Music & Liturgy Notes Understanding the Psalm and readings:

At the end of last week's second reading from 1st Corinthians St. Paul says that "Some people God has designated it the church to be, first, apostles; second, prophets; third, teachers;" This week we have a continuation of St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians with a familiar reading that we may hear often at weddings. While it's a perfect reading for the Wedding Ceremony, let's take a little closer look at the message we are receiving today. Faith, though it can move mountains, is nothing without love. Hope, though we may give away all we have, even our bodies, in hope of achieving something greater, without love means nothing. As children we don't think with full knowledge of God and His deep love for us. As a child we only see and understand things partially. As men and women who have grown in our faith, we are able to see clearly and know how important love is. Jesus gives us one new commandment; to "love your neighbor as yourself" (Mark 12:31). And we know from scripture that "God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son" (John 3:16) There's a common theme here; love. At the end of the second reading today St. Paul tells us "So faith, hope, love remain, these three, but the greatest of these is love."

What does a true Christian look like? If you have faith but don't offer love to others as an outward sign of that faith, are you truly living out that faith? If you have hope in the eternal reward of Heaven but don't, in turn, invite others in love to see the church that offers that hope of life eternal, are you truly living out the call that we heard at the end of last week's 2nd reading? God has given us all gifts as apostles first, second, prophets and third, teachers. The apostles reached out in love to bring others to the faith that Jesus Christ himself established. This too is our job.

Love is hard. St. Teresa Lisieux, often referred to as the "Little Flower", showed love in everything she did. She is especially known for showing love to the cranky nun in the cell next to hers, and turning the annoying clicking sound one nun would make while praying in the chapel, to music in her head. She is an example to us of the transformative power of love in our lives. Living Liturgy 2022 points out that when we live out love, as God intended it, we can live out the prophetic lives we have been called to by our Baptism. (LL 2022, pg.56).

As faithful Christians, though we fail often, we can always turn to God and, out of love, He will welcome us back with open arms. Let us too take this example of our loving God and spread the love of Christ to all we encounter!

Sit there at the feet of Jesus and hand all worries over to Him. Sit there and look at Him on the cross arms stretched out wide to welcome all who come to Him. Head bent to show that He really wants to listen to you. Be bold and strong as you step into His open arms. Tell Him all your sins, sorrow, failures, worries and disappointments. He will tell you that you are forgiven. This is why He shed all that blood on the cross. He was the sacrificial lamb who poured out His unfailing love for us. Our Father in heaven accepted this sacrifice and gave us His forgiveness by HIs grace and mercy. Continue to sit at the feet of Jesus and let Him tear down the walls and break the chains that paralyze your movement toward progress. Shake it off, all that binds you. Stand up for yourself because you are worth it. Love abounds in this crucified Savior. All of it was for you. Come to Him at His feet and put it all right there. He can take it all and place everything into a bag and burn it to ashes, never to consume you again. He poured out His blood for you. He will pour out merciful love into your soul and say you are absolved of all sin. He is pure love. Amen.

EPHESIANS 5: 6-10: "Let no one deceive you with empty arguments for because of these things the wrath of God is coming upon the disobedient. So do not be associated with them. For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light, for light produces every kind of goodness and righteousness and truth. Try to learn what is pleasing to the Lord." *Priscilla Parker, Spiritual Director (Pls. lv. Msg. 512-773-9722)*



<u>St. Blaise</u> February 3

You may be familiar with the annual "blessing of throats" that many parishes in the United States use to commemorate the beloved bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.


History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.



Ser cristiano es ser un profeta comprometido en el amor y en la esperanza. La Liturgia de hoy, por medio del profeta Jeremías, nos pone en alerta sobre este asunto del llamado de Dios al discipulado ya desde el vientre materno: "Antes de formarte en el seno de tu madre, ya te conocía; antes de que tú nacieras, yo te consagré, y te destiné a ser profeta de las naciones" (Jeremías 1,5). Para comprender con mayor claridad y poner manos a la obra en este llamado, debemos recordar que, el domingo pasado, Jesús se encontraba en la sinagoga de Nazaret y sus últimas palabas del pasaje de la Escritura decían: "Hoy se cumplen estas palabras proféticas y a ustedes les llegan noticias de ello" (Lucas 4,21).

Los que escuchaban a Jesús se admiraban de su elocuencia. ¡No lo podían creer! Ellos lo conocían, habían vivido a su alrededor, tenían familiaridad con él. Por lo menos sabían su oficio, "carpintero, hijo de José y María". Jesús conocía sus pensamientos y responde: "Seguramente ustedes me van a recordar el dicho: Medico, cúrate a ti mismo. Realiza también aquí, en tu patria, lo que nos cuentan que hiciste en Cafarnaúm" (Lucas 4,23). ¿Por qué nadie es profeta en su tierra? Le pasó a Jesús y nos pasa muchas veces a nosotros, hacemos el bien por ahí y cuando se dan cuenta los vecinos y la familia, viene el cuestionamiento y los comentarios sin saber realmente lo que la persona es, vive, o siente.
