Why Jesus Was Baptized?

The Church teaches that baptism forgives all sins, including original sin, and it is a rite of initiation into the Church and the Christian life. As Jesus did not have the original sin (or any sin), and even his mother did not have the sin either (the **Immaculate** original Conception), he followed the Jewish traditions of purification or cleansing through the baptism of John the Baptist for two main reasons: to set an example for all of us, and to bless the new sacrament that he himself established. The baptism of John is referred to as baptism of repentance, which was preparing the way for Jesus the Lord. John pointed Jesus as the one expected by the people, and called him "The Lamb of God". Later, Jesus emphasized the importance of baptism by declaring: "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned" (Mark 16:16).



If you receive a call or email from Father Christopher asking for money, gift cards or favors, it is a SCAM. Do not fall for it. If father needs your help he will ask you personally.




Blessed Franciszek Rogaczewski 1892-1940

Franciszek Rogaczewski was born on 23 December 1892 in Lipinki, Kujawsko-Pomorskie, Poland. He studied for the priesthood and was ordained in Gdańsk in 1918. As pastor of Christ the King parish, he was a highly renowned and much sought-after confessor. Rogaczewski was arrested on 1 September 1939 by the National Socialist German Workers' Partys for the crime of being a priest. He was tortured for months before being shot to death on 11 January 1940 while imprisoned at Stutthof concentration camp (located near Sztutowo, Poland).

After his death, Rogaczewski was recognized as one of the 108 Martyrs of World War II. He was beatified by Pope John Paul II on 13 June 1999. His individual feast day is 11 January; there is also a group memorial for the 108 Polish Martyrs of World War II on 12 June.

Baptism means sharing in the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The baptized people consent and accept all the teachings of the Catholic Church, but above all, that Jesus Christ is Lord, the only one who has the power to save and redeem the human person.



Understanding the Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism is often called "The door of the Church", because it is the first of the seven sacraments, not only in time (since most Catholics receive it as infants), but in priority since the reception of the other sacraments depends on it. It is the first of the three Sacraments of Initiation, the other two being the Sacrament of Confirmation and the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Once baptized, a person becomes a member of the Church. Traditionally, the rite (or ceremony) of baptism was held outside the doors of the main part of the church, to signify this fact. Christ Himself ordered His disciples to preach the Gospel to all nations and to baptize those who accept the message of the Gospel. In His encounter with Nicodemus (John 3:1-21), Christ made it clear that baptism was necessary for salvation: "Amen, amen I say to you, unless a man is born again of water and the Holy Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God". For Catholics, the sacrament is not a mere formality; it is the very mark of a Christian because it brings us into a new life in Christ.

In the New Testament, after the death of John the Baptist, we see baptism taking on added significance. It becomes the outward sign of the new covenant people of God. We see this particularly in Matthew 28:18– 20, where Jesus commands his followers to make disciples of all nations and peoples and to mark them out with water baptism. We also see it in Acts 2, when Peter instructs the followers of Christ to "repent and be baptized". The point is that beginning with the end of Christ's earthly ministry, all who turn to Jesus in faith are to be marked out with the sign of baptism. It is still an outward rite of washing or cleansing with water, just as it was in the Old Testament, but it is now specifically commanded by the Lord to be administered to every disciple as an outward sign of God's covenant with them. If in fact baptism does replace circumcision in the New Testament, then this means that baptism functions in the same way that circumcision did, namely, as a sign and seal of the righteousness that is ours by faith. It is an outward sign that points to an inward spiritual reality and marks us out as belonging to the Lord. It is a confirmation that everything Jesus accomplished on the cross is ours by faith in him. With this in mind, we can say that baptism is a rite of washing or cleansing in water that is commanded by the Lord Jesus himself to be a sign and seal of the inward washing of all our sins and thus of being counted righteous in God's sight through faith in Jesus Christ.



Your whole self ruled by the flesh was put off when you were circumcised by Christ, having been buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through your faith in the working of God, who raised him from the dead" (Colossians 2:11-12).




