



REFLECTION

Christmas 2021

Dear parishioners,

A Blessed Christmas to you all! During Advent we have been reminded that we can choose to hope, to love, to be in joy. In order for these choices to be more than fanciful wishes they need a grounding in our lived experience. As Christians we can choose these dispositions and actions, which are deeper and more sustainable than passing feelings, because we are in touch at some level with our God who acts in ways that lead us to choose hope, joy, and love. Even in the difficulties and grief of the pandemic, the choice for these can be a solid one if we experience God's love in Christ through the sacraments and a life of prayer and actions for God's Kingdom.



At Christmas we welcome Jesus as Lord, the true light of the world. The saving of the world is accomplished because God enters our experience completely, making Self entirely human and making humanity divine by our communion together. It is not mere sentiment that characterizes our least today by instead a sense of the kingdom of light in which the world has become new: "All the ends of the earth have seen the saving power of God."

Where can the light of Christ be discovered in our world? That is the mission of the church. The church, people who are alive and transfigured in the life of Christ, has as its holy mission to be the light of Christ throughout all the ages of unfolding history. Meditating on the Christmas mystery, Thomas Merton speaks to the point: "For Christ, invisible in his own nature, has become visible in our nature. What else can this mean, except that first he has become visible as a man and second he has become visible in his church? He wills to be visible in us, to live in us, work in us, and save us through his secret action in our own hearts and the hearts of our brothers and sisters. So we must receive the light of the newborn Savior by faith, in order to manifest it by our witness in common praise and by the works of our charity towards on another" (Seasons of Celebration, pp. 104-105). May the world find in the Christian community the light of Lumen Christi, 🥜 Christ who lives in its midst.







Common Good



In many Latin American countries, and across the US, there is a beautiful Catholic tradition called "Las Posadas." ... People depicting the

Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Joseph ... are taken in procession from house to house begging for a place to stay... The hymn begins with St. Joseph knocking and asking, "In the name of Heaven please give us some shelter..." [Only] after St. Joseph identifies his wife as "the Queen of Heaven" and "Mother of God's", the owner of the house then has a change of heart and confesses "I was not aware!" and he bids them to enter...

The hymn and the whole "posadas" tradition help those who participate to experience what it must have been like for the pregnant Mary and Saint Joseph to repeatedly hear that there was no place for them. It makes us wonder under what conditions would most of us be moved to open our doors and lives to strangers. Notice that the change of attitude of the owner occurs when he recognizes that among those who were asking to be admitted was - despite all appearances - "Someone special and worthy of respect."

"Las Posadas" is not only a powerful allegory for the current crisis of immigration ... but also a palpable reminder of the Christ-centered truth behind the social teaching of the Church...: Every human person has inherent dignity and is created in the image and likeness of God and, therefore, possesses infinite value and worth. As a result, in every suffering person we are challenged to see "someone special and worthy of respect" - to see the face of Jesus.


