PASTOR'S NOTES

Be Doers of the Word

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It has been said that Mark Twain saw overly pious Christians as being a bit phony. One of the famous stories that validates his concerns happened at a dinner party where a man cornered Twain and said, "Before I die, I am going to make a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. When I arrive, I will climb Mount Sinai, and from the very top I will boldly proclaim the Ten Commandments." Twain replied, "I have a better idea. Why don't you stay right here at home and obey them." While the story reveals Twain's sarcastic side, it also points to today's readings which invite us to look at the difference between talking and doing. The letter to James reminds us that we are to "be doers of the word, not only hearers." And Jesus turns to the prophet Isaiah in today's gospel to make the point that "these people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me."



I can make the case that it is good that we honor God with our spoken words. We do it all the time in very effective ways. A few examples: We confess sorrow for our sins as we say and pray the Confiteor at the beginning of Holy Mass. After the readings we say: "Thanks be to God." Immediately before the Eucharistic Prayers are spoken by the priest, we sing or say, "Holy, holy, holy." After the priest says or sings the words: "Through Him, with Him, and In Him..." everyone is called to say or sing what is called Amen and again just before we receive the Body and Blood of Our Lord. These spoken words that come from our mouths point us to a deeper reality that is meant to change our hearts. Our spoken or sung words inform our hearts and move us to take actions that eventually will build God's kingdom here and prepare us for the hereafter.

A simple way to examine our action meter is to look no further than your family. It is one thing to say that you love your spouse but love in action requires effort beyond words. If you are blessed to have children, you know that you must make the time to show them how to live life. You know they are watching your actions. Children are very perceptive, and they are negatively impacted when they witness your loving words are not backed up by loving actions. Many solid Catholics understand that we are blessed to live in this country, yet we encounter those folks who are very quick to criticize politicians. I am okay with constructive criticisms, but I believe we all could speak less and work harder to assure that the candidates that are elected are men and women of character and integrity. Similarly, there are always those well intended but misguided folks who say that they love the Catholic Church. But I find that many of these same people who are complaining about the Church, are unwilling to promote and support vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life and get involved in making the Church stronger and more holy.

Most rational people understand that words do have real power and real consequences. Words have the power to build up and make stronger and words have the power to tear down and destroy. So yes, words do matter, but the spoken word is not usually enough. Real change for the better often happens when words are accompanied by our actions. Easier said than done. Don't lose heart. Our actions include courage and willpower but as people of faith, we understand that God works with us and through us as we act to make a difference in our world. The letter to James says, "Humbly welcome the word that has been planted within you and is able to save your souls." God's word has been planted within us. As you and I nourish that word of God with the Sacraments, especially Confession and Holy Communion, then God's word will grow within us. As God's word grows within each one of us, we grow in wisdom. We also become more courageous and more committed to doing God's will.

Open your heart to receive the word that God has planted within you. By God's grace, you are strengthened to worship God not only with your lips but with your heart and with your deeds. May you be a disciple, not only in words but in actions—actions that bring about the good, the true and the beautiful in our lives and in our world.

PART 19 - SACRED HEART JESUS AND IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY

The references to the Sacred and Immaculate Hearts of Jesus and Mary can be found in Sacred Scripture which point to the love and compassion of Jesus and Mary. The image of the heart can be found throughout Sacred Scripture and can offer us powerful insights into the mercy, compassion, and love of God.

“Learn from Me for I am meek and humble of heart.”
Matthew 11:25

Our Lord and Our Lady invite each of us to imitate the desires and virtues of their Hearts. This quote from Matthew, points to the Word made Flesh who became like us in all things but sin. In His humble beginnings, Our Lord and Our Lady find themselves in a cave meant for animals. Their humility continues in their very hidden life for nearly 30 years. We then see Our Lord's compassion and love through His preaching, teaching, working miracles, healing the bodies and souls of believers and unbelievers. Lastly, Our Lord's Sacred Heart reveals the perfect obedience to the Father as He gave His life for our salvation.

“Mary kept in mind all these things, pondering them in Her Heart.” Luke 2:19

The shepherds went in haste to find Mary and Joseph, and the Infant lying in the manger. Once the shepherds find the Holy Family, they made known the message that had been told them about this Child. All who heard it were amazed by what had been told them by the shepherds. Having heard their message, Our Lady reflects on the Child Jesus in His crib at Bethlehem and ponders in Her Heart what the birth of the Messiah would mean for all humanity.

“His Mother kept all these things carefully in Her Heart.” Luke 2:51b

As Mother Mary often goes to the room of Her Immaculate heart and closes the door, She experiences the loss of Jesus for three days during a visit to Jerusalem. One can sense the ache of the Heart of Mother Mary, as She and Joseph desperately search for the Child, only find Him teaching (and astonishing) the Scribes and Pharisees in the Temple.

