





**September 17 & 18, 2021**

Participants in this workshop will be introduced to foundational concepts in Catholic Moral Theology including the Church's moral tradition, natural law, and the formation of conscience. They will then be invited to apply these foundational concepts to contemporary moral issues.

**About the Speaker**

Fr. Joseph Benedict is pastor of Sacred Heart Parish in Saratoga, California. He was previously pastor of St. Joseph Cathedral Parish for nine years. Originally a native of New Mexico, he was ordained for the Diocese of San Jose in 1997 after completing studies at St. Patrick's Seminary and University in Menlo Park. After serving in a number of parishes within the Diocese he completed doctoral studies in moral theology at Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley. In addition to serving as pastor of Sacred Heart Parish he is director of the Ongoing Clergy Formation program and is an adjunct lecturer of moral theology in the Graduate Program of Pastoral Ministries at Santa Clara University.

Just as Jesus and Mary entrusted themselves entirely to the care and protection of St. Joseph as the head of the Holy Family, so too can we follow their example. "Jesus, living under the roof of St. Joseph and being his Son, gave us a personal example of total entrustment to St. Joseph" (Fr. Donald Calloway, MIC).

We may be familiar with consecration to the Blessed Virgin Mary, in particular the method popularized by St. Louis De Montfort which consists of 33 days of spiritual preparation. In recognition of the emphasis the Church has placed on St. Joseph in recent centuries, Fr. Donald Calloway, MIC, has introduced a similar *Consecration to St. Joseph* complete with 33 days of readings and prayers leading up to a prayer of consecration recited on a feast day connected to St. Joseph.

**What does it mean to consecrate yourself to St. Joseph?**


What does it mean for a person to be consecrated to St. Joseph? Well, it basically means that you acknowledge that he is your spiritual father, and you want to be like him. To show it, you entrust yourself entirely into his paternal care so that he can help you acquire his virtues and become holy. Total consecration to St. Joseph means you make a formal act of filial entrustment to your spiritual father so that he can take care of your spiritual well-being and lead you to God. The person who consecrates himself to St. Joseph wants to be as close to their spiritual father as possible, to the point of resembling him in virtue and holiness. Saint Joseph, in turn, will give those consecrated to him his undivided attention, protection, and guidance.

**Flag Day is Sunday, June 14!** This annual holiday celebrates the history and symbolism of the American flag. Learn about the history of this holiday and the beloved Stars and Stripes!

### ***What Is Flag Day?***

**Flag Day** is a celebration of the American flag that occurs each year on the anniversary of the flag's official adoption, June 14.

What we know fondly as the "Stars and Stripes" was adopted by the Continental Congress as the official American flag on June 14, 1777, in the midst of the Revolutionary War. Colonial troops fought under many different flags with various symbols—rattlesnakes, pine trees, and eagles—and slogans—"Don't Tread on Me," "Liberty or Death," and "Conquer or Die," to name a few.

The Declaration of Independence made the adoption of an American flag necessary. Previously, each colony or special interest had its own flag.

On the 14th of June, Congress made the following resolution: "The flag of the United States shall be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white, with a union of thirteen stars of white on a blue field ..." Official announcement of the new flag was not made until Sept. 3, 1777.

### ***Who Made the First American Flag?***

The origins of the Stars and Stripes have become part of American folklore. Although many people believe that Betsy Ross designed and sewed the first flag, there is no true proof of this. However, records do indicate that she made ensigns and pennants for the Philadelphia navy during the war. Various towns in colonial America have claimed to be the birthplace of the Stars and Stripes.

Based on colonial folklore, it has also been stated that the American flag was first flown in battle during the Revolutionary War at the Battle of Cooch's Bridge in 1777. This may also be the [stuff of legend](#).

However, what we do know is this:

The first American flag was designed to represent the 13 original colonies with 13 white stars on a blue field and 13 alternating red and white stripes.

One of the first flag designs had the stars arranged in a circle, based on the idea that all colonies were equal.

In 1818, after a few design changes, the United States Congress decided to retain the flag's original 13 stripes and add new stars to reflect each new state that entered the union.

Today, there are 50 stars, one for each state in the union, but the 13 stripes remain.

### ***History of the American Flag***

- **January 1, 1776:** The first United States flag, the "Grand Union," was displayed by George Washington. It became the unofficial national flag, preceding the 13-star, 13-stripe version.
- **June 14, 1777:** The Stars and Stripes were adopted by the Continental Congress as the Flag of the United States.
- **June 14, 1877:** Flag Day was observed nationally for the first time on the 100th anniversary of the Stars and Stripes—and continues today.
- **June 14, 1937:** Pennsylvania became the first state in the United States to celebrate Flag Day officially as a state holiday.
- **July 4, 1960:** The new 50-star flag was flown for the first time—the flag that still flies today.

Why Is the American Flag Red, White, and Blue?

The Continental Congress left no record as to why it chose these colors. However, in 1782, the Congress of the Articles of Confederation chose the colors for the Great Seal of the United States with these meanings:

- **white** for purity and innocence
- **red** for valor and hardiness
- **blue** for vigilance, perseverance, and justice

According to the End of the Oregon Trail Interpretive Center, the colors originated with the British flag, which is called the Union Jack and was a combination of the Scottish cross of St. Andrew (white on blue) and the English cross of St. George (red on white) at the time. (The modern British flag also incorporates the Irish cross of St. Patrick into its design.)

### ***American Flag Etiquette***

Did you know that there is a proper way to fly the American flag? The **U.S. Flag Code** is an official set of guidelines (not laws) that dictates how a flag should be flown in order to show it the respect and honor that it deserves.

### ***Where May the American Flag be Flown 24 Hours a Day?***

The flag is usually taken indoors at night out of respect, but there are some places where flying the flag around the clock is permissible. Do you think you can guess them?

1. The Betsy Ross House in Philadelphia
2. The White House
3. The U.S. Capitol
4. The Iwo Jima Memorial to U.S. Marines in Arlington, Virginia
5. The Revolutionary War battleground in Lexington, Massachusetts

7. Fort McHenry in Baltimore, Maryland
8. The Jenny Wade House in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania (Jenny Wade was the only civilian killed in the Battle of Gettysburg, during the Civil War)
9. The USS *Arizona* Memorial at Pearl Harbor
10. All customs points of entry into the United States
11. Any US Navy ship that is under way
