CELEBRATION of MASS

- ◇ At this time we do not require Mass reservations.
- ◇ Parishioners are invited to sit throughout the church without marked spaces.
- ◇ Wearing of face coverings is at the discretion of each individual.
- ◇ An usher can direct you to a section in the church designated for those who wish to physically distance. If you choose to sit in this section we ask that you wear a face covering throughout Mass regardless of your vaccination status. We continue to encourage our parishioners to be charitable to each other by staying home if they are sick or symptomatic and to respect the views of all present.

The word "catechesis" means "to echo." Literally, we are to echo the good news of Jesus Christ to the world. This is not a suggestion; it is a command of our Lord. Some people are called and set apart in our communities as catechists, those formally trained and charged with passing on the Gospel to children and adults, inside and outside of our communities. On Catechetical Sunday, we acknowledge them and remind ourselves of the need for formation and growth in all of us. To be a catechist is a privileged calling, and today be sure to say "thank you" to one in your community.

However, it would be wrong on this day to only look to those bearing the NAME of catechist for an echoing of good news. ALL of us are called to echo and share the Gospel message. Parents are the first and primary catechists in a child's life. But we also are important catechists in the lives of our coworkers, our spouses, our relatives, and our friends. Some say catechesis begins in the home, and while that is true, it carries with it a parent/child connotation. But where does catechesis really begin? It begins in the HEART. This year on Catechetical Sunday, may your heart be moved to motivate you to share with others the good news of Jesus Christ.


Q Why do we celebrate Catechetical Sunday?

A The mission of the church reflects the mission of Jesus to teach, preach, heal, and forgive. Through these acts, Jesus shares the good news of salvation and invites all people to share in the life and love of God. The church continues this mission in all its ministries, but especially, and perhaps most importantly, through catechesis.

Catechetical Sunday is celebrated on the third Sunday of September. The task of handing on the Gospel is entrusted to the whole community, who by word and example, form young and new members in the way of the Gospel. Parish programs assist parents in teaching the basics of faith through liturgical experience, instruction, and faith formation. This ministry is essential for the parish to grow, for individuals to develop as believers, and for the ongoing spiritual formation of the whole community. It reminds the church that preaching the Gospel and growing in faith are essential to our sacramental practice and our liturgical prayer.


Religious Education

How Do You Pray?

Imagine meeting with a friend. A friend you can talk to about everything - your day, your joys, your sorrows - because they understand you without judging you. A friend who talks to you in return. Praying is like that. God is in the role of the friend. Everyone has their own way of praying. Some express themselves through dancing, painting, or singing. Often prayer uses words addressed to Jesus, God the Father, and the Holy Spirit. You can also talk to the blessed Virgin Mary or to the saints, but you do not pray to them like you pray to God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit. You ask them to take your prayers to God. This is called interceding for us in prayer. You can pray anywhere, anytime - outside on the playground, or in a church. But when you really want to chat with a friend you choose a quiet corner. In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus advises: "But when you pray, go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you."



How Do You Pray?

Why not prepare a prayer corner? You can use a candle, a picture, a cross or flowers. It's up to you to decide which position you prefer to use: standing up, kneeling or seated. To begin your prayer, make the Sign of the Cross. You can close your eyes if it helps you to listen to God more closely during this time.

Okay, but what do you say in prayer? You can speak freely or use standard prayers like the Our Father. Or you can read the Sunday Gospel for the week. It's the Word of God, for us today. You can also try to present your life to God using these words: thank you, sorry, please. "Thank you for this blessing," "Sorry I complained," "Please help me do my best on my homework," etc.

And how will you hear God's answer? It's a mystery! Each person will have their own experience. And have patience. You have your whole life to learn!

Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The new checker at our grocery store is WAY too cool for school. He works the night shift. The first (and last) time I went through his stand, he was chatting up the cute young lady ahead of me, and brazenly watching something on his phone while checking out customers.

Almost immediately he started adding up the groceries on the conveyor belt of the VERY NICE, twenty-something guy just behind me along with mine. We both stopped him at the same time.

“Oh,” he said, “I thought she was your grandma or something.” I glared at him. “You thought I was old enough to be HIS grandmother?” And the super nice guy jumped in and said, “I would LOVE for you to be my grandma.” But even that undeserved kindness didn’t stop me from stomping out. No matter. Super Cool Guy was back on his phone, my anger just a funny footnote to his boring night at work.

Now, here’s the really stupid part. OF COURSE I’m old enough to be his grandmother. EASILY. But I’m sensitive about this because, up until a severe illness several years ago, I looked a bit younger than my age. And how ungrateful am I to be angry about looking my age, when I’m so, so lucky to be alive?

Where do the conflicts and divisions among you originate? Right there, in our unexamined and knee-jerk responses to perfectly normal conversation. By the time I got to my car I recognized where my VERY UNCHARACTERISTIC anger had come from, and I was ready to make peace.

Honest reflection, and repentance, can end conveyor belt conflicts, and wars, before they start.

What experience of unchecked anger have you been surprised by in yourself?
