

Father's Notebook



Greetings brother's and sisters in Christ,

As it turns out, the Holy Land trip that I am leading from the parish is postponed. Please continue to pray for those who are in the Holy Land who have not had any income from tourism and visitors. As we begin the new year, it is a time for New Years Resolutions.

In the seminary, as we are studying to be priests, there are the four "pillars" that each seminarian is evaluated upon and is working to grow in virtue in. Although you are not in seminary, I think as Christians we should still look at these 4 areas when looking at how we can grow in Holiness. The four pillars are: Intellectual, Spiritual, Pastoral and Human.

Jesus said, "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly" (Jn 10:10). Jesus Christ became man to show us the way to live life to the fullest. That means to be filled with life intellectually, spiritually, humanly, and pastorally. St. Ireneaus, a early Church Father, put it this way, "The Glory of God is man fully alive."

Intellectual life means that I am allowing my mind to be illuminated by truths of God and the world. To never stop learning about our faith. I often tell youth confirmandi that Confirmation is not graduation but the beginning of your life of faith. Which means you must continue learning for the rest of your life. Because the truths of God illuminates the world so that we can live fully alive.

Spiritual life means that my relationship with God is consistent and intimate. Sometimes this means that my devotional life is deep with rosaries and novenas, but other times it means that I am spending time with God enough each day and growing in deeper awareness of His love for you and your love for Him.

Pastoral life is the ministries and ways in which I serve others. St. John Paul II would say that, "Man cannot fully find himself, except through a sincere gift of himself." When we give ourselves away as a gift to others, we don't lose ourselves but instead find who we are. We are made in the image and likeness of God who pours himself out in love to us.

Lastly Human life consists of living life healthily in mind and body. To take care of our emotional and physical well being. This means eating healthy and exercising but also making sure we have good relationships in our lives. Good friends are good for your health studies show. "It is not good for man to be alone" (Gen 2:18). We should have 3-5 good friends/ relationships that are deep and virtuous. Good friends that we not only are able to share our lives with, but that encourage us to be the best versions of ourselves. To become who we were created to be by God.

En el seminario, mientras estudiamos para ser sacerdotes, existen los cuatro "pilares" sobre los que se evalúa a cada seminarista y en los que está trabajando para crecer en virtud. Aunque no estás en el seminario, creo que como cristianos deberíamos mirar estas 4 áreas al ver cómo podemos crecer en santidad. Los cuatro pilares son: Intelectual, Espiritual, Pastoral y Humano.

Jesús dijo: "Yo vine para que tengan vida y la tengan en abundancia" (Jn 10:10). Jesucristo se hizo hombre para mostrarnos el camino para vivir la vida al máximo. Eso significa estar lleno de vida intelectual, espiritual, humana y pastoralmente. San Ireneo, uno de los primeros padres de la Iglesia, lo expresó de esta manera: "La gloria de Dios es el hombre plenamente vivo".

La vida intelectual significa que estoy permitiendo que mi mente sea iluminada por las verdades de Dios y del mundo. Para nunca dejar de aprender sobre nuestra fe. A menudo les digo a los jóvenes confirmandos que la Confirmación no es la graduación, sino el comienzo de su vida de fe. Lo que significa que debes seguir aprendiendo por el resto de tu vida. Porque las verdades de Dios iluminan el mundo para que podamos vivir plenamente vivos.

La vida espiritual significa que mi relación con Dios es constante e íntima. A veces esto significa que mi vida devocional está llena de rosarios y novenas, pero otras veces significa que paso suficiente tiempo con Dios cada día y que estoy creciendo en una conciencia más profunda de Su amor por ti y tu amor por Él.

La vida pastoral son los ministerios y las formas en que sirvo a los demás. San Juan Pablo II diría que "el hombre no puede encontrarse plenamente a sí mismo, si no es a través de un don sincero de sí mismo". Cuando nos regalamos a los demás, no nos perdemos a nosotros mismos, sino que encontramos quiénes somos. Estamos hechos a imagen y semejanza de Dios, quien se derrama en amor por nosotros.

Por último, la vida humana consiste en vivir la vida sanamente en cuerpo y mente. Cuidar nuestro bienestar físico y emocional. Esto significa comer sano y hacer ejercicio, pero también asegurarnos de tener buenas relaciones en nuestras vidas. Los buenos amigos son buenos para su salud, según muestran los estudios. "No es bueno que el hombre esté solo" (Gen 2:18). Debemos tener de 3 a 5 buenos amigos / relaciones que sean profundas y virtuosas. Buenos amigos con los que no solo podemos compartir nuestra vida, sino que nos animan a ser las mejores versiones de nosotros mismos. Convertirnos en quienes fuimos creados por Dios.


