies, internet, phone, postage, copier maintenance, and support, computer maintenance and support, compliance fees and bank fees, and travel expenses; Property Support Costs include, utilities, insurance for the entire property, consumable supplies, building equipment, repairs, and contract cleaning services. Program and Curriculum Expenses are for Liturgical expenses, Sacramental expenses, Choir and Music, Religious Education and other education expenses and Instructional Materials. Professional and Outside Services include pest control, landscape maintenance, and IT / acoustic consultations; Assessments is made up of Chancery Assessment based on Offertory collection, Priests Assurance Association, Priests Salary subsidy, and Catholic Schools Assessment.

Net Operating Income: represents Net Income excluding Restricted Revenue, Restricted Expense and Interest Expense, effectively the amount of Revenue less Expense used for operating purposes. Our Net Operating Income for 2020-2021 was \$267,215 vs. \$89,760 the previous fiscal year.

Restricted contributions from Pledges and Gold envelopes are to be used for loan payments and expenses specified by the donor for specific purposes.




