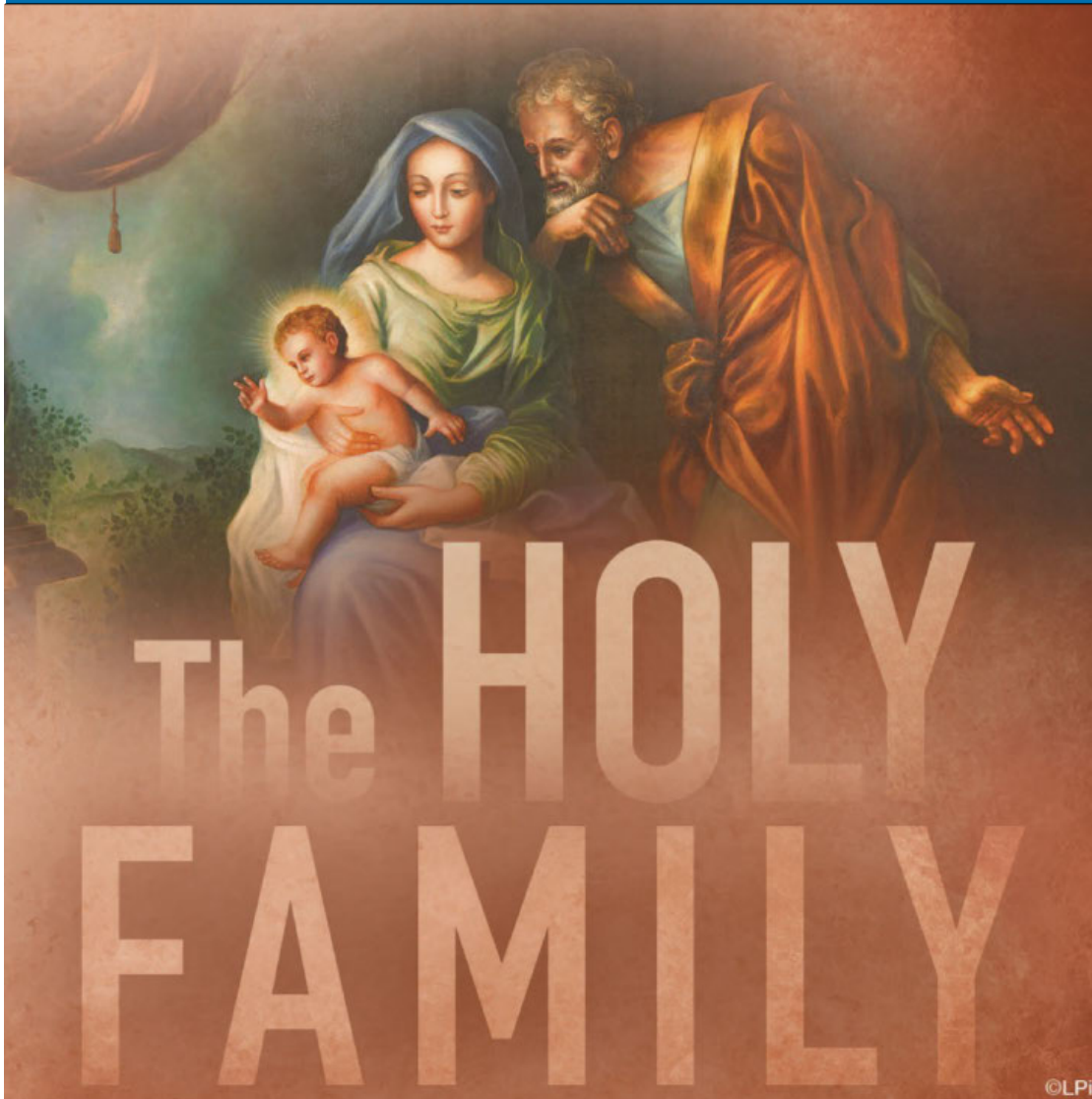

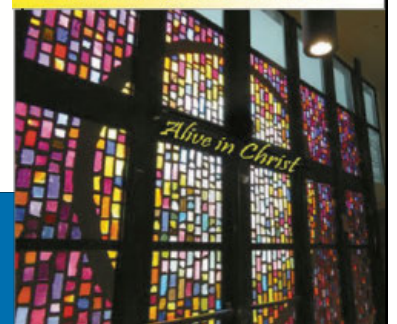

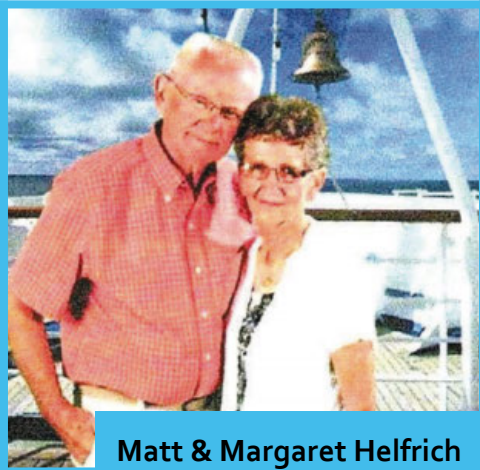

Let's meet **Matt & Margaret Helfrich.**

Please tell us a bit about yourself.