“Your own soul a sword shall pierce, that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed.” Luke 2:35

The old man Simeon speaks these powerful words to Mary and Joseph as they present Jesus in the Temple in Jerusalem. The offering of Our Lord to God was part of the custom of the Mosaic Law. In this moment, we hear Simeon's difficult prophesy as he speaks of the pierced heart, the suffering heart of Mary as She would

experience Our Suffering Savior upon the Cross.

“One of the soldiers opened His side with a lance, and immediately there came out blood and water.”
John 19:34

This Most Sacred Heart is now pierced by a soldier's lance as He hung in death upon the Cross. As Catholics, we understand that the Most Sacred Blood and water symbolize the origin and the Sacraments of the Church particularly the Eucharist and Baptism. In this moment where Christ's Heart was pierced in death so too, Mary's Heart was pierced in spirit, thus fulfilling Luke 2:35. Together in this moment of extreme suffering, we can see the union of a Mother and Her Son, the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

“This union began when by the power of the Holy Spirit Mary conceived the Heart of Jesus beneath Her own Heart... the Heart of Jesus, which suffered to the point of being pierced so as to pour forth upon all who believe in Him, the grace of the Holy Spirit, which makes them partakers of the Holy Eucharist in the communion of fellowship in the Catholic Church; and the Heart of Mary, always focused on Her Divine Son, which was predestined by God to suffer with Him for the salvation of mankind” (Devotion to the Hearts of Jesus and Mary Its Origin and History by George Pollard)

Only the Heart of Christ who knows the depths of his Father's love could reveal to us the abyss of his mercy in so simple and beautiful a way - From the Catechism, 1439

From the depth of my nothingness, I prostrate myself before Thee, O Most Sacred, Divine and

Adorable Heart of Jesus, to pay Thee all the homage of love, praise and adoration in my power. Amen. - St. Margaret Mary Alacoque

The prayer of the Church venerates and honors the Heart of Jesus just as it invokes his most holy name. It adores the incarnate Word and his Heart which, out of love for men, he allowed to be pierced by our sins. Christian prayer loves to follow the way of the cross in the Savior's steps. - From the Catechism, 2669

GOSPEL REFLECTION



Which is more important to God - clean hands or a clean mind and heart? The Scribes and Pharisees were upset with Jesus because he allowed his disciples to break with their ritual traditions by eating with unclean hands. They sent a delegation all the way from Jerusalem to Galilee to bring their accusation in a face-to-face confrontation with Jesus. Jesus dealt with their accusation by going to the heart of the matter - by looking at God's intention and purpose for the commandments.

Allow God's word to shape your heart and intentions

Jesus explains that they void God's command because they allow their hearts and minds to be clouded by their own notions of what is true religion. Jesus accuses them specifically of two things. First of hypocrisy. Like actors, who put on a show, they appear to obey God's word in their external practices while they inwardly harbor evil desires and intentions.

Allow God's word to change your way of thinking

Secondly, he accuses them of abandoning God's word by substituting their own arguments and ingenious interpretations for what God requires. They devised clever arguments based on their own thoughts rather than on God's word. Jesus refers them to the prophecy of Isaiah (29:31) where the prophet accuses the people of his day for honoring God with their lips while their hearts were far away from choosing and doing what God asked of them.

Uproot wrong thoughts and attitudes before they grow

Where does evil spring from and what's the solution for eliminating it from our lives? Jesus deals with this issue in response to the religious leaders' concern with ritual defilement - making oneself unfit to offer acceptable sacrifice and worship to God. The religious leaders were concerned with avoiding ritual defilement, some no doubt out of fear of God, and others out of fear of pleasing other people.

Jesus points his listeners to the source of true defilement - evil desires which come from inside a person's innermost being. Sin does not happen. It first springs from the innermost recesses of our thoughts and intentions, from the secret desires which only the individual soul can conceive.

Only Jesus can free us from sin and guilt

God in his mercy sent his Son Jesus Christ to free us from our sinful cravings and burden of guilt, and to restore us to wholeness of life and goodness. But to receive his mercy and healing, we must admit our faults and ask for his forgiveness. "If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just, and will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:8-9).

Let Jesus be the master of your heart and desires

When Cain was jealous of his brother, Abel, God warned him to guard his heart: "Sin is couching at the door; its desire is for you, but you must master it" (Genesis 4:7). Do you allow any sinful desires to enter the door of your heart and mind? We do not need to entertain or give in to sinful desires or thoughts, but instead, through the grace of God, we can choose to put them to death rather than allow them to be the master who controls our way of thinking, feeling, and acting.

The Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness

Only God can change our hearts and make them clean and whole through the power of the Holy Spirit. Like a physician who probes the wound before treating it, God through his Word and Spirit first brings to light our sinful condition that we may recognize sin for what it is and call upon God's mercy and pardon. The Lord is ever ready to change and purify our hearts through his Holy Spirit who dwells within us. His power and grace enables us to choose what is good and to reject what is evil. Do you believe in the power of God's love to change and transform your heart?

Lord Jesus, fill me with your Holy Spirit and make my heart like yours - on fire with love and holiness. Strengthen my will that I may always choose to love what is good and to reject what is evil. www.dailyscripture.net


