A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR



Next weekend we kick off our annual Catholic Stewardship Appeal (CSA). I am extending an invitation to all of our Parishioners to please take part in this worthy cause. Not only does this help us at St Thomas More, it helps the wider Catholic Church and people across Southern Nevada.

Why is the Catholic Stewardship Appeal so vital to the works of the Diocese of Las Vegas and its members? It is how our diocese is able to support and fund many of the extended formation opportunities and important causes that many Catholics count on. This year, the Catholic Stewardship Appeal (CSA) will strengthen the faith of our brothers and sisters in the following ways: Pastoral Outreach (27%), Vocations (25%)—this is special because we have two of our own parishioners in the current Seminarian class, Continuing Education for Clergy (17%), Faith Formation (13%), Catholic Education (10%), ànd Campus Ministry (8%). You can read more about each category in the brochure that will be included in your CSA mailing. There will also be envelopes with brochures available in the foyer for non-registered parishioners starting next weekend. As Bishop George Leo Thomas stated, "through the giving of CSA, we may both obtain to a more perfect, spiritual vision, vision in our own lives, and offer that gift to others, as we together are transformed into good stewards and servants of the Lord, Christ Jesus."

Last year, 715 households (we have over 6,000 registered households) pledged \$309,793.00, and as of January 9th, 2022, \$300,436.50 has been received. As a result, St Thomas More will collect \$48,491.50 which is over our assessment goal of \$251,945.00. With this, we are excited to announce that we will be putting new kneelers in the church next month. We will also continue to work towards financial healing from the pandemic which hit us hard the past two years. As stewards of the Church, God invites us to take responsibility for supporting our local Church and its causes. We do this through our weekly collections to support our parish where you worship. It is through CSA that we support the wider diocesan Church, its ministries, and worthy causes.

For those who gave to CSA last year, with much gratitude and with the utmost humility, I ask you to pledge the same amount again, if possible, to the 2022 Catholic Stewardship Appeal (CSA) in order to reach our new goal of \$251,327.00. You can contribute it all in one lump sum or make monthly payments.

For those who did not give, were not able to give, or those new to our community, with humility, I ask you to please help us increase our household pledges to at least 1,000 households and give whatever you can. Again, this can help benefit our parish in so many ways and we pray that you will please help us, not only reach our hefty goal, but surpass that goal, so that we can put it to good use. You can pledge any amount and make small payments, one lump sum, etc.

There are many options so that we can be as successful as possible. Remember, any and all contributions collected above our assessment comes back to us.

Our community is still celebrating 25 years since the dedication of our Church. We have already enjoyed events and celebrations and we have many goals and visions set in place to help us continue to celebrate and also to keep our worship space and community areas beautiful and sacred. Our visions and goals for our future continue to include replacing the kneelers in the church pews, as well as redoing the cushions, re-carpeting the Church, retiling the hall in the community center, updating the restrooms, and replacing the remaining air conditioning units that need replacement. This will assure that the next 25 years of parish life will be as successful and wonderful as the first 25 years. Although the past two years have been financially tough on our parish, we are called to have hope and believe that all things are possible through Christ and prayer.

Can you imagine what we would be able to accomplish if we were to increase our participation as a community? Together we can achieve our goals, face the challenges ahead, and renew our commitment to one other as brothers and sisters in Christ and his Church.

Think about the many mouths we will feed, the people we will clothe and shelter, the many young men and women who will fulfill their vocations to serve God's Holy Church for the future of our children, the homebound elderly who get to celebrate weekly Mass with us from home, and you, who can continue your spiritual formation and education through the work of our diocese. It is what we are called to do and be. Those who can pledge, please be generous with your donation. For some, this donation may be a burden, and we understand that, so please do what you can. Any pledge given is a commitment for us to continue to perform the corporal works of mercy. God is truly present in our community when others see the good works from our fruitfulness.

Next week you will hear more about CSA at Mass and you should receive your Catholic Stewardship Appeal Pledge card in the mail. Please fill it out and return it to the office or drop it in our collection basket. Once received, an acknowledgment letter will be mailed to you. For those not registered, please pick up your envelope in the foyer of the church.

Please pray for the staff and I as we head into the upcoming transition. Next weekend is my last weekend here at St. Thomas More and I hope to be able to see and speak to as many of you as possible. I, of course, will continue to pray for you.

Live The Liturgy—Inspiration for the Week

Relationships are hard to clarify. Determining whether people in our lives are simply acquaintances and associates or a deeper level of friend is a journey that takes time. Identifying and celebrating those people who really care about us is a lifelong adventure that involves both moments of intense elation and heartache. Some relationships are more easily definable than others. Two people who are in love must decide whether the love they share has the freedom and depth necessary for lifelong commitments. Other relationships may look like friendship but may harbor grave dysfunction and toxicity. Discernment is needed on all fronts. Our relationship with God also needs definition and discernment. God has taken creation as His spouse and human beings as His children. God delights in us and all that He has made. The wedding feast at Cana demonstrates God's investment in all of this, especially our happiness. Life is a time for celebration and great rejoicing!

