

LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

People can easily lose a sense of the sacred and transcendent. When we lose a sense of God's special presence, we need to be brought back. Ezra brought people back to the word of God and they realized what they were missing. Jesus proclaims God's word in the synagogue with true conviction and tells those gathered that he is the fulfillment of all that Isaiah taught. Even though people get lost, distracted, discouraged, and often journey down the wrong path, God's timeless law remains. When we allow ourselves to truly hear God's word and act on it, that living word slowly, over time, changes us. It has the power to soften and mold us, creating within us a joyful spirit. We realize the truth in what God speaks and become open to God's love. Gradually and gently God leads us back where we belong. We discover again the sacred character of life and the wonder of God's power. It is no wonder that Luke addresses his remarks to Theophilus. It is a name that means "beloved of God," a name that can be used by anyone who desires friendship with God.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

One of the most famous members of the Dominican Order, St. Thomas Aquinas (1225 – 1274) is well-known by many for his theological work, "The Summa Theologiae." Born in Italy, his mother wanted him to become a Benedictine and had high hopes that he would eventually become abbot of Monte Cassino, where he spent much of his youth. To change his vocation, she had him kidnapped by his brothers on his way to Paris at the age of 19. He spent two years in their captivity. Despite this, nothing could shake him from his vocation to become a Dominican priest and he was eventually released. Once free, he went to Paris and then to Cologne, where he finished his studies with Albert the Great.

His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, encompasses his writings. The Summa Theologiae, his last and, unfortunately, uncompleted work, deals with the whole of Catholic theology.

The patron saint of teachers, theologians and students, St. Thomas Aquinas died in 1274. His life and the impact he had on the whole Church, however, remains alive today.

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THOUGHTS TO CONSIDER

From the Life of Saint Anthony by Saint Athanasius, bishop

Saint Anthony receives his vocation

When Anthony was about eighteen or twenty years old, his parents died, leaving him with an only sister. He cared for her as she was very young, and also looked after their home.

Not six months after his parents' death, as he was on his way to church for his usual visit, he began to think of how the apostles had left everything and followed the Savior, and also of those mentioned in the book of Acts who had sold their possessions and brought the apostles the money for distribution to the needy. He reflected too on the great hope stored up in heaven for such as these. This was all in his mind when, entering the church just as the Gospel was being read, he heard the Lord's words to the rich man: If you want to be perfect, go and sell all you have and give the money to the poor—you will have riches in heaven. Then come and follow me.

It seemed to Anthony that it was God who had brought the saints to his mind and that the words of the Gospel had been spoken directly to him. Immediately he left the church and gave away to the villagers all the property he had inherited, about 200 acres of very beautiful and fertile land, so that it would cause no distraction to his sister and himself. He sold all his other possessions as well, giving to the poor the considerable sum of money he collected. However, to care for his sister he retained a few things.

The next time he went to church he heard the Lord say in the Gospel: Do not be anxious about tomorrow. Without a moment's hesitation he went out and gave the poor all that he had left. He placed his sister in the care of some well-known and trustworthy virgins and arranged for her to be brought up in the convent. Then he gave himself up to the ascetic life, not far from his own home. He kept a careful watch over himself and practiced great austerity. He did manual work because he had heard the words: If anyone will not work, do not let him eat. He spent some of his earnings on bread and the rest he gave to the poor.

Having learned that we should always be praying, even when we are by ourselves, he prayed without ceasing. Indeed, he was so attentive when Scripture was read that nothing escaped him and because he retained all he heard, his memory served him in place of books.

Seeing the kind of life he lived, the villagers and all the good men he knew called him the friend of God, and they loved him as both son and brother.

PENSAMIENTOS PARA CONSIDERAR

De la Vida de san Antonio, escrita por san Atanasio, obispo

LA VOCACIÓN DE SAN ANTONIO

Cuando murieron sus padres, Antonio tenía unos dieciocho o veinte años, y quedó él solo con su única hermana, pequeña aún, teniendo que encargarse de la casa y del cuidado de su hermana.

Habían transcurrido apenas seis meses de la muerte de sus padres, cuando un día en que se dirigía, según costumbre, a la iglesia, iba pensando en su interior cómo los apóstoles lo habían dejado todo para seguir al Salvador, y cómo, según narran los Hechos de los apóstoles, muchos vendían sus posesiones y ponían el precio de la venta a los pies de los apóstoles para que lo repartieran entre los pobres; pensaba también en la magnitud de la esperanza que para éstos estaba reservada en el cielo; imbuido de estos pensamientos, entró en la iglesia, y dio la casualidad de que en aquel momento estaban leyendo aquellas palabras del Señor en el Evangelio: «Si quieres llegar hasta el final, vende lo que tienes, da el dinero a los pobres —así tendrás un tesoro en el cielo— y luego vente conmigo.»

Entonces Antonio, como si Dios le hubiese infundido el recuerdo de lo que habían hecho los santos y como si aquellas palabras hubiesen sido leídas especialmente para él, salió en seguida de la iglesia e hizo donación a los aldeanos de las posesiones heredadas de sus padres (tenía trescientas parcelas fértiles y muy hermosas), con el fin de evitar toda inquietud para sí y para su hermana. Vendió también todos sus bienes muebles y repartió entre los pobres la considerable cantidad resultante de esta venta, reservando sólo una pequeña parte para su hermana.

Habiendo vuelto a entrar en la iglesia, oyó aquellas palabras del Señor en el Evangelio: «No os agobiéis por el mañana.» Saliendo otra vez, dio a los necesitados incluso lo poco que se había reservado, ya que no soportaba que quedase en su poder ni la más mínima cantidad. Encomendó su hermana a unas vírgenes que él sabía eran de confianza y cuidó de que recibiese una conveniente educación; en cuanto a él, a partir de entonces, libre ya de cuidados ajenos, emprendió en frente de su misma casa una vida de ascetismo y de intensa mortificación.

Trabajaba con sus propias manos, ya que conocía aquella afirmación de la Escritura: El que no trabaja que no coma; lo que ganaba con su trabajo lo destinaba parte a su propio sustento, parte a los pobres. Oraba con mucha frecuencia, ya que había aprendido que es necesario retirarse para ser constantes en orar: en efecto, ponía tanta atención en la lectura, que retenía todo lo que había leído, hasta tal punto que llegó un momento en que su memoria suplía los libros.

Todos los habitantes del lugar, y todos los hombres honrados, cuya compañía frecuentaba, al ver su conducta, lo llamaban amigo de Dios; y todos lo amaban como a un hijo o como a un hermano.



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
