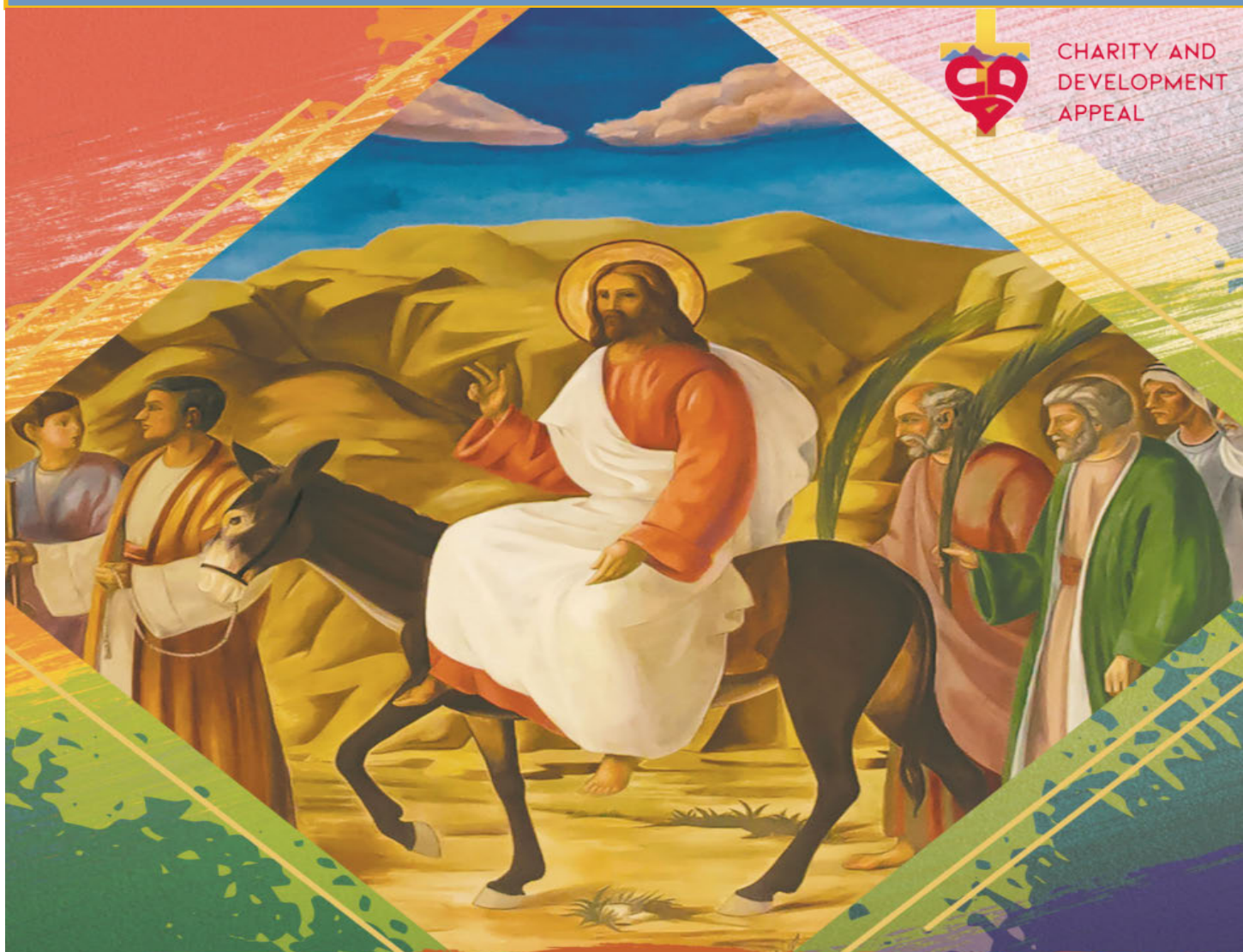

April 2, 2023

Palm Sunday of The Passion of The Lord

“Hosanna, Hosanna!”

St. Matthew's Passion

We remember once again the great drama of Holy Week on this final weekend of Lent.

The Passion of Our Lord was a very complex, public and rapidly-changing political situation. Back then, the drama surrounded the young Rabbi who held power to heal—and, with the miraculous story of Lazarus, to raise the dead!

Jesus enters Jerusalem and is hailed and feted as a King and Savior on Palm Sunday.

He teaches at the Temple area and then boldly cleanses the Temple, causing outrage among the authorities during the great Pilgrimage Festival of The Passover. He celebrates the Passover, the Last Supper, and then endures His Agony. He is in turn betrayed, arrested, abandoned, mocked, beaten and although totally innocent, tried before Pontius Pilate.

