“The Freedom to Believe: Becoming an Adult Catholic”

A recap of the SPX 2021 Advent Mission by Anita St. Clair

Today we celebrate Epiphany, the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles as represented by the Magi (Matthew 2:1-12). The word itself means a moment of sudden revelation or insight. I invite you to not only consider the journey of the three Wise Men, but also your own journey of faith. Are you on a path of wisdom or folly?

If you attended any session of our recent Advent Mission, I am sure you were blessed and enlightened by Fr. Simeon Gallagher's stories and insights on what is required to be an adult Catholic in the world today. Fr. Simeon quoted St. John Henry Newman when he said, "Growth is the only evidence of life." This statement applies to all aspects of our lives: relationships, jobs and especially faith. This was the emphasis of the Mission.

Focusing on the fact that "the Word was made Flesh and dwells among us" (Jn 1:14) and understanding what this means, is crucial to our growth in faith, hope and love. Awareness of this fact gives us insight to who we are as Catholics, and what it means with respect to how we live. Jesus took on our humanity. By virtue of his Incarnation, we must start with our own humanity to achieve our true self. God never forces, he always invites us to respond. He has given us freedom of will and freedom of choice. Fr. Simeon cites the story of the Annunciation. Mary was not coerced; she was free to choose and she said "yes". She was her true self, living in true reality because she embraced the person God created her to be.

But there are hindrances to finding our true self. In our fallen human nature, sink into the trap of the “false self” — the self that feeds into addictions, compulsions, and obsessions. We spend too much on lottery tickets and gambling; cosmetics and plastic surgery, seeking solace in alcohol, drugs, or sex. We find ourselves engaged in a constant battle between the true self which is cooperative with God’s plan and the false self which is always competitive and perpetuates unhappiness.

The second level of hindrance to the true self is seeking social and cultural values instead of spiritual values. We are inherently good, and culture offers blessings and opportunities. Worldly values in and of themselves are not bad. However, when we subscribe to the “Beatitudes of Culture” and societal values become of the objects of self-worth, they condemn us to an unhappy life because we can never have enough. Rather than promoting selflessness, the Beatitudes of Culture generate selfishness. They are:

- ◆ Blessed are the beautiful; their bodies will be admired. *They become obsessed with the exterior comparing themselves to others and lose all sense of the interior and true self.*
- ◆ Blessed are they who possess the latest gadgets, car, or bank account; they will live a life of luxury and ease. *They will never have enough and will spend their lives seeking wealth and impressing those around them rather than enjoying a simple life with family and friends.*
- ◆ Blessed are the tough and powerful; they will get their own way. *They will step on and over people to achieve their goals never lending a hand or showing compassion.*

Living a life based on “The Beatitudes of Culture” leads to a life of imprisonment. They do not prepare us for the adversity and struggle that come with the Beatitudes that Jesus taught. Pain and hardship can empty us of self. The false self will rail against God asking, “Why are you doing this to **ME**?” It is the wrong question. It is a circular question whereby we go round and round with no answer. When our true self stands in front of pain, we should ask, “What am I supposed to learn from this?” This linear question leads us to freedom. Jesus is the example. Faith is tested through difficulty, and no one experienced more pain than he did. If we constantly try to avoid pain, we will become slaves to vice. When we face the truth, we find freedom.

This leads us to a third level of awareness of what it means to be an adult Catholic: we must never stop learning. Fr. Simeon quoted St. Anselm: “Faith seeks to understand itself.” We must go beyond catechism questions and answers. The Church’s teaching has not changed, but we need strategies to deepen our understanding. We do not learn from teachers; we learn from witnesses and as adult Catholics we must be witnesses of the faith.

Everything we have is a gift from God. When Pope Francis was asked by a journalist to describe himself, he responded, “I am a sinful man.” Acknowledging our weaknesses allows God to work through our humanity. The only thing we can claim as our own is sin. As adult Catholics we must respond to God’s grace and bring the light of Christ into the darkness.

