




The Holy Family



As part of the beautification project of our Church, a large acrylic painting has been commissioned for the south wall. It will be a depiction of the Holy Family outside of their home in Nazareth.

To say that Nazareth was a humble, back-water place is an overstatement. It was a small hamlet of about 150 families and was founded by descendants of the royal family of King David. It is located in northern Galilee approximately 20 miles west of the Sea of Galilee. We can appreciate a bit of Nazareth's poor reputation by Nathanael's comment when Philip tells him of Jesus' hometown. Nathanael replies, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" (John 1:46). However, Nazareth was just a little over 3 miles from the large, bustling Greco-Roman city of Sepphoris, one of the capital cities of the Galilee district.







The Gospels tell us that St. Joseph was a descendant of King David and a member of the tribe of Judah, and these were prerequisites for the Messiah who was to come. He was also called a "righteous man". This is a term of great respect given by his peers to a man recognized as one who always seeks the will of God and does it wholeheartedly. As a well-established tekton, he would have been considered a good find in the town of Nazareth, and he was eventually betrothed to Mary. They probably knew each other from childhood.

Mary was not only a member of David's royal family, she was also a member of the priestly family of Aaron. She, therefore, would also have been considered a wonderful blessing for Joseph, and to the people of Nazareth, their marriage would have been seen as a very good match. We all know the story of what happened during the time of their betrothal, how Mary was found to be with child by the Holy Spirit.

We also learn that Joseph is told by an angel in a dream that he is to take Mary as his wife because the child is from God. Joseph is also being called to a special mission, just as Mary is. Joseph is to name the child Jesus. A man "naming" a child means that he claims the child as his own flesh and blood and takes full responsibility for him. That is why we should refer to Joseph as the adoptive father of Jesus.

We can never overstate the importance of the influence of St. Joseph in the life of Jesus. St. Joseph gives Jesus his legitimate standing in Israel, and Jesus' lineage of the House of David and the tribe of Judah come from his ancestry as his legal father. St. Joseph would have taught Jesus his trade from a very early age. More importantly, St. Joseph's influence on the intellectual and spiritual formation of his son cannot be over emphasized.

Jesus had to learn to be a man, a son of Israel – and this He learned from St. Joseph who was His spiritual mentor as well. It was the duty of a father to teach the daily prayers to his son and to pray them with him. It was also St. Joseph's obligation to take Jesus to the synagogue every Sabbath and to prepare Him for His bar mitzvah – His coming of age – and to stand near Him as He read from the scroll of the Scriptures.

St. Joseph's teaching about the Law and Judaism was so effective that Jesus is referred to as the "teacher" or "Rabbi" everywhere He goes. St. Joseph was the man that Jesus grew up calling "Abba", which means daddy. We can see the great love that Jesus had for St. Joseph when He taught us to call our Father in Heaven Abba also.

Be sure to pause in front of our beautiful painting of the Holy Family in their home in Nazareth. And be sure to bring your problems and concerns to St. Joseph in prayer. He was the man closest to Jesus, and other than Our Blessed Mother Mary, no one knows the Heart of Jesus better than His earthly Abba, St. Joseph.

A Prayer For the New Year

Remember us, O God; from age to age be our comforter. You have given us the wonder of time, blessings in days and nights, seasons and years. Bless your children at the turning of the year and fill the months ahead with the bright hope that is ours in the coming of Christ. You are our God, living and reigning,

GOSPEL REFLECTION

How can families grow together in mutual love, harmony, and care for one another? When God made a covenant with his people, he taught them his way of love:

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul. and with all your strength - And these words which I command you this day shall be upon your heart - and you shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when

you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise" (Deuteronomy 6:5-7).

God the Father's love is a covenant love that binds people together as his beloved children. His love is the cornerstone that binds man and woman in one flesh in marriage, and in their mutual love for their children, and for their children's children for generations to come. God wants his love to be the center of all our relationships and all that we do. That is why God gives us his Holy Spirit so we can love as he loves us. "God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us" (Romans 5:5). We love because he first loved us (1 John 4:19).


Jesus was born into a family devoted to the word of God When God sent his only begotten Son into the world, Jesus was born into a human family as a Jew who was raised according to the teaching and wisdom of God's word in the Hebrew Scriptures (the Old Testament Scriptures) and the religious customs of his people. Jesus was born under the law of Moses (Galatians 4:4) and was circumcised (the sign of being a covenanted member of Israel) on the eighth day and given his name, Yeshua in Hebrew (Jesus in English) which means "God saves."

We know little about Jesus' early life at home in Nazareth. Luke in his Gospel account gives us a glimpse of Jesus' growth as a boy into young manhood. Luke tells us that Jesus was obedient to his parents - Mary, his mother and Joseph, his foster father. As devout and God-fearing Jews, Joseph and Mary raised the boy Jesus according to the Scriptures and Jewish customs. It was the duty of all Jewish parents to raise their children in the instruction and wisdom of God's word in the Scriptures.

