### ANOINTING /HOLY COMMUNION OF THE SICK

The Priest will often be available to anoint you after Mass.

Please call the Parish office if you need an anointing or communion of the sick at home. If hospitalized, please let the hospital staff know that you are Catholic and would like Communion or a Catholic Priest to visit you.

### ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is celebrated on Tuesdays after the 5:30 PM Mass and Fridays beginning with morning prayer at 9:00 AM and ending with Benediction at 5:00 PM.

### ADULT CONFIRMATION CLASS

## A CHRISTMAS MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



This time of year can be quite difficult for many. For some, it's the first Christmas since a loved one has passed away. For others, it might be the first season since a child moved away. Possibly for someone else, it's the first holiday season since a divorce or family shake-up. Each of these events, and so many others like these, are what many of our parishioners are going through. It is emotionally scarring, and makes it difficult to share in our faith. However, because of the events some two-thousand years ago in Bethlehem and later in Golgotha, we know that God loves us, and is with us. We have hope.

In last year's Christmas message, I spoke to you about expectations. The start of the pandemic last year changed everything for all of us. In many ways, the pandemic last year made us grow closer as a family, and that sentiment only grew stronger and much more impactful this year. As a priest in my early seventies, I never ever imagined that I would be bringing Mass into your home on a daily basis. I never expected to shepherd a team of people catechizing the faith globally through the Internet. Never. I became a priest in 1984 - when the Internet was only a year old.

This unique opportunity to spread the message and love of God has filled me with so much gratitude.

As we enter in 2022, I want to thank all our parishioners that made our new additions a reality. Through your financial support, offering of talents, and dedicated prayers, we have effectively doubled the square footage of our campus. As one of the fastest growing parishes in the United States, we desperately needed this space.

For the first time ever, our faith formation classes for both youth and adults are now held right here at our parish. Having our faith formation classes here on Sundays has brought much joy to so many. I am also filled with gratitude because our Young Adult Ministry has continued to grow even after the departure of Deacon Roy. As we are incrementally phasing back to our new normal, I look forward to the return of all ministries very soon. I can't wait to witness the joy in your hearts as you go about living as Catholic witnesses through your active participation in our different ministries.





I am also grateful to all of the people that help make the celebration of Mass possible. From my brother priests, Fr. Cam, Fr. Jim, and Fr. Joe, to the hundreds of laity: thank you! Because of your attention to the glorification of God within the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, I have been receiving the two greatest compliments a pastor can get from people on nearly a weekly basis: Stories of how people have returned back (or were led) to the faith and others traveling over fifty miles to experience a Roman Catholic liturgy as prescribed in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal at our parish.

We are celebrating more baptisms than funerals with many families making their way back to the Church. Our parish has its first seminarian in years as Josh Domingcil currently discerns the priestly life at Mount Angel Seminary. Our Faith Formation program has a waiting list because of our exponential growth of families and adherence to teaching the true faith. Our Music Ministry is highly regarded as the finest in the Diocese not just because of the high-caliber musicians, but because our musicians actively study, discern, and present music that reflects Church dogma on music.

I am honored to call each and every one of you brothers and sisters in Christ. Though none of us, including myself, are “the perfect Catholic,” I am continually energized by your zeal for the faith and desire to be stewards for God’s kingdom. I witness this every week as we set new records for attendance at Confession and audibly hear more and more people praying and singing at Mass - even through the dreaded masks!

I know that all of this is only possible by the grace of God entering each of your hearts. I am so full of gratitude.

Let us continue to pray for each other, actively participate in the Sacraments, attend events that deepen our faith, and join a parish group - all to give God glory and praise.

# UPDATE

## Parish Finances



In our diocese, the fiscal year runs from July 1 to June 30. We are now a little over a third of the way, and rapidly approaching the half-way point, through our fiscal year, and wanted to provide you with an update. Because of publication deadlines, the numbers in today's report are off of November 30, 2021 data.

