#### For a Synodal Church: Communion/Participation/Mission

Dear Parishioners,

This week we will celebrate the Feast of St. Bridget. The Irish government has even added this day (Feb 1) as a new public holiday in Ireland! Tradition marks this, in Irish celebration, as the first day of spring.

We choose, then, to take this feast day as the beginning of our parish's participation in the worldwide Synod that Pope Francis inaugurated on October 17th. It is a two year process beginning with listening to you sharing and reflecting about your faith, your life in the Church, and how you see the whole Church journeying together in the future. The Holy Father is looking for a fraternal and collegial exchange, begun at the Second Vatican Council, to open new pathways and shed new light on how we might be church.

This invitation to have our voices heard is being responded to as we begin several listening sessions in our parish. The sessions will be available to a wide variety of people in the parish. They will be guided by myself or a staff member inviting people to share and respond to questions sent ahead of time that are meant to trigger feedback and discussion. Your responses will then be sent to the diocese of Phoenix, who will organize these and send them to Rome.

For more on what a synod is and what this one is attempting to accomplish there are many websites to choose from. The USCCB is a good place to start. I like the site explaining the Synod from the organization "Salt & Light."

I hope this small explanation and beginning will become clear as we proceed. We may pray the prayer for the Synod together throughout its unfolding;

"Holy Spirit of God, Lead the Church on our pilgrim path as we listen to You. Speaking through one another. Enkindle your love in our hearts to walk forward together as a Church that accompanies all of humanity on our common journey to You."




