Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton 1774 – 1821


"I am satisfied to sow in tears if I may reap in joy"



Elizabeth Ann Bayley was one of two daughters of a prominent Episcopal family. She was born in New York on August 28, 1774. She devoted a good deal of time to working among the poor. She had married William M. Seton in 1794. Her marriage was blessed with two sons and three daughters. In 1797 she joined Isabella M. Graham and others in founding the first charitable institution in New York City, the Society for the Relief of Poor Widows, serving as the organization's treasurer for seven years. In 1803, her husband got ill, and they traveled to Italy with their eldest child to seek health care. Nevertheless, in part perhaps as an aftereffect of his bankruptcy three years earlier, William died there of tuberculosis in December of the same year.

As a result of her experiences and acquaintances in Italy, Elizabeth joined the Roman Catholic Church in New York City in 1805. Herself now a widow with young children, she found it difficult to earn a living, and many friends and relatives shunned her after her conversion (the various anti-Catholic laws of the colonial era had only recently been lifted). For a time, she operated a small school for boys. In 1808 Elizabeth accepted an invitation from the priest (later bishop) Louis William Dubourg, president of St. Mary's College in Baltimore, Maryland, to open a school for Catholic girls in that city. Several young women joined in her work, and in 1809 her long-held hope to found a religious community was realized when she and her companions took vows before Archbishop John Carroll and became the Sisters of Saint Joseph, the first American-based Catholic sisterhood. A few months later Mother Elizabeth and the sisters moved their home and school to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where they provided free education for the poor girls of the parish —an act later considered by many to be the beginning of Catholic parochial education in the United States.

In 1812 the order became the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph under a modification of the rule of the Sisters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul. Houses of the order were opened in Philadelphia in 1814, and in New York City in 1817. Mother Elizabeth continued to teach and work for the community until her death in 1821, by which time the order had 20 communities. In 1856 Seton Hall College (now Seton Hall University) in South Orange Village, New Jersey, was named for her, and in 1885 the Sisters of Charity founded Seton Hill Junior College (now Seton Hill University) in Greensburg, Pennsylvania, in her honor. Elizabeth saw Christ in the poor, especially in women and children in need, even before being received in the Catholic Church. She is a saint because of the way she searched for and responded to God's will in her life. She was canonized in September 1975. Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton is a remarkable example of charity. Her feast day is January 4th.



The meaning of the Epiphany

The Wise Men presented gifts to baby Jesus. The gift of gold was considered worthy of a king. Both secular and biblical kings greatly valued gold. While gold can be a gift for anyone, gold was a gift especially worthy for kings. The gift of gold symboliezes Jesus is king. Frankincense comes from tree resins. It was very expensive and has a wonderful fragrance. It is the basic ingredient for making incense. Frankincense was used in religious sacrifices, speaks of the worship of God. The gift of frankincense sybolizes that Jesus is divine. Myrrh is extruded from the gum of the Commiphora myrrh plant. Myrrh was less expensive than frankincense, but was still highly valued. Myrrh is first mentioned in Genesis, where it was being carried by camels in a caravan. Myrrh was used for a variety of purposes in biblical times as a perfume, an anesthetic, for burial embalming, as an ingredient in anointing oil. John's gospel records that myrrh was used in Jesus' burial. The gift of myrrh symbolizes that Jesus is human. An important aspect about the Wise Men is their humility. According to the story, they were wealthy, intelligent, and above all, believers. God inspired them. After a long journey they found the child Jesus, and they prostrated themselves, fell on their knees, and paid him homage, and adoration.

God has revealed himself in many ways and to many people, including to the prophets of the Old Testament. God inspired the Jewish people as well as people from other races, cultures, and nations. The Epiphany is the revealing of Christ, his incarnation, and birth and the beginning of the salvation of humanity.