We are constantly questing, searching and seeking. St. Augustine said, “Our hearts are restless until they rest in you.” Fr. Simeon used examples from literature to illustrate the human quest for home, for love: *The Wonderful Wizard of Oz* by L. Frank Baum; *Don Quixote* by Miguel de Cervantes; *The Grapes of Wrath* by John Steinbeck; *The Lord of the Rings* by J.R.R. Tolkien and *Harry Potter* by J.K. Rowling. These literary works demonstrate the desire of the human heart to find a place where they belong.

The final example given by Fr. Simeon was the love story that God has written for each of us. Each person has his or her own unique narrative. There are four dimensions of our human story where God touches us.

1. **The Heart** – We seek relationship, tenderness and passion. We hunger for love and belonging. Made for relationship and community, God uses our humanity to show his love. It is the people we love that become the face of God to us.
2. **The Intellect** – When something doesn’t make sense, we ask questions. We seek truth.
3. **The Conscience** – We must tune-in to our conscience and face the challenges it presents. We, like the prophets who were touched by God, must cry out for justice and be ready to pay the price.
4. **The Human Spirit** – God created us to be the best we can be. He uses our experiences to help us find our “true self.”

We won’t be judged at the end of our physical life by commercial success; we will be judged by our choices. We are blessed with the freedom of choice. Choose to be happy. May you journey toward becoming an Adult Catholic by reading Scripture and the lives of the Saints, being witnesses of the grace and blessings God has given you through your baptism and recognize that “Growth is the only evidence of life.”

THE U.S. BISHOP'S THEME 2021 —

"Say the Word and My Soul Shall be Healed"

Please pray for our Faith Formation Catechists and Children, that they hear a healing word in the sharing of our Catholic faith.

The Lord has made his salvation known to the whole world

The loving providence of God determined that in the last days he would aid the world, set on its course to destruction. He decreed that all nations should be saved in Christ.

A promise had been made to the holy patriarch Abraham in regard to these nations. He was to have a countless progeny, born not from his body but from the seed of faith. His descendants are therefore compared with the array of the stars. The father of all nations was to hope not in an earthly progeny but in a progeny from above.

Let the full number of the nations now take their place in the family of the patriarchs. Let the children of the promise now receive the blessing in the seed of Abraham, the blessing renounced by the children of his flesh. In the persons of the Magi let all people adore the Creator of the universe; let God be known, not in Judea only, but in the whole world, so that *his name may be great in all Israel*.

Dear friends, now that we have received instruction in this revelation of God's grace, let us celebrate with spiritual joy the day of our first harvesting, of the first calling of the Gentiles. Let us give thanks to the merciful God, who *has made us worthy*, in the words of the Apostle, to share the position of the saints in light, who *has rescued us from the power of darkness, and brought us into the kingdom of his beloved Son*. As Isaiah prophesied: *the people of the Gentiles, who sat in darkness, have seen a great light, and for those who dwelt in the region of the shadow of death a light has dawned*. He spoke of them to the Lord: *The Gentiles, who do not know you, will invoke you, and the peoples, who knew you not, will take refuge in you*.

This is the day that Abraham saw, and rejoiced to see, when he knew that the sons born of his faith would be blessed in his seed, that is, in Christ. Believing that he would be the father of the nations, he looked into the future, giving glory to God, in full awareness that God is able to do what he has promised.

This is the day that David prophesied in the psalms, when he said: *All the nations that you have brought into being will come and fall down in adoration in your presence, Lord, and glorify your name*. Again, the Lord has made known his salvation; in the sight of the nations he has revealed his justice.

This came to be fulfilled, as we know, from the time when the star beckoned the three wise men out of their distant country and led them to recognize and adore the King of heaven and earth. The obedience of the star calls us to imitate its humble service: to be servants, as best we can, of the grace that invites all men to find Christ.

Dear friends, you must have the same zeal to be of help to one another; then, in the kingdom of God, to which faith and good works are the way, you will shine as children of the light: through our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with God the Father and the Holy Spirit for ever and ever. Amen.

