March 26, 2023

<u>Lazarus,</u> <u>Come Out!</u>

Martha said to Jesus: "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world."

We are building up throughout this holy season of Lent to the Glory of Easter, to the Resurrection of Jesus.

On our Lenten journey to the Holy City of Jerusalem this year we have:

- Been tempted in the desert by Satan.
- Seen the Glory of the Lord on Mount Tabor.at the Transfiguration of the Lord

Water, Light & Life:

Just as all plant and animal life need water and light to live, grow and thrive, so **Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults**, we received the **Water of Life** at **Samaritan** we will test them with last of the **Three Woman's Well** on the Third Sunday of Lent. "**Scrutinies**" and we prepare those chosen

We received the **Light of the World** last week with the **Healing of the Man Born Blind**.

Finally, we are now being called to Life, to the fullness of Life... living in God.

This is the last of the three Lenten themes from St. John's Gospel: this **5th Sunday of Lent finally reveals Jesus as The Life.**

I AM the Resurrection and the Life. Whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live.



I don't know about you, but during the first days of the

pandemic I could relate to Lazarus. We were fearful, hidden behind closed doors, in our little caves and tombs.

That quiet time helped me to seriously reflect, and, coupled with the lack of distractions our many "false gods" — certainly gave me more time to think about what really matters:

There is great hope for the world in all of this.

What then shall we say to this? If God is for us, who can be against us?

Our 2nd reading from the Mass of the Fifth Sunday of Lent comes from the powerful **8th Chapter of St. Paul's Letter to the Romans.**

Take time to read it through during this week. Now, we have so much more hope, as do those who preparing to be received into the Church

For those who attend the 11 AM Sunday Mass and those elect, our candidates and catechumens taking part in the RCIA, the **Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults,** we will test them with last of the **Three** "Scrutinies" and we prepare those chosen ones to this light of life at the great Easter Vigil Mass on April 8th. Then they will join us as Children of the Life.

Next Sunday is Palm Sunday. Please wear RED if possible. Fr. Kilian and All of Our Staff

We meet in the **Guadalupe Room** by the parish office from **9am to 10:30am on Sunday's**.