We present this brief report to you in the spirit of full and open transparency with the understanding that the past two years have been extremely difficult financially for so many of our parishioners. We recognize that for many, these financial difficulties will, unfortunately, continue for well into the future.

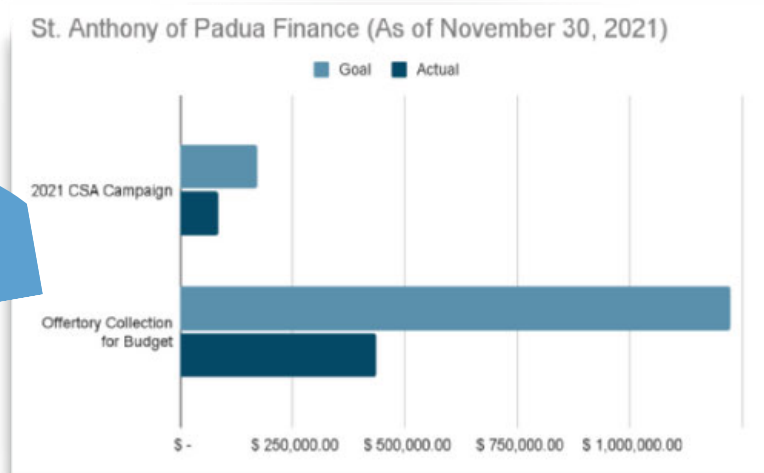
Our parish's Catholic Stewardship Appeal, or CSA, struggled and failed to meet its goal. The diocese set our goal at \$172,093.00. To date, we met just 49% of our goal. CSA funds the activities and services of our diocese that, in turn, support us as a parish.

The diocese uses several metrics to set our annual goal. One of those metrics is the number of registered families. Less than 250 of our 4100 registered families, or about 6% of families, participated in this vital campaign.

On a much more positive note, as of November 30, we are exceeding our budgeted weekly collection goal. Our budget is based on fifty-two Sundays in the year plus a large Christmas collection. (Since Easter must always fall on a Sunday, this is included in the Sunday portion of the budget.) As of November 30, our generous parishioners have contributed \$435,124.11, or 35.5% of our budgeted need of \$1,224,000. This money is used to pay all of our bills that keep the parish running: operating expenses from utilities, payroll, maintenance; upgrading equipment; supplies necessary for the celebration of Mass; and community outreach. We recognize that by effectively doubling our square footage, our operating expenses will most certainly increase next year.

Earlier this spring, our parish finance team recognized that Christmas fell on a Saturday making it likely that our Sunday collection would dip a little bit. This was accounted for in our budgeting. While we will "pass the basket" at our Christmas liturgies, we have also established a special online Christmas collection for those that prefer online giving. We encourage you to visit our website for more information.

Talking about money is never easy, especially in times of economic uncertainty. Because of the financial generosity of our parishioners, our parish is on track for a very healthy fiscal year concluding June 30, 2022. Let us all remember that prayer and gratitude are free. As we head into 2022, let us all offer more prayers and thanks.

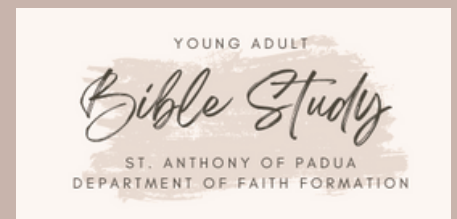
## GOD'S WORD WILL COME TO US

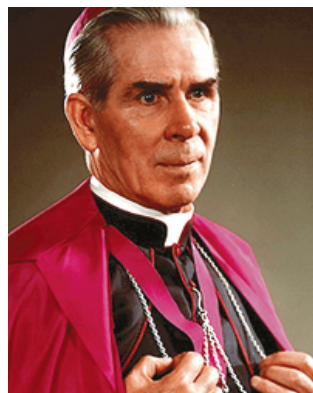