THE MYSTERY OF THE EUCHARIST IN THE LIFE OF THE CHURCH

21. The reality that, in the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ without ceasing to appear as bread and wine to our five senses is one of the central mysteries of the Catholic faith. This faith is a doorway through which we, like the saints and mystics before us, may enter into a deeper perception of the mercy and love manifested in and through Christ's sacramental presence in our midst. While one thing is seen with our bodily eyes, another reality is perceived through the eyes of faith. The real, true, and substantial presence of Christ in the Eucharist is the most profound reality of the sacrament. "This mysterious change is very appropriately called by the Church transubstantiation." Though Christ is present to us in many ways in the liturgy, including in the assembly gathered, the presiding minister, and the word proclaimed, the Church also clearly affirms that "the mode of Christ's presence under the Eucharistic species is unique." As St. Paul VI wrote, "This presence is called 'real' not to exclude the idea that the others are 'real' too, but rather to indicate presence par excellence, because it substantial and through it Christ becomes present whole and entire, God and man." In the sacramental re-presentation of his sacrifice, Christ holds back nothing, offering himself, whole and entire. The use of the word "substantial" to mark the unique presence of Christ in the Eucharist is intended to convey the totality of the gift he offers to us.
22. When the Eucharist is distributed and the minister says, "the Body of Christ," we are to look not simply at what is visible before our eyes, but at what it has become by the words of Christ and the gift of the Holy Spirit – the Body of Christ. The communicant's response of "Amen" is a profession of faith in the Real Presence of Christ and reflects the intimate personal encounter with him, with his gift of self, that comes through reception of Holy Communion.
23. The Church's firm belief in the Real Presence of Christ is reflected in the worship that we offer to the Blessed Sacrament in various ways, including Eucharistic Exposition, Adoration, and Benediction; Eucharistic Processions; and Forty Hours Devotions. In addition, the practices of reverently genuflecting before the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle, bowing one's head prior to the reception of Holy Communion, and refrain from food and drink for at least one hour before receiving Communion are clear manifestations of the Church's Eucharistic faith.

C) Communion with Christ and the Church

24. When we receive Holy Communion, Christ is giving himself to us. He comes to us in all humility, as he came to us in the Incarnation, so that we may receive him and become one with him. Christ gives himself to us so that we may continue the pilgrim path toward life with him in the fullness of the Kingdom of God. The fourteenth-century Orthodox theologian Nicholas Cabasilas described this sacrament by saying, "unlike any other sacrament, the mystery [of the Eucharist] is so perfect that it brings us to the heights of every good thing: here is the ultimate goal of every human desire, because here we attain God and God joins himself to us in the most perfect union." Through this sacrament, the pilgrim Church is nourished, deepening her communion with the Triune God and consequently with one another.
25. The Sacrament of the Eucharist is called Holy Communion precisely because, by placing us in intimate communion with the sacrifice of Christ, we are placed in intimate communion with him and, through him, with each other. Therefore, the Eucharist is called Holy Communion because it is "the efficacious sign and sublime cause of that communion in the divine life and that unity of the People of God by which the Church is kept in being." How can we understand this? The Gospel of John recounts that, when Jesus died on the cross, blood and water flowed out (Jn 19:34), symbolic of Baptism and the Eucharist. The Second Vatican Council teaches, "The origin and growth of the Church are symbolized by the blood and water which flowed from the open side of the crucified Jesus," and that "it was from the side of Christ as he slept the sleep of death upon the cross that there came forth the wondrous sacrament of the whole Church." In this image from the Gospel of John, we see that the Church, the Bride of the Lamb, is born from the sacrificial love of Christ in his self-offering on the cross. The Eucharist re-presents this one sacrifice so that we are placed in communion with it and with the divine love from which it flows forth. We are placed in communion with each other through this love which is given to us. That is why we can say, "the Eucharist makes the Church."

La Eucaristía como “presencia real” de Jesucristo.