Matt and Margaret have deep roots in Baker, MT. They owned and operated a clothing retail there, Russell's Clothing, for 28 years. Before that, Margaret worked in the drugstore in Baker for a former parishioner of ours, Jack Lawler, and then at the bank. They raised their 3 children there. From Matt: "That store originally opened in 1916, so it was already well-known, but we worked hard - long hours 6 days a week; 7 days a week from Thanksgiving through Christmas! We loved that community, and they loved us. ... and though we had moved to Billings, the new owners invited us back for the store's 100th anniversary in 2016. We were so surprised and

honored that many people came from over 30 miles away just to see us again..." So what made them leave Baker? Matt & Margaret have a daughter and 2 sons: Karla Stanton lives with her family here in Billings, and Kevin and Keith have families of their own in Gilbert, AZ. After Matt and Margaret sold the business and retired in 2004, they were able to attend the sporting events of all their grandchildren in both states; but after two years of driving back and forth, they decided to leave Baker and move to Billings in July of 2006. From Margaret: "We have 7 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren so far. Marissa (she's one of our grandchildren) & Connor Cunningham are in this parish, and their youngest, Kamryn is being baptized here on New Year's Day!" Margaret and Matt will celebrate their 60th anniversary on June 28th. They enjoy playing cards, travelling and volunteering.

Please tell us which Mass you greet at and what brought you to this ministry initially. Do you volunteer in any other ministries?

"We like meeting people and talking! When the parish asked for volunteers here in 2012, it was something we really enjoyed doing in Baker, and something we can continue to do. We always helped as greeters, eucharistic ministers and proclaimers in Baker." They used to serve at the 10:30 am, but since COVID-19 restrictions, there has been a greater need at the 5:00 pm, so that's where they serve now. Matt has been in the KCs for 59 years - 42 years as a 4th degree Knight. Margaret has been in the Catholic Daughters for 55 years. They also help out with our Soup Ministry.

What changes have you seen in your ministry over the years, particularly since the pandemic restrictions?

"We had to be a lot more mindful about how we greet. We had to stop giving hugs and shaking hands. That's been hard." They miss the bulletin crew, coffee & donuts, breakfasts, hospital visits, funeral luncheons and meetings they used to attend. They hope for the return of these events.

As we find our new normal, what message do you have to share with your parish family?

"We feel so blessed to be part of the St. Thomas Parish family. We look forward to getting back to volunteering and gathering again — something close to the way it used to be."



A heartfelt thank you to the St. Thomas parish family from the 150 families with 469 children who were the recipients of the food baskets and gifts. Your generosity provided these families not only with everything needed for a Christmas dinner, but also with groceries to help them get through the two-week break from school. EVERY ACT OF CARE COUNTS. Caring for others is the most important thing you can do. Each and every can or box of food, each ham that you contributed was needed. These families are shocked that we do this for strangers.

The contribution of gifts and the care taken to purchase them is amazing. For many of the children, this is the only time they receive something brand new. A new shirt certainly improves their self-esteem.

Much appreciated are the 39 St. Thomas families who sponsored 53 families! WOW!

Many thanks to the faithful volunteers who donated their time and efforts to bring this ministry to fulfillment. From the ladies of St. Rose of Lima Circle who cut out the ornaments, the knitters who made hats for the children, to the men who sorted and boxed the food, to the ladies who wrote out the ornaments and sorted the gifts, and to all those who delivered on Sunday — well done! May God bless you always.

In preparation for January 2:

AWAKENING

“And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was.” (vs 9)

Matthew 2:1-22



Adults -

1. The Magi symbolize our search for God and meaning in life. God gave them direction (the star to follow). He is always with us. What gives meaning to your life? Has some recent discovery or new passion brought new meaning and depth to your life?
2. In the Epiphany, Jesus is manifested to the Magi and Gentile world. Can you name a recent epiphany (God revealing Himself to you) experience in your life, a recent discovery?
3. What is the one thing Jesus is saying to us in this Sunday's Gospel about how a disciple should speak or act? And what do you need to do or change to be a better disciple?
4. Where do you see the characteristics of a dynamic disciple expressed in the Gospel?

Obstacles of living out the Gospel: Time (to think & work on your relationship with God), lack of knowledge/understanding, etc.



Teens -

1. What does our faith teach us about power and control? What do we know about the gift of free will?
2. What is the definition of the word epiphany? What are your epiphany moments in your faith journey?

Obstacles of living out the Gospel:

Not fully understanding the gift of free will and what it means when we sin or in the choices we make.

Children -

1. If you could give Jesus a gift that expresses something about who you are and the talents you have, what would that gift be?
2. “Epiphany” means a revelation. How has Jesus revealed himself to you or someone you know?
3. How can we live in a way that “reveals Jesus’ love” to someone who might not know him?
4. Think of the magi and their desire to worship the newborn king. They travelled a long way following a star. Would you have the courage to go seek Jesus in such circumstances? How can you seek Jesus right now?

Obstacles of living out the Gospel:

1. Fear of the unknown; lack of understanding, not fully realizing that we are called to use our gifts/talents to honor God; unsure how to make the first step

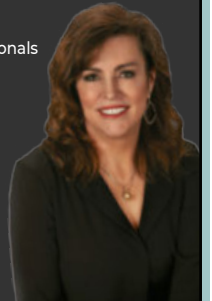

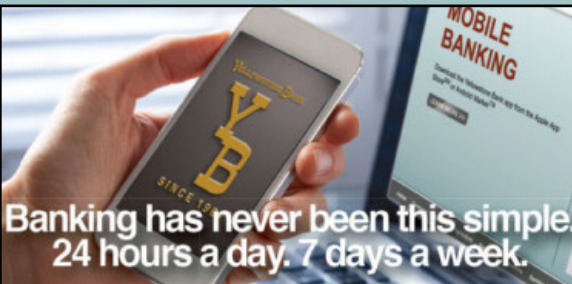
