



And, when darkness, boredom, and gloom seem to be the order of the day, a bright new light now shines pointing us to truth and reminding us that we are loved.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint."

THOUGHTS TO CONSIDER

From a treatise against the heresy of Noetus by Saint Hippolytus, priest and martyr

The manifestation of the hidden mystery

There is only one God, brethren, and we learn about him only from sacred Scripture. It is therefore our duty to become acquainted with what Scripture proclaims and to investigate its teachings thoroughly. We should believe them in the sense that the Father wills, thinking of the Son in the way the Father wills, and accepting the teaching he wills to give us with regard to the Holy Spirit. Sacred Scripture is God's gift to us and it should be understood in the way that he intends: we should not do violence to it by interpreting it according to our own preconceived ideas.

God was all alone and nothing existed but himself when he determined to create the world. He thought of it, willed it, spoke the word and so made it. It came into being instantaneously, exactly as he had willed. It is enough then for us to be aware of a single fact: nothing is coeternal with God. Apart from God there was simply nothing else. Yet although he was alone, he was manifold because he lacked neither reason, wisdom, power, nor counsel. All things were in him and he himself was all. At a moment of his own choosing and in a manner determined by himself, God manifested his Word, and through him he made the whole universe.

When the Word was hidden within God himself he was invisible to the created world, but God made him visible. First God gave utterance to his voice, engendering light from light, and then he sent his own mind into the world as its Lord. Visible before to God alone and not to the world, God made him visible so that the world could be saved by seeing him. This mind that entered our world was made known as the Son of God. All things came into being through him; but he alone is begotten by the Father.

The Son gave us the law and the prophets, and he filled the prophets with the Holy Spirit to compel them to speak out. Inspired by the Father's power, they were to proclaim the Father's purpose and his will.

So the Word was made manifest, as Saint John declares when, summing up all the sayings of the prophets, he announces that this is the Word through whom the whole universe was made. He says: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was God. Through him all things came into being; not one thing was created without him. And further on he adds: The world was made through him, and yet the world did not know him. He entered his own creation, and his own did not receive him.

PENSAMIENTOS PARA CONSIDERAR

Del Tratado de san Hipólito, presbítero, contra la herejía de Noeto

MANIFESTACIÓN DEL MISTERIO ESCONDIDO

Hay un único Dios, hermanos, que sólo puede ser conocido a través de las Escrituras santas: Por ello debemos esforzarnos por penetrar en todas las cosas que nos anuncian las divinas Escrituras y procurar profundizar en lo que nos enseñan. Debemos conocer al Padre como él desea ser conocido, debemos glorificar al Hijo como el Padre desea que lo glorifiquemos, debemos recibir al Espíritu Santo como el Padre desea dárnoslo. En todo debemos proceder no según nuestro arbitrio ni según nuestros propios sentimientos ni haciendo violencia a tos deseos de Dios, sino según los caminos que el mismo Señor nos ha dado a conocer en las santas Escrituras.

Cuando sólo existía Dios y nada había aún que coexistiera con él, el Señor quiso crear al mundo. Lo creó por su inteligencia, por su voluntad y por su palabra; y el mundo llegó a la existencia tal como él lo quiso y cuando él lo quiso. Nos basta, por tanto, saber que, al principio, nada coexistía con Dios, nada había fuera de él. Pero Dios siendo único, era también múltiple. Porque con él estaba su sabiduría, su razón, su poder y su consejo; todo esto estaba en él, y él era todas estas cosas. Y, cuando quiso y como quiso, y en el tiempo por él mismo predeterminado, manifestó al mundo su Palabra, por quien fueron hechas todas las cosas.

Y como Dios contenía en sí mismo a la Palabra, aunque ella fuera invisible para el mundo creado, cuando Dios hizo oír su voz, la Palabra se hizo entonces visible; así, de la luz que es el Padre salió la luz que es el Hijo, y la imagen del Señor fue como reproducida en el ser de la criatura; de esta manera el que al principio era sólo visible para el Padre empezó a ser visible también para el mundo, para que éste, al contemplarlo, pudiera alcanzar la salvación.

El sentido de todo esto es que, al entrar en el mundo, la Palabra quiso aparecer como hijo de Dios; pues, en efecto, todas las cosas fueron hechas por el Hijo, pero él es engendrado únicamente por el Padre. Dios dio la ley y los profetas, impulsando a éstos a hablar bajo la moción del Espíritu Santo, para que, habiendo recibido la inspiración del poder del Padre, anunciaran su consejo y su voluntad.

La Palabra, pues, se hizo visible, como dice san Juan. Y repitió en síntesis todo lo que dijeron los profetas, demostrando así que es realmente la Palabra por quien fueron hechas todas las cosas. Dice: En el principio ya existía la Palabra, y la Palabra estaba junto a Dios, y la Palabra era Dios. Por medio de la Palabra se hizo todo, y sin ella no se hizo nada de lo que se ha hecho. Y más adelante: El mundo se hizo por medio de ella, y el mundo no la conoció. Vino a su casa, y los suyos no la recibieron.
