The Annual Church Walk Returns!



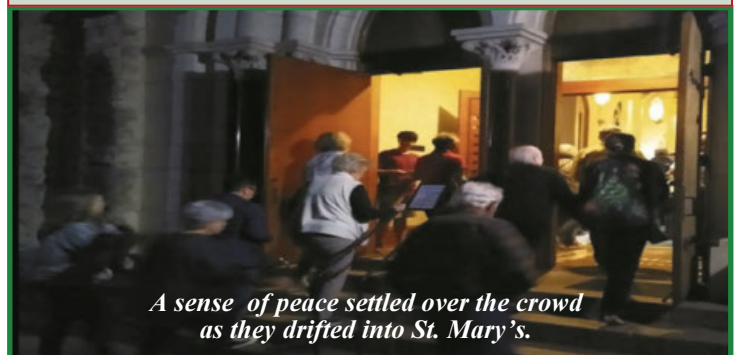

ADORATION of the BLESSED SACRAMENT

Did you know...

Question: What happens to a consecrated host if it accidentally falls to the ground?



Answer: This is a very practical question because, as we all know, accidents happen, even during the most careful celebration of the liturgy. The short answer to this question is that nothing happens to the consecrated host. The Real Presence of Jesus remains in the consecrated host or any consecrated wine that might accidentally be spilled.

Another question we might ask is: *How should the ministers respond if the Eucharist is dropped or spilled?* If this happens, the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of holy Communion should immediately pick up the dropped host and consume it. If it is a case of the Precious Blood being spilled, the minister would use the purificator (and additional purificators if needed) to clean the spill and then the area should be reverently washed as soon as the Mass is over and the water poured into the sacrarium (a special sink that is located in church sacristies for reverently disposing of holy water, the water used to clean sacred vessels, etc.).

Music & Liturgy Notes

Understanding the Psalm and readings:

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. Merriam-Webster defines the word epiphany as: “a moment in which you suddenly see or understand something in a new or very clear way”. We celebrate “Epiphany” (with a capital E) as the day that the wise men arrived to worship and bring gifts to Jesus. The second definition of epiphany also works here. These men, learned philosophers, possibly Persian astronomers, were looking to the stars for a sign. According to Living Liturgy 2022 “It was a widespread belief that heavenly portents marked the birth of great leaders, and so they came to Jerusalem to look for a baby whom they described as the “newborn king of the Jews” (LL 2022, pg.36). I always wondered why they were looking for a star and knew to follow it, so this bit of information was a bit of an eye opener for me.

What I love the most about all of the readings today are that they point to the fact that God is calling to all of us. One of the big controversies in the early church for some of the Jews was that God called to them specifically. Yes, it’s true that God made a covenant with the Jewish people and yes, the Messiah came from a Jewish family, but that does not mean that God doesn’t wish to make a covenant with us all. In the early church some of the Apostles were preaching that the Gentiles needed to undergo circumcision in order to follow the faith that Jesus began. In fact, the first ever meeting of the Pope with his Bishops occurred in the early church to discuss this very topic, and it was decided that converts did not need to undergo circumcision. Paul, in the second reading today, makes it very clear that “Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and partners in the promise in Christ Jesus”. This was a radical notion to the Jews of the time and it’s a lesson we can continue to carry with us today.

I am amazed at how God still can create epiphanies for me today when I think I’ve learned everything I can about my faith. This Epiphany Sunday we celebrate the arrival of the magi, who brought prophetic gifts of gold (for a king), frankincense (that was used to fragrance the temple sacrifices) and myrrh (used in embalming practices). That these men, who were the earliest converts to the church came from afar, to honor and worship Jesus as the heavenly king who would save us all, amazes me each year. Let us this year, continue to be open to the individual epiphanies that God has in store for us and work to aim for a time when “every nation on earth, will adore [him]” (Psalm 72).

He loves His Mother Mary. Happy Birthday Jesus. All glory and honor belong to you this Christmas Season.

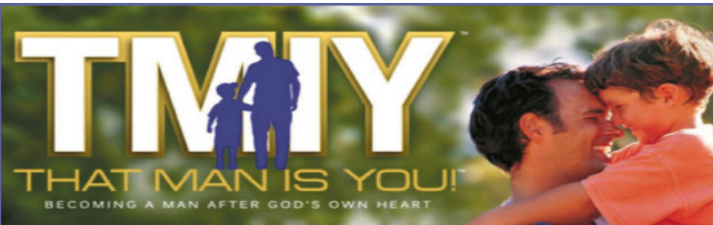

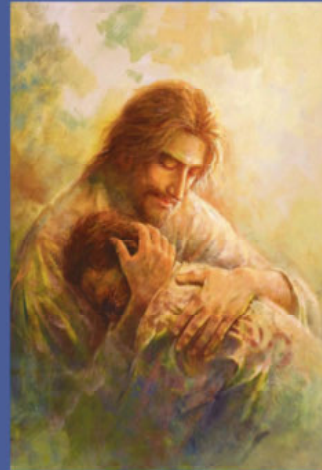
