THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Lectionary: 21 Reading I Is 42:1-4, 6-7



This applies to parishioners and non-parishioners. A non-parishioner is one who lives outside the parish boundaries and is not registered. Registration means: To be on the parish files and financially supporting the parish by using envelopes for the weekly offertory for a minimum of six months.




