SACRAMENTAL LIFE

Reconciliation: Confessions are heard every Wednesday from 4:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m., Saturday from 3:00 p.m. – 3:45 p.m., and anytime by appointment.

Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is offered on the first Saturday of each month, following the 4:00 p.m. Mass. Those who are seriously ill, elderly, facing or recovering from surgery, or women who are pregnant are welcome to celebrate this Sacrament of healing. If you or a loved one would like to celebrate this at any other time, please contact the parish office.

Marriage: Couples preparing for marriage should contact the parish office six months prior to the planned wedding date. No date can be scheduled until an initial meeting.

DEVOTIONS

Adoration and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament is held following the 9:00 a.m. Mass on Wednesdays until 10:30 a.m.

Rosary: The Rosary is prayed every Wednesday following the 9:00 a.m. Mass, during Adoration.

Chaplet of Divine Mercy is prayed every Friday following the 9:00 a.m. Mass.

PASTOR'S CORNER

3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time - January 23, 2022

"I really only love God as much as I love the person I love the least." - Dorothy Day

Matthew 6:33

Dear Parish Family,

When was the last time you wept when you heard the Scriptures proclaimed? When have you been *deeply moved* at what God said to you when you read your Bible?

Have you ever found comfort in a particular passage from the gospels or were strengthened by a certain psalm? Or does the business of your daily life keep you so preoccupied with other concerns that the words of scripture have little or no connection to who you are?

In this Sunday's first reading, we hear how the Israelites wept when they heard the Law proclaimed to them. For years they had been in exile, taken away from the Promised Land after the Babylonians destroyed their nation. Now, having been freed after the fall of Babylon to King Cyrus of Persia, they returned to Jerusalem and longed to hear God's word proclaimed to them. They listened all day long as Ezra the scribe interpreted the scriptures to them, explaining how God is a God of love and compassion and wants to be in covenant relationship with them. Realizing their need for God, they wept. But Ezra urged them not to be sad or to weep, but to *rejoice*. To eat rich foods and drink sweet drinks. To find strength in rejoicing in the Lord, *especially* as they realize their dependence on God.

In the gospel, Jesus identifies himself as the one anointed by the Spirit to bring "glad tidings to the poor; to proclaim liberty to captives; recovery of sight to the blind; to let the oppressed go free; and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord." As he says, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." What Ezra did in interpreting the Law for the Israelites, Jesus did in the synagogue for his listeners back then, and does for us today. He announces that, in him, the realization of God's kingdom of compassion, mercy and justice is fulfilled.

Whenever the difficulties and pains of life come our way, we must be firm in looking to Jesus. Jesus is the answer to all of the pains and suffering that this world brings, and in him, the love of God is found. We who experience suffering in so many ways, also know mercy from the one who also suffered to the point of death. Having been forgiven and set free, and in response to what has been done for us, we set out to proclaim by our own lives good news to the poor, freedom for captives, and lifting up the lowly.

Let us look around and see with the eyes that the Spirit has given us. Let us listen with ears anointed by that same Spirit. Let us see and hear the urgent needs of all who suffer and bring them the relief of Christ.

All others who feel called to serve are welcome as well.


Requirements are that you must be an active, Baptized Catholic in good standing with the Church. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion must also be Confirmed.