"Hear, my son, your father's instruction, and reject not your mother's teaching" (Proverbs 1:8). "Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it" (Proverbs 22:6).

A home life centered on prayer and the reading of Scripture Jewish home life was centered on daily family prayers, including the singing of the Psalms and the reading of the Scriptures. Every Friday evening, the family gathered for a festive meal with the lighting of the Sabbath candle and prayers of blessing over the bread and wine to open the celebration of the Sabbath holy day. Each Saturday morning the family attended the Sabbath service which includes a reading from the Torah (five books of Moses) and chanting the psalms at the local community synagogue. Older boys were sent to school on weekday mornings, called the "house of the book" (either at the synagogue or the rabbi's house), where

they were given further instruction in the reading and study of the Jewish Scriptures. Every Jewish boy was required to memorize the first five books of the Jewish Scriptures (the Torah or Books of Moses) by the age of 13. They also learned to memorize and put into practice the wise counsels found in the Book of Proverbs (Wisdom of Solomon) and the Book of Sirach (Ecclesiasticus) which was another common book of instruction for Jews living throughout the Greek-speaking world.

Jesus' journey to his Father's house

Jews were expected to travel to Jerusalem for the high feasts each year (Passover, Pentecost, Tabernacles). Jesus undoubtedly traveled with his parents every year from Nazareth to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover. This eighty mile journey normally took three days. So families often traveled in large groups, for safety and comfort.

Luke records a remarkable incident which happened when Jesus went up to the temple at Jerusalem for his first Passover at the dawn of his manhood (usually the age of twelve for Jewish males). It was at this key turning point in his earthly life that Jesus took the name "father" from Joseph and addressed it to God his Father in heaven. His answer to his mother's anxious inquiry reveals his confident determination to pursue his heavenly Father's will. Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house? (Luke 2:49)

Jesus obeyed and served his family at Nazareth


While Jesus identified himself as Son of the eternal Father in heaven, he, nonetheless, submitted himself with love and obedience to Mary and Joseph. Like all godly parents, Mary and Joseph raised their son in the fear (Godly respect) and wisdom of God. Luke tells us that Jesus grew as a man in wisdom, stature, and favor with God and with the people of Nazareth, his home town. He remained at Nazareth until the age of 30 when he was baptized by John at the River Jordan and anointed by the Spirit for his mission as the Messiah and Savior of the world. (Thirty was the traditional age when a Jewish man could become a rabbi who taught and formed disciples in the knowledge and wisdom of God's word.) Do you seek to love and serve your family and to pursue peace and harmony in your home, neighborhood, and community?

The Lord Jesus came to show us the way to our Father's house and family in heaven. Listen to his word and obey him and you will find great peace, joy, and favor in serving him now and forever.

Lord Jesus, you came to restore us to peace and friendship with the Father in heaven. Where there is division, bring healing and restoration. Where there is strife bring peace and forgiveness. May all families and nations on the earth find peace, harmony, and unity in you, the Prince of Peace and Savior of the world.

WELCOME FR. LANKEIT



Welcome to St. Bernadette Fr. John Lankeit

A warm welcome to Fr. John Lankeit, who recently joined our parish as Associate Pastor.

Fr. Lankeit was born in Billings, Montana in 1967, but spent most of his life in Washington State. He began discerning the priesthood shortly before graduating from college in 1989 while living in Seattle.

Prior to the priesthood, Fr. Lankeit earned a bachelor's degree in marketing with a minor in psychology from Seattle University. He went on to work for the Seattle Mariners Major League Baseball team in corporate marketing. Later in his 12-year career in corporate America, he worked in the coffee and high-tech industries, did corporate training, and late in his career was beginning to do

voice acting on the side.

From the time he was very young, his faith in God was strong, though his catechetical formation was grossly inadequate, as was the case with most Catholics in his generation. Despite earning a comfortable salary and enjoying professional success, he found himself hungry for deeper meaning in his life.

In Lent of 2000, his job brought him from Seattle to Phoenix. A year and a half later, in Fall of 2001, he entered St. Meinrad Seminary to begin formation for the priesthood. He was ordained to the priesthood on June 3, 2006, at Ss. Simon & Jude Cathedral on the Feast of St. Charles Lwanga and Companions, Martyrs of Uganda.

After serving as an associate pastor for just under a year-and-a-half at St. Anne Parish in Gilbert, he was assigned as parochial administrator of Blessed Sacrament in Tolleson in late 2007 and named pastor there in 2009. On June 1, 2010, Fr. Lankeit was named Rector of SS Simon and Jude Cathedral, where he served until Easter Sunday of 2021.
