PASTOR'S NOTES

Building a Culture of Life

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Peace and Joy in Our Lord Jesus!

As more rounds of hateful political rhetoric are lobbed back and forth every day, I'm wondering if it all stems from the "culture of death." Facebook posts, gotcha moments, tweets and sound-off sections on internet websites, some media pundits all seem to stir greater polarization in the human family, not to mention crafty politicians who are quick to demonize the opposing views. It seems a daily occurrence to witness the worst side of our humanity rejoicing over other's failures and even their mistakes.



In his encyclical *Evangelium Vitae*, St. John Paul II described the "culture of death" as our acceptance of offenses like abortion, euthanasia, human cloning, capital punishment, poverty and more. All of these can be the consequences of our self-absorption and apathy which leads to the degradation and humiliation of human beings that are made in the image and likeness of God.

I admit to having a melancholic temperament at times. I can focus too often on what is broken in my life and in the lives of others. But the doom and gloom atmosphere that is prevalent in much of our culture is causing a great deal of unnecessary suffering, especially for our young people. This negative attitude is often seen in the way people are quick to criticize anyone who disagrees with their point of view. And when there is blood in the water, the darkness and pack mentality seems to kick in. Someone must pay. The anonymous world of the internet and social media rarely considers notions like the truth, human decency or love.

I ask myself if my Christian witness to human dignity in the current environment is different than others. Am I more measured and hopeful or am I like the rest? I found some refreshing guidance in the Church's treatment of the 8th Commandment in the Catechism. Perhaps these short quotes can guide us to rethink our posts, conversations and judgments. (CCC 2464-2499)

All Christians by the example and witness of their word...have an obligation to manifest the new man which they have put on in Baptism and to reveal the power of the Holy Spirit... Respect for the reputation of persons forbids every attitude and words likely to cause them unjust injury. He becomes guilty of rash judgment who, even tacitly, assumes as true, without sufficient foundation, the moral fault of a neighbor; of detraction who, without objectively valid reason, discloses another's faults and failings to persons who did not know them; of calumny who, by remarks contrary to the truth, harms the reputation of others and gives occasion for false judgments...

To avoid rash judgment, everyone should be careful to interpret insofar as possible his neighbor's thoughts, words, and deeds in a favorable way. Every good Christian ought to be more ready to give a favorable interpretation to another's statement than to condemn it. But if he cannot do so, let him ask how the other understands it. And if the latter understands it badly, let the former correct him with love. If that does not suffice, let the Christian try all suitable ways to bring the other to a correct interpretation so that he may be saved.

The right to the communication of the truth is not unconditional. Everyone must conform his life to the Gospel precept of fraternal love. This requires us in concrete situations to judge whether or not it is appropriate to reveal the truth to someone who asks for it. Though our intent may even be righteous, the public pursuit of our own viewpoint at any cost is often divisive. We need to think before posting or emailing or texting or calling someone with whom we disagree. I am not arguing that we cannot disagree or even call others out for being wrong. As disciples of Our Lord, it is how we express our displeasure with whom we disagree. Where is the charity? Is fraternal correction offered in love? Are we building up or tearing down? Is our sharing meant to bring human beings to the truth that God intends? Would I say the things I am typing in an email or text message to a person with whom I disagree if that person was sitting right in front of me face to face? Let us pray before we speak, asking Our Lord to give us the grace to be contributors to the culture of life.

Noted Author and Radio Personality, Patrick Madrid, to Speak at St. Bernadette Parish on February 5, 2022



Best-selling author and radio host Patrick Madrid will visit St. Bernadette Catholic Church on February 5th to present a faith-related seminar.

Madrid's talk is billed as "an informative presentation aimed at showing how to live as a Catholic in 2022."

Some of Madrid's remarks will touch upon the topic of "apologetics"—a term referring to the process of explaining an issue and answering questions and objections in a charitable and respectful way.

After an intermission for refreshments and a book signing by Mr. Madrid, who will have several of his books available, a lively question-and-answer session with extended audience participation will follow.

Apologetics has been present in the Catholic Church since the days of the New Testament. Some prominent Catholic apologists include St. Paul, Augustine of Hippo, Thomas Aquinas, Francis de Sales, and John Henry Newman. Catholic apologetics has experienced a strong resurgence, especially among lay Catholics in the United States, in recent decades.

Patrick Madrid has authored or edited 26 books on Catholic themes including, *Why Be Catholic?* (Doubleday), *Life Lessons: 50 Things I Learned in My First 50 Years* (Ignatius Press), *Pope Fiction*, *The Godless Delusion*, and the multi-volume *Surprised by Truth* series.

Mr. Madrid earned a bachelor's degree in business management, as well as a B. Phil. in philosophy and an M.A. in theology at the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus, Ohio. He and his wife Nancy have been married for 41 years and have eleven children and 28 grandchildren.

