Is there any situation in which you would believe your neighbor if they imitated Jesus in this week's gospel?


Going Deeper to Understand the Gospel

"When the people in the synagogue heard this, they were all filled with fury....But Jesus passed through the midst of them and went away."

For Jesus' neighbors and colleagues in His hometown, a routine visit to the synagogue has turned into a shocking reveal. Jesus has stood up and read the prophecy from Isiah about Himself. He then looks up and tells those gathered that the prophecy is fulfilled. He is telling His neighbors that He is, in fact, the Messiah. You can imagine how this may have come across as humorous, and then perhaps a little awkward for those listening. They knew Jesus. They have known Him His whole life. They knew Him so well that someone even whispered, "Isn't this Joseph's kid?"

Anticipating their rejection, He references the history of Elijah and Elisha, who were also rejected from their hometowns. But this is too much for the men of the town in the synagogue. "They rose up, drove Him out of town, and led Him to the brow of the hill on which their town had been built, to hurl Him down headlong." They have got Jesus backed up to a cliff, with the intention of throwing Him over. That's how immediate and all-consuming the threat of something radically new is to these townspeople. Jesus, the Messiah?

The animosity that Jesus will encounter throughout His life, the opposition that will lead Him to that terrible mission of martyrdom, seems to be concentrated into this event as the sign from Luke of what is to come.

Tales from the Mission- "What's In A Name"

Imagine if our parish was named "The First Catholic Church of Scottsdale" or something more imaginative like "The Little White Mission on Brown." No. Not. Never. There seems to be a little book called the Rite of Dedication of a Church and an Altar, administered in conjunction with a couple of Canon Laws that prohibits such titles as previously cited. The seven options available will ensure that we will always attend Mass at a Saint Someone, a Holy Spirit, a name of the Trinity, a name for Christ, a name for Mary (that sounds familiar), or a holy Angel Catholic Church somewhere. The Diocesan Bishop will determine the name of a new church or parish based upon some personal conation. He will entertain suggestions, however, to what end that

might persuade him. As noted in his biography, Msgr. Robert Donohoe reminded us that Bishop Daniel Gercke of Tucson chose the name of his first parish of St. Agnes because the Father was greatly influenced by a Mother Agnes who prayed for his missions while assigned to the Philippines. Again, with Bishop Gercke, we would like to presume that our Old Adobe Mission was given the name of "Our Lady of Perpetual Help" at the suggestion of our Fr. James P. Davis (the first diocesan priest to bring the mass to Scottsdale) due to incessant "politicking" by the ladies of the Catholic Society of Scottsdale. We may never know the truth about the naming of the first Catholic church in Scottsdale; the Diocese of Tucson has no documentation as to that event; and even worse, Archbishop James P. Davis retired in 1974 to live out the remaining 14 years of his life in Phoenix, and there is no record of anyone interviewing him about his early life in Tempe or building the first church in Scottsdale. Regardless, we have a trail set by a "miracle", "the Catholic Society ladies", and "a young endearing priest" that leads to our name. The Mexican community got their wish to have a church named after the Holy Mother, and we, the parishioners of OLPH, will carry that distinction as <u>ours</u>, forever. (To be continued)


