SACRAMENTAL LIFE

Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the third Sunday of the month following the Sunday 11:00 a.m. Mass. If you have a child that you would like to have baptized, or have been asked to be a godparent, please contact the parish office. Classes are held by appointment.

Reconciliation: Confessions are heard every Wednesday from 4:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m., Saturday from 3:00 p.m. – 3:45 p.m., and anytime by appointment.

Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is offered on the first Saturday of each month, following the 4:00 p.m. Mass. Those who are seriously ill, elderly, facing or recovering from surgery, or women who are pregnant are welcome to celebrate this Sacrament of healing. If you or a loved one would like to celebrate this at any other time, please contact the parish office.

Marriage: Couples preparing for marriage should contact the parish office six months prior to the planned wedding date. No date can be scheduled until an initial meeting.

DEVOTIONS

Adoration and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament is held following the 9:00 a.m. Mass on Wednesdays until 10:30 a.m.

Rosary: The Rosary is prayed every Wednesday following the 9:00 a.m. Mass, during Adoration.

Chaplet of Divine Mercy is prayed every Friday following the 9:00 a.m. Mass.



PASTOR'S CORNER

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time - January 16, 2022

"I really only love God as much as I love the person I love the least." - Dorothy Day

Matthew 6:33

Dear Parish Family,

Welcome back to the Green!

As of this past Monday, the Church has returned to *Ordinary Time*. This liturgical term does not refer to a "ho-hum" state of being, but to the ordering, or counting of the Sundays and weeks to follow. Until the First Sunday of Lent on March 6, we will hear about events in Jesus' life as recorded by the evangelist, Luke.

As we journey through this time, let us reflect on God's merciful love in our lives and how we might respond to that love. As we grow in our relationships with others, go to our workplaces, and experience the ordinary events of our daily lives, let us make it a priority to take time for God each day. Let us take time for quiet and to listen to God speaking to us in our hearts. Particularly as we continue to go through the ups and downs of the pandemic, we can be assured of God's strength and support with us by taking the time to *listen*.

Beginning this Tuesday, January 18, and lasting until the following Tuesday, January 25, the Christian community throughout the world is observing the *International Week of Prayer for Christian Unity*. For over 100 years, Christians around the world have taken part in an octave (eight days) of prayer for visible Christian unity. By annually observing this week, Christians move toward the fulfillment of Jesus' prayer at the Last Supper "that all may be one." (cf. John 17:21)

The theme of this year's observance is the Epiphany: "We Saw the Star in the East, and We Came to Worship Him" (cf. Mt 2:2). It was selected by the Middle East Council of Churches and originates from the churches in Lebanon. Present times in Lebanon are extremely difficult and economically disastrous. All this combined with the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic have made the situation quite stressful for the people there. The power of prayer in solidarity with those who suffer is a demonstration of Christian unity and a sign of communion.

With all others who have been baptized into Christ, let us pray that unity, even with our diversity, may be achieved, and that the separation between us in the different denominations be eliminated.

This Saturday, January 22, is **Texas Catholic Pro-Life Day**. Two Masses will be celebrated that morning, one at San Jose Catholic Church, and the other at The University Catholic Center at UT. Both Masses will begin at 10:00 a.m. I encourage you to attend one of these and join in prayer with others in the diocese for this most important need of respecting all life. If you are unable to attend, then please set aside some time for prayer that day for this great need.