3. La Eucaristía es el Sacrificio de Cristo: Sacrificio del Altar.

La Eucaristía contiene todo el bien espiritual y toda riqueza de la Iglesia, es su Tesoro: la riqueza de la Iglesia es Cristo. Qué bello es creer que vengo a Misa a experimentar el amor de Dios; vengo a apropiarme de los frutos de la redención de Cristo: el Amor, el Perdón, la Vida, la Resurrección de Cristo y el don del Espíritu Santo. El la eucaristía Jesús nos muestra un amor que llega hasta el extremo, un amor que no conoce medida y que no tiene límites: No solamente nos dice: Tomen y coman...tomen y beban, para luego decirnos: “Este es mi Cuerpo y esta es mi Sangre” sino que añadió que será entregado por ustedes... derramada por ustedes (Lc 19:20). De esta manera la Iglesia siempre ha visto y creído que la Eucaristía es “Presencia, Banquete y Sacrificio”. Cristo presente en la Misa nos habla y se nos da en alimento y se ofrece por nosotros en sacrificio.

San Pablo nos dice: “Cuantas veces se celebra en el Altar, el sacrificio de la cruz, se realiza la obra de nuestra salvación” (cfr 1 Cor 5:7) El sacrificio Eucarístico es el mismo y único sacrificio de la cruz. Jesús había dicho: “he venido para que tengan vida y la tengan en abundancia (Jn 10:10); “Mi vida no me la quitan, Yo la doy, porque soy el buen Pastor que da la vida por sus ovejas (Jn 10:18) y no hay amor más grande que el que da la vida por sus amigos (Jn 15:13).

4. La Eucaristía como lugar de encuentro por excelencia con Cristo.

¿Dónde nos encontramos con Jesús? ¿Qué cambios podemos ver después del encuentro (Lucas 24:13)

- 1) *En la realidad.* En los caminos de la historia. En el acontecer diario. “Los acontecimientos son como maestros venidos de las manos de Dios” (Pascal). Recordemos que se acerca a los suyos y se interesa por su realidad.
- 2) *En las Sagradas Escrituras.* Les explicó lo que sobre Él decían Moisés y los profetas. La explicación de Jesús provoca una alegría inmensa en aquellos viandantes.
- 3) *En la fraternidad.* La fraternidad es la antesala del encuentro. Quédate con nosotros que ya oscurece. El Otro nos muestra el rostro del Señor. Lucas quiere dejar esto claro para su comunidad.
- 4) *El cálmen del encuentro* acontece en la Eucaristía. En ese momento se les abren los ojos, lo reconocen. Pero, curiosamente, el Señor desaparece de su lado. *La Eucaristía para Lucas es la prolongación de la Encarnación, donde Cristo se hace presente.* Donde la comunidad reconoce de manera plena su Presencia amiga.
- 5) *A Cristo se le encuentra en la comunidad, en la Iglesia,* con la que confesamos que Jesús está realmente presente en la Eucaristía. El Jesús resucitado. Vencedor de la muerte. Señor de la historia. La Eucaristía es fuente evangelizadora y fundamento de la Iglesia, de la Comunidad cristiana y fraterna.

Juan Pablo II en la exhortación apostólica “La Iglesia en América”, nos habló de los lugares para encontrar a Cristo, señalándonos en primer lugar La Sagrada Escritura, leída a la luz de la tradición, de los Padres y del Magisterio, profundizada en la Meditación y la Oración. En el encuentro con las personas, especialmente con los pobres, con los que Cristo se identifica, pero, también el Papa, nos habló de las múltiples presencias de Cristo en la Liturgia, de manera especial en la Eucaristía: “Cristo está presente en los fieles, en la Palabra que se proclama, en el sacerdote celebrante y está presente “sobre todo bajo las especies Eucarísticas”

El Encuentro con Cristo siempre será liberador y gozoso. Liberador porque, en virtud de su sangre preciosa, nos quita las cargas del pecado, y gozoso por que experimentamos el triunfo de la Resurrección de Jesucristo. Dos realidades, dos momentos de una misma experiencia: Muerte y Resurrección. La Pascua del Señor que celebramos en la Eucaristía. Encuentro que nos lleva a la conversión, a la comunión y a la solidaridad con todos.