Jesus is denied three times by Peter; then he is imprisoned, tried again, brutally scourged, judged again, condemned to death and finally crucified as “the King of the Jews”.

Steve Ray explains how “**St. Matthew's Gospel** presents Jesus to his people as **Messiah and King with a Royal Line** through the kings to David and back to Abraham the patriarch of Israel. In fact, the phrases ***Kingdom of God / Heaven*** are used almost forty times by St. Matthew”

(Understanding St. Matthew and his Gospel).

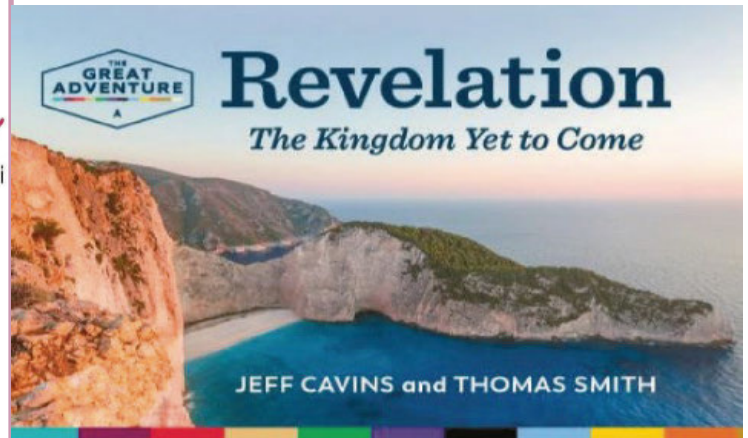

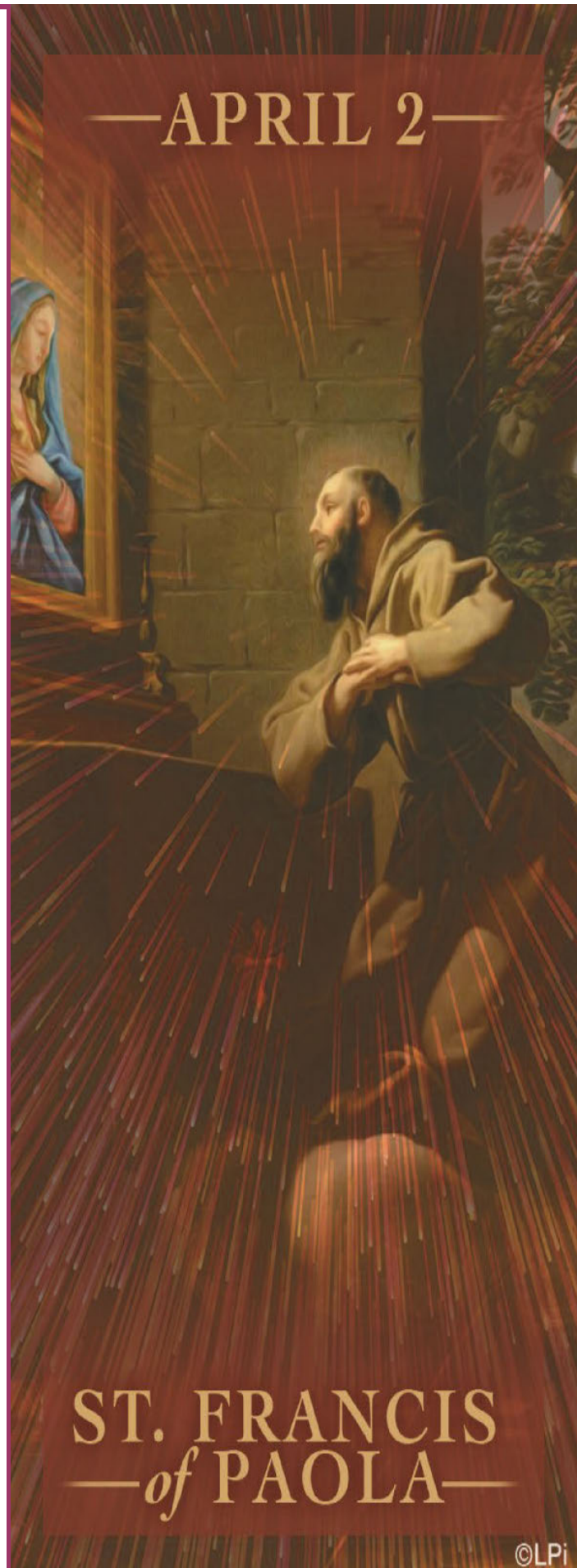

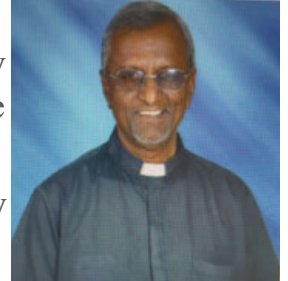


Special Pastor's Message: Moving On In July

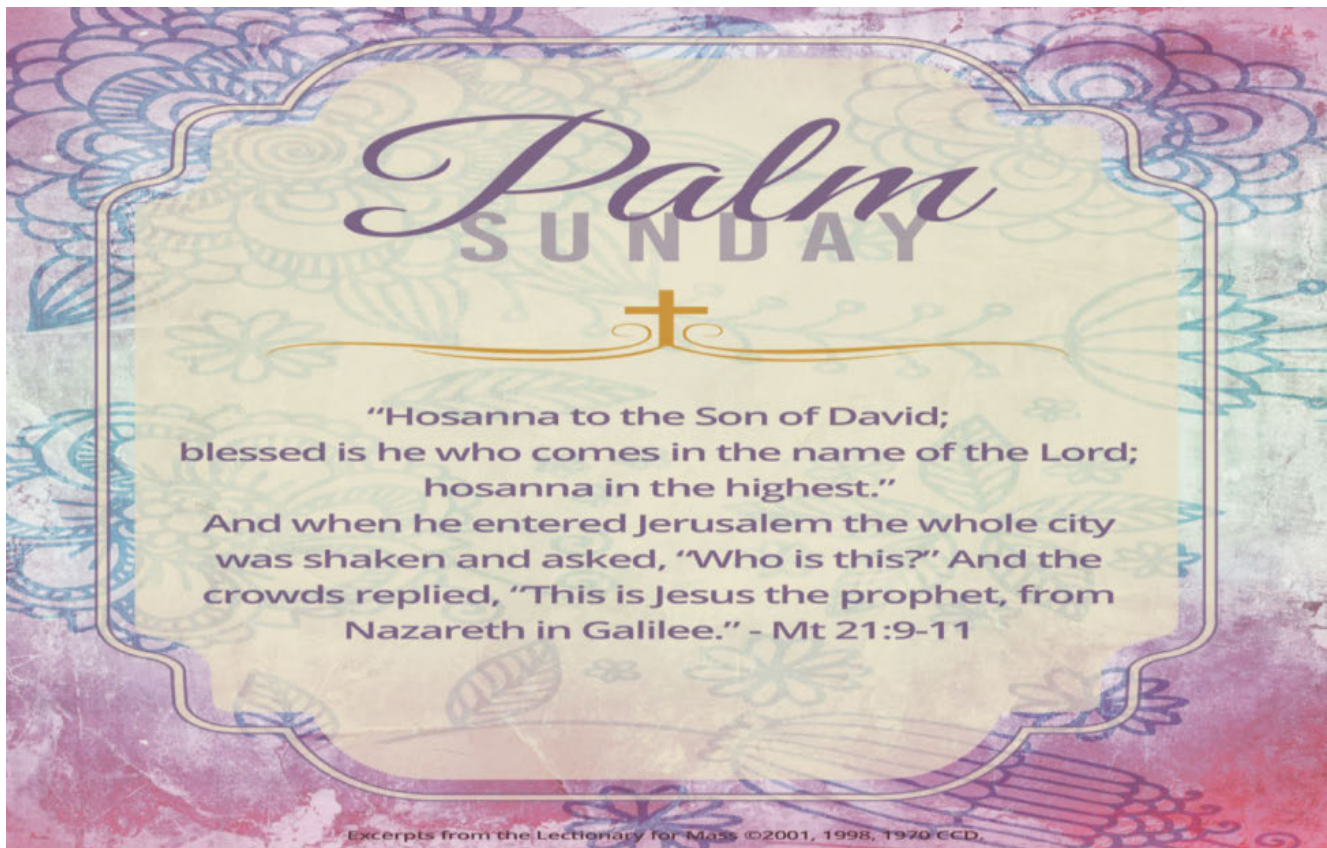
Fr. John Slobig worked with Fr. David at St. Gabriel's for two years and has a very high regard for him. I will have much more information on Fr. David soon.

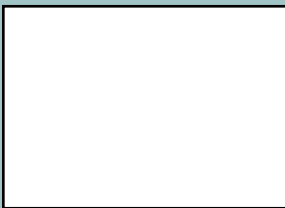

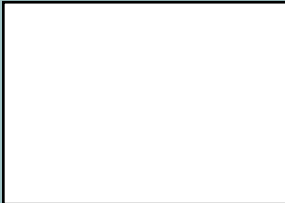

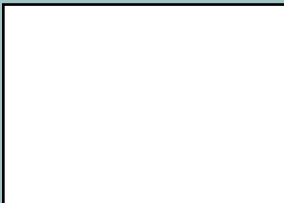
