

## Music & Liturgy Notes Understanding the Psalm and readings:

Last year we talked about the St. Mary's Community Initiative, its goal being that we would all come together again, after a particularly difficult year of separation, to be community for one another. Whether that looks like becoming a ministry volunteer, visiting the homebound, or getting involved in one of the many social groups we have here at St. Mary's, God has made us for community and today's second reading from the first letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians is a perfect analogy for us to use. To paraphrase here, we are many parts but one body. "For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body." After the baptism of the Lord, which we celebrated a couple of weeks ago, it is helpful to remember that when we are baptized, we are made a people of God- one in body though many parts. Each part has its own gifts and abilities and we are charged at baptism to then use those gifts and abilities for the greater glory of God. Not for ourselves, but for God. Living Liturgy 2022 points out that "there is power in community...part of living and working in communion with others is recognizing that we all succeed together or fail together...when each person uses their individual gifts for the common good, the community grows and flourishes." (LL 2022, pg. 52) As people of God, baptized together into the Catholic faith, we can truly move mountains using our unique gifts given to us by God.

In the first reading the people of Israel, after having come back from their Babylonian exile, are coming back to the utter destruction of Jerusalem. They are devastated at this loss and have come together as a people of God to do the one thing they can do: worship together. When all seems lost today, there is always something we, as a people of God, a community made of many parts, can do: worship. Sundays are the day we come together to do just as the Israelites in the reading from Nehemiah today did. Just as the Jews in Nazareth are doing today in the Gospel reading from Luke. Jesus has a mic drop moment. One that we should all remember. He says, referring to the readings from Leviticus 25 and Deuteronomy 15 "the spirit is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives...". He then follows it up with his mic drop moment saying "Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing." Can you hear the crickets chirping after he says this? I certainly can! These same people, descendants from the ones we read about in the first reading are finally getting their long awaited Messiah and yet they are astonished at what Jesus says today. Are we, as a people, still astonished at what Jesus has asked of us today? As a community of many parts, each with its own gifts, are we truly living out our baptismal promises? How can we help others to come to the knowledge that Jesus drops on us today? This week, let us all be reminded of what a community of believers looks like- one that works together to "grow and flourish" and not fail.

We all become children again as we look at Christmas lights and parades and eagerly await Christmas morning with its gifts and family gatherings. But after the hectic schedules of Christmas activities and parties dies down, we enter, what I find to be, an even more beautiful season; Ordinary Time. There are 34 weeks of Ordinary Time in our church calendar. Far more than the Seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter. While there is particular beauty in each of these seasons, there is something special about the silence of ordinary time. As the quote above so wonderfully states "it's easy to love a rose, but it takes a lot to love a leaf". Its easy to love Christmas and Easter, but there's something special about the ordinary. The time we spend most of our year in provides us an insight into the life that Jesus led. Not the one leading up to his birth, or his death on the cross and resurrection, but the one he lived every day. Preaching and teaching among the people.

There is beauty in the silence of everyday living if we can open our eyes to see and appreciate it. There is prayer in our everyday activities. I remember going to confession with an Opus Dei priest and complaining that I did not have a regular prayer life. He asked me if I did the dishes every day. I said "yes, most days at least once". His answer to me next was something that has stayed with me years later; "There is prayer in doing the dishes for your family." There is prayer in our ordinary chores if they are done with love for those around us. If they are done in service to others. Jesus, for 30 years, lived an ordinary life. It was this ordinary life, that prepared him to lead an extraordinary 3 years of ministry which has changed the course of our own lives on this earth. We, most of us, live ordinary lives filled with family and friends. Good times and times of struggle. Times of happiness and sadness. It's in the times of quiet, watching your family grow, spending time with friends you love, going to work or doing chores around the house, that we find the beauty of the ordinary. So, though this time of the year is called Ordinary Time, let us remember that it's anything but ordinary. Maybe we can petition the church to rename it "Beautiful Time"? Just kidding. I think ordinary is perfect.


