SACRAMENTAL LIFE

Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the third Sunday of the month following the Sunday 11:00 a.m. Mass. If you have a child that you would like to have baptized, or have been asked to be a godparent, please contact the parish office. Classes are held by appointment.

Reconciliation: Confessions are heard every Wednesday from 4:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m., Saturday from 3:00 p.m. – 3:45 p.m., and anytime by appointment.

Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is offered on the first Saturday of each month, following the 4:00 p.m. Mass. Those who are seriously ill, elderly, facing or recovering from surgery, or women who are pregnant are welcome to celebrate this Sacrament of healing. If you or a loved one would like to celebrate this at any other time, please contact the parish office.

Marriage: Couples preparing for marriage should contact the parish office six months prior to the planned wedding date. No date can be scheduled until an initial meeting.

DEVOTIONS

Adoration and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament is held following the 9:00 a.m. Mass on Wednesdays until 10:30 a.m.

Rosary: The Rosary is prayed every Wednesday following the 9:00 a.m. Mass, during Adoration.

PASTOR'S CORNER

The Epiphany of the Lord - January 2, 2022

"I really only love God as much as I love the person I love the least." - Dorothy Day

Matthew 6:33

Dear Parish Family,



For most everywhere else, the trees have been taken down, the decorations have been put away, and radio stations have stopped playing the carols that started to air around Thanksgiving time, if not right after Halloween. If you look out there, it seems that Christmas has been over for some time now. You can even find Valentine's Day candy on the store shelves, and the Easter items won't be too far behind! But we still are very much in the Christmas Season! With today's feast of the Epiphany, we continue to celebrate the great mystery of the Incarnation – the fact that the Word of God, the Christ, became human – one of us. Today the

Christmas season reaches its apex whereby we commemorate the manifestation of God to all the nations. God's great gift of salvation, through Christ, is for everyone.

A little bit of history: The earliest known celebration of Christ's birth dates from the third century in Egypt, with it being celebrated on January 6. This date also became associated with Jesus' baptism in the Jordan River since that event was considered to be his birth into this world as the Christ. Because of this, it also became important to celebrate the Baptism of Christians on this date as well. January 6 also became a day to remember Christ's glory being shown for the first time in his changing the water into wine at the wedding feast of Cana. So with all of this in mind, the manifestation of Christ shown to the world – through his birth, his baptism, and his first miracle – was celebrated from very early on.

The western Church in Rome, however, chose December 25 as the day to celebrate Christmas, at least since the fourth century. Frankly, we're not quite sure why this date was chosen. One theory is that Christians placed a celebration of Christ on the same day as the pagan winter solstice celebration of the "unconquered sun." By asserting the Christian symbolism of Christ as the light of the world, this feast successfully competed with, and eventually replaced the pagan celebration.

In any event, by the second half of the fourth century, East and West adopted each other's dates (December 25 and January 6), but parceled out differently the events commemorated. So, in the East, on December 25, the birth of Jesus and the visit of the Magi were remembered, and on January 6, Jesus' baptism and the wedding at Cana were recalled, with Christian Baptism also being celebrated then. In the West, the birth was remembered on December 25, and the Magi's visit celebrated on January 6. This is the tradition that has continued to our own times now, except for those countries where the Epiphany is not a holy day of obligation, as is here in the United States. For us, the feast has been transferred to the Sunday nearest to January 6.

Essentially, what we are celebrating today is the manifestation of Christ to the entire world – the universality of the Christian message as represented by the Magi: the *beyond or distant lands* and peoples for whom Christ has come. But the Magi also represent the former ways of thinking,

wondering, and philosophizing before the coming of Christ. These "Wise Men" are presented as those who surrender to the new display of the One God who is for all. Likewise, *God is now known* as the One who actually does the seeking and the finding. The Magi are the figures of the *world* that sought God, but *it is the Light of God coming into the world that is initiated by God* – the Light meant for the whole world.

What this story is about, then, is the revelation that human wisdom searches for more than it can understand. What is revealed is *not an idea or principle*, but a *Person – Jesus*. In prostrating themselves, as the gospel says, the Magi admit the overconfidence of their former human ways of thinking and *surrender* to the truth of the only One who can satisfy all human wondering. It is the same for us as well. We are invited to prostrate ourselves before him and lay down our *thoughts* and intellects – our *gold* – and surrender to the gift of Christ among us. So, as we continue the celebration of Christmas, let us reflect on how each of us can be an *Epiphany* for others, showing the light of Christ to all whom we meet.

May God's richest blessings always be manifest in your lives.
