I pray this update finds you well. December brought an end to my third semester in formation and another Christmas break. Academically, we spent December preparing for our final exams and finishing up our papers that were due near the end of the semester. On December 8th, the feast of the Immaculate Conception, I was privileged to serve the Mass of the final profession of vows for four Missionaries of Charity. The Missionaries of Charity are the order started by St. Teresa of Calcutta and they have a house in D.C. where they care for many in poverty. I was blessed to have the Missionaries of Charity as my apostolate last semester, so I was helping the sisters out every other Wednesday. Helping the sisters was such an impactful experience as I got to witness the tenderness and love that the sisters showed each person that they were helping. The thing that impacted me most was the reality that these sisters do this every single day. The sisters did not do it begrudgingly; they constantly served these men and women with a smile on their faces and with joy in their hearts. Over Christmas break, I got to spend plenty of time with my family as I got to hunt, play cards and catch up with family and friends. After two weeks home, I flew back to D.C. to go on the five-day silent retreat that all of us seminarians at Saint John Paul II do every year. One thing that stuck with me over the last month is relationality. More specifically, relationality in regard to prayer. It was really easy for me to turn to prayer when I needed something that I couldn't do myself, so I asked God to do it for me. I have begun to learn over the past years that prayer is so much more than just asking God to do things for us. In reality, prayer is the relating of one's heart to God. Not just the good stuff but also the stuff that we are ashamed of. God desires to be a part of everything, the good and the bad. It is through relating everything in our lives to God that we grow in relation with Him. Prayer is not only the relation of all the things going on in my heart to God but also the desires of God's own heart to me. There is an intimate connection of two hearts when in this relationship with God. So, I encourage you to bring God into every aspect of your life and to relate all that you do to Him who loves you as His own. And also to remember to ask God what His desires are for you and to listen to what He desires to reveal to you.

Know of my daily prayers for you and I ask you to continue to pray for me.

A very young brother and sister were playing on the beach when the all too familiar ice cream truck made its daily rounds. The boy shook with excitement and delight as he took his sister's hand and exclaimed, "The ice cream man is here, isn't it great!" As they ran off toward the truck, one could hear the girl reply, "Yeah, I can't wait!" The experience of a child's delight in something so simple as ice cream, lifts our spirits from our burdens and transports us to the lighter, more innocent side of life.
