GOSPEL MEDITATION

It was a normal day by all accounts, but John just wasn't feeling himself. He was a little lightheaded and out of sorts. Later in the afternoon, he experienced a sharp pain in his chest and arm. Quick thinking and action brought John to the emergency department with a diagnosis of a significant heart attack. Surviving this ordeal, he found himself face to face with his cardiologist, having an honest conversation about things that needed to change. "I came close to death," John found himself thinking. Then came the remorse. He was a young man with a loving wife and children who were very close to facing life without him. John found himself with intense sorrow for living an unchecked and self-indulgent life that almost brought him to his demise. He wanted to change.

We all have our wake-up calls. We have experiences and encounters that force us to really think twice about choices we have made and directions we have taken. Often, we find ourselves looking at those we have hurt square in the eye and wallowing in our foolishness. We regrettably realize that we have allowed our needs to lure us into making some cruel mistakes. We impulsively say things and flippantly do things that reveal our unredeemed and unhealed self. It is ourselves we stumble over and try to tame but can't quite seem to master and control. Help!

We spin our wheels, naively thinking that we will somehow, perhaps through persistence, get ourselves unstuck. But, we don't. We just get out of the car, feeling very helpless, and ignorantly look at the mess we got ourselves into. Did we ever think to ask someone for help? Or, taken the advice of One who is wiser and avoid this route altogether? "Come after me," are words that Jesus says to all of us. In order to heed his invitation, we must leave our ego-self behind and follow.

When we really see and understand the freedom, peace, justice, and love he offers, we find ourselves with such sorrow in our hearts for how foolish and silly we have been. All the misguided choices and sinful actions come full view, and we see how risky our random impassioned behaviors really have been. Repentance is beautiful. When done with a sincere and contrite heart, it directs us to the glory that can be ours, ignites us with the challenge of living a life in service of others and reminds us that all is well.

ACTION ALERT FROM THE ND CATHOLIC CONFERENCE

On January 12, several North Dakota lawmakers introduced Senate Bill No. 2180. If passed, this bill would require priests to violate the Seal of Confession or face jail time for not reporting suspected cases of child abuse or vulnerable adult abuse. The measure seeks to remove the ministerial exception from the current mandatory reporting laws related to child abuse, and this would require priests to report suspicion or knowledge of abuse that arose within the context of the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation.

It is important to keep in mind that under current law, a member of the clergy is already a mandated reporter of known or suspected abuse cases that arise from conversations with individuals outside the capacity of being a spiritual advisor. The ministerial exception of the current law states that a member of the clergy "is not required to report such circumstances if the knowledge or suspicion is derived from information received in the capacity of spiritual advisor." SB 2180 would take away the ministerial exception. It would require a priest to report suspected abuse or neglect that is learned about through the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. If passed, a priest who does not break the Seal of Confession and divulge the information can be punished by up to 30 days in prison and/or a fine of \$1,500.

What is important to keep in perspective is that the ideology behind SB 2180 is something we already clearly support. The Catholic Church is committed to protecting children and vulnerable adults. Priests are already mandated reporters. They are required to report any instance of abuse learned about outside of the confessional or in the capacity of spiritual advisor. Beyond that, within our own diocese, a rigorous Safe Environment program is in place. Parishes and schools are required to offer training for all their youth each year to teach them how to identify and respond to abuse situations. Volunteers who work with the youth are thoroughly vetted through background checks. The faithful are equipped with the information needed to identify cases of abuse and report any suspected or known cases of abuse. What is at stake with SB 2180 is the freedom to exercise our religion, specifically the ministry of forgiveness of sins. The forgiveness of sins only God can give, and has chosen to give through the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. The Seal of Confession is there to ensure that every person is free to seek forgiveness from God. A priest cannot break the Seal of Confession in any circumstance. They cannot reveal the identity of anyone who comes to confession, and they cannot reveal any sin confessed by any specific person. In fact, Canon Law states how "a confessor who directly violates the sacramental seal incurs an [automatic] excommunication reserved to the Apostolic See." (Canon 1388 §1)

So while the Vatican noted that combating child sexual abuse is a central concern of the Church, so too is the "long-standing and constant teaching of the Church on the inviolability of the sacramental seal, as something demanded by the nature of the sacrament itself and thus as deriving from Divine Law."

What is at stake in SB 2180 is the freedom to exercise our religion by attempting to place into a truly impossible situation the ministry of forgiving sins entrusted to us by Jesus Christ.
