

Music & Liturgy Notes <u>Understanding the Psalm and readings:</u>

There's a special moment at a baptism when you can't help but smile. When the water gets poured out over the baby's head and you hear that cry, or marvel at the fact that they didn't even cry out at the cold water. I wonder though, if our smile isn't so much about the temperature of the water but at the realization that this child, or adult, is now a part of our faith as Christians. Jesus was both man and Divine. He is God, so why did he need to be baptized in order to be united with God? It was for us. So that we could see and understand his human side. Now, he was born without original sin, so technically there wasn't even a need for baptism as a human, but Jesus likes to teach by example. At the beginning of Advent, we moved into the Year C cycle of readings and that means that this year we will hear a lot from the Gospel of Luke. According to Living Liturgy 2022, this year we will find that "Luke often sets important events in Jesus' life and mission in the context of prayer" and this is exactly what we see today. (LL 2022, pg. 40) "After all the people had been baptized and Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him" (Luke 3:21-22) Luke doesn't describe the moment when Jesus came to be baptized. He doesn't talk about John saying that he's unworthy to untie the lace of the sandals that Jesus wears. He simply states that he was baptized and was praying and it was that prayer that caused the Heavens to open and the Lord to speak.

I'm sure you've heard me say before that when we are baptized, we are made "priest, prophet and king". How can we best live out our life where we have this calling? How can we consistently do the will of God? How can we be connected to God to know what His will is for our lives? You may have guessed it; prayer. As a praying people we can be assured that our God listens. Sometimes His answer to our prayer is "no" but often that means He has a better plan for our lives. Sometime this week, take a moment to read through the text of the Psalm for today (Psalm 104:1b-2, 3-4, 24025, 29-30). Psalm 104 is a love poem. It speaks about the beauty of God and praises Him for all the wonderful things He has done for us. He created the earth and the skies, the creatures of the sea and sky. When we cry out, he hears us and when we need food, he fills our hands with more than enough. In Baptism we are united with THIS God. The one who loves us so much that he came down to earth as human and Divine in the person of Jesus. He loves us so much that he was willing to endure the most humiliating and painful deaths of the day and age. He loves us so much that he will leave the 99 sheep to go and gather the one back into his fold. Like Luke, let us all take this year to see Jesus and all His good works and mission to prayer. In prayer let us find the path God wants for us to be on.

Talk to Him like He is sitting right next to you, like a best friend. Spread the good news to all your family. Tell them of His leniency and tenderness. With every breath taken, remember His promise of tolerance. He is the one whop will reveal to you a way to delve deeper into your heart. Breathe in His wonderful Spirit and embrace the glorious presence of our Lord and Savior. Amen.



Espero ser como Él

"¿Quién es este Cristo? ¿Es como tú?

Quizás hayas escuchado esta historia, a menudo atribuida a la vida de Santa Teresa de Calcuta. Un hombre enfermo le hizo esta pregunta, mientras se maravillaba de su incansable servicio para él y los demás en el nombre de alguien llamado Jesucristo.

"Él no se parece en nada a mí," se dice que respondió la santa. "Pero espero ser como Él."

Aunque no se puede verificar la autenticidad de este intercambio, su mensaje suena perfectamente cierto: todo el valor de nuestra corresponsabilidad radica en su relatividad con aquel en cuyo nombre lo realizamos.

Considere la figura de Juan el Bautista, un personaje magnífico e imponente, incluso desde una perspectiva puramente literaria o histórica. Un mártir que se alimentaba de langostas salvajes y con valentía le decía la verdad al poder; un hombre tan grande que algunos lo confundieron con el Mesías.

Pero ¿por qué es grandioso? Porque preparó el camino. Todos sus logros y aventuras no significan nada si se sacan del contexto de la historia de la salvación. Solo tiene sentido en relación con Cristo, y esto es exactamente como él lo quería. "Viene uno más digno que yo," insiste. Y debido a esa humildad y ese abrazo total de la voluntad de Dios, se le otorga uno de los mayores honores del Nuevo Testamento: bautiza al Hijo de Dios.

Examinemos nuestras vidas a la luz de su relatividad con Cristo. ¿Cómo preparamos el camino? Cuando Cristo viene a nosotros, ¿qué hacemos? ¿Cómo nos abrimos a ser actores en el plan de Dios?

El Bautismo del Señor