In addition to his work as an author, Madrid also hosts the popular 3-hour daily "Patrick Madrid" show on Relevant Radio (relevantradio.com/patrick), which is broadcast nationally, Monday through Friday, 8-11 am Central Time. At the invitation of numerous bishops and priests, he has conducted hundreds of conferences in English and Spanish at parishes, seminaries, and universities across the U.S., as well as throughout Europe, Asia, and Latin America. He is an annual presenter at Franciscan University of Steubenville's "Defending the Faith" summer conferences, where he has served as an adjunct professor of theology. He currently teaches as an adjunct professor of apologetics at Holy Apostles College and Seminary in Cromwell, Connecticut, and at Saint Patrick's Seminary and University in Menlo Park, California.

The late Cardinal Edward Egan, the former Archbishop of New York, commented on Mr. Madrid's unique and effective approach to Catholic apologetics saying, "How do you bring a friend or relative back into the Church? First you pray. Then, you follow Patrick Madrid's advice in [his book] *Search and Rescue*."

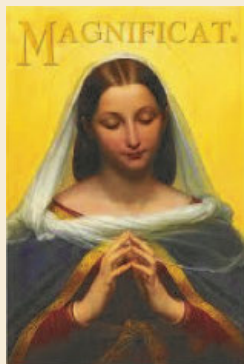

What does the Gospel of Luke tell us about Jesus and his mission and what he came to do for us? Many skeptics question the reliability and accuracy of the Gospel accounts of Jesus. Luke tells us that his account is utterly believable because it comes from firsthand witnesses (Luke 1:2) who knew Jesus personally, heard him teach, saw his miracles, and witnessed his atoning death on the cross and his rising from the tomb to everlasting life.

Luke begins his account by addressing his friend, Theophilus, a name which means "beloved of God" (Luke 1:3). In so many words Luke tells his friend (and us as well), I am writing to you the most incredible story humankind has known - and which many witnesses and messengers of God's word have openly explained on many occasions. Luke wants his friend and all who read his account to "know the truth" (Luke 1:4) concerning Jesus of Nazareth who was sent from the Father in

heaven and anointed by the Holy Spirit to bring us the good news and power of God's kingdom.

The "good news" of Jesus brings new life and freedom

The word "gospel" literally means "good news." The Gospel is the Good News of Jesus Christ and the new life and freedom he has won for us through his atoning death on the cross for our sins and his resurrection to everlasting life and glory with the Father in heaven. The Gospel is the all-powerful and all-merciful word of God for us today as much as it was for the people who first heard it in Jesus' time. It's a life-giving word that has supernatural power to change, transform, and bring freedom and healing to those who accept it as the living word of God. Are you hungry for God's word of truth and mercy, love and forgiveness? And do you want to grow in the knowledge of God and what he has accomplished for us through his Son, Jesus Christ?

Jesus came in the power of the Spirit

Luke tells us that Jesus was about 30 years of age when he began his public ministry (Luke 3:23). Right after Jesus was baptized by John and anointed by the Spirit at the River Jordan (Luke 3:21-22), he spent 40 days in the wilderness to devote himself to prayer and fasting (Luke 4:1-13). At the end of this period of spiritual preparation and testing, Luke tells us that Jesus "returned in the power of the Spirit to his own land of Galilee" (Luke 4:14). Jesus chose to begin his public ministry in Galilee first, rather than in Jerusalem, the holy city and temple of God. This was in fulfillment of the prophecy of Isaiah 9:1,2.

Luke tells us that Jesus chose to publicly announce his mission in the synagogue at Nazareth. The people there were familiar with Jesus since it was his custom to regularly attend the weekly Sabbath service. Jesus was also known by many in Nazareth as a "carpenter" (Mark 6:3) and "son of Joseph" (Luke 4:21). When the president of the synagogue called on Jesus to read from the book of the prophet Isaiah, Jesus chose to read Isaiah's description (verses 1-2 of chapter 61) of what the Messiah would do when he came to restore God's kingdom for the people of Israel.

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord" (Isaiah 61:1-2).

Isaiah had prophesied that the Messiah would be sent by God and anointed in the power of the Holy Spirit to preach "good news" and bring healing, blessing, and freedom to all who were oppressed (see Isaiah 61:1-2). Jesus awakened their hope in God's promises when he announced that this word was now being fulfilled in his very own person. Luke tells us that the people of Nazareth spoke well of him and received his "gracious word" with amazement and wonder. But they also openly questioned how the "son of Joseph" would fulfill this Messianic mission (Luke 4:21). Jesus challenged them to believe the word God had spoken through the prophets and the word he now speaks in God's name through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus renews and strengthens us in faith, hope, and love

The Lord Jesus speaks this same word to each of us today - he comes to bring us healing and restoration, pardon and freedom from the oppression of sin, despair, hopelessness, and destruction. Do you believe his word with expectant faith and trust, or with doubt and indifference? The Lord will not refuse to pour out his Spirit on all who trust in him. Ask the Lord Jesus to renew in you the joy of the Gospel and the freedom to live each day with trusting faith, joyful hope, and fervent love.

Lord Jesus, you are the fulfillment of all our hopes and dreams. Through the gift of your Holy Spirit you bring us truth, freedom, and abundant life. Fill me with the joy of the Gospel and inflame my heart with a burning love for you and a deep thirst for your word.