Saint of the Week—Examples of our **Faith**

St. Sebastian | January 20th

Not much is known about the life of St. Sebastian (256 – 287), except that he was a Roman martyr whose name has been mentioned throughout history since early 350. We see St. Sebastian many times in art, especially from iconic paintings from Guido Reni, Andrea Mantegna and Hendrick ter Brugghen. Historical scholars now agree that a spiritual story has the beloved saint entering the Roman army because only there could he assist Christian martyrs without arousing suspicion on himself. Eventually he was found out, brought before Emperor Diocletian and delivered to Mauritanian archers to be shot to death. Pierced with arrows, he was left for dead, but managed to survive. He recovered from his wounds but still refused to leave. One day, St. Sebastian took up a position near where the emperor was to pass. He confronted the emperor, condemning him for his cruelty to Christians. This time the sentence of death was carried out, and St. Sebastian was beaten to death with clubs. Today he is the patron saint of athletes.

WEEKLY CONTENT

Gospel Meditation—Gain A Deeper Understanding of Scripture

God delights in you. How do you feel when you hear that? Delight usually comes with an exuberant flow of joy that seemingly arises from one's toes with the expression of great glee. Reflecting upon the deep measure of joy God has in us can be a source of joy for ourselves. Delight is infectious. A very young brother and sister were playing on the beach when the all too familiar ice cream truck made its daily rounds. The boy shook with excitement and delight as he took his sister's hand and exclaimed, "The ice cream man is here, isn't it great!" As they ran off toward the truck, one could hear the girl reply, "Yeah, I can't wait!" The experience of a child's delight in something so simple as ice cream, lifts our spirits from our burdens and transports us to the lighter, more innocent side of life.

Life is not meant to be a burden. Believe it or not, God actually wants us to be happy! In fact, the wedding feast at Cana shows us that God even puts His blessing on our happiness. It is okay to celebrate the wonder of ourselves and others. Life is good. It is always interesting to note that Jesus saves the good wine until last. You would think it would be the other way around. The superb quality of Jesus' wine points to the superior quality of life we find in Christ. It is not a life of burdens but a life of wonder and delight! In Christ, we are lifted from the superficial and mundane to a life of purpose, hope, and love.

God is with us through the long haul, through the challenges and sorrows as well as the successes and accomplishments. In spite of the fact that we often wander from the path, God's celebratory delight in us remains. As spouses are asked to remain faithful to each other through whatever life brings, God remains faithful too. This promise remains through this life and into the next. All we have to do is take the advice of Jesus' mother to heart when she says, "Listen to him." This wisdom saves us from foolishly giving in to the illusion that we can make better wine than Jesus.

Questions of the Week—We Invite You To Reflect and Respond to Scripture

First Reading: The prophet Isaiah used marriage imagery (bridge and groom) to describe the Lord's love for his people, Israel. What do you see as some implications of this marriage imagery?

Second Reading: Paul taught the Corinthians that the individual gifts of the Holy Spirit are meant to benefit and unify the community of faith. How do you use your spiritual gifts within your faith community?

Gospel: Jesus turning water into wine at the wedding feast in Cana was one of the first public "signs" he performed revealing his divinity. It also showed Jesus' compassion, sparing the family shame at running short of wine. How do you imagine the family reacted to Jesus' intervention and rescue?

Everyday Stewardship—Recognize God In Your Ordinary Moments

"If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote St. Therese of Lisieux, "spring would lose its loveliness."

Who is God asking you to be today? There is an obvious answer that springs to mind right out of the gate. God wants me to be a good person (a good father, a good husband) today; today, God wants me to be a saint.

But this answer fails to get to the heart of the question. We are all striving today to serve the same Spirit, but we are given different gifts to do so. The one who has the gift of knowledge may fail if today he decides he wants to be a healer. The one who has the gift of "varieties of tongues" might falter in the expression of wisdom.

Think about the wedding at Cana and the players in the scene: the servers, the guests, the bride and groom. They all have a unique role to play, and though it is to the servers that Mary gives the instruction, "Do whatever he tells you," her words apply to all.

Today, are we called to be the servers — do we wait on God's instruction and carry it out, no matter how foolish or impossible it may seem to our human ears? Are we asked to be the disciples, to bear witness to a miracle and to give our testimony? Are we called to imitate the Blessed Mother herself and give encouragement to follow God's word?

Let us examine our gifts and listen in the silence of our hearts to the direction of the Spirit. Then and only then, let us do whatever He tells us.




