





### Prepare Yourself for Next Sunday's Mass

February 6, 2022 Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time



### Going Deeper to Understand the Gospel

As we started to journey through Ordinary Time, we met Jesus beginning His public ministry. Today, we hear His call to His first disciples to follow Him and companion Him in this ministry. In the gospel, Jesus is standing on the lakeside with a crowd pressing around Him to hear the word of God. Significantly, Peter and his companions are not part of this crowd. They are tending to their nets after an unprofitable night's fishing. Then Jesus Himself becomes a "fisherman." He gets into Simon's boat, hauls this probably nonplussed man in with Him, and puts out a short way from the shore to continue teaching the crowd. After that, Jesus addresses His words to Simon only, telling him to launch out into the deep and put down his nets for a catch. Simon is certain, based on his experience, that there is nothing to catch. However, he gives it a try. This deference to Jesus is exemplary of our faith, but this week, maybe focus on the final event of this story: once Simon's boat begins to fill, he calls his colleagues to help him. Simon could have kept this to himself. He had a big take. He'd likely be the only person with fish to sell the next day. Instead, his reaction is to tell his colleagues about the opportunity he has found. They set out into the water, and both boats are filled so heavy with fish that they can barely keep them afloat.

What Jesus does is crush Simon's expectations. Simon, like any fisherman, has learned how to read the signs of the sea and knows what works and what doesn't. But Jesus encourages him to try one more time. The result is abundance.



### TALES FROM THE MISSION #11 (The First Mass – 15 October 1933)

Five years of prayers, hope, anticipation, and hard labor seemed like a long-forgotten issue to the citizens of the Mexican Barrio of South Scottsdale this day. The sun was already high in the late morning sky with the promise of being the best day that God ever made. It was the 15th of October 1933, a large, excited crowd had gathered in front of the small church, gleaming in its bright limestone white exterior. Fr. James Davis arrived from Tempe to conduct the first Mass to be performed at what one day would be

called The Old Adobe Mission. He went straight to the Sacristy where a small wardrobe held the priest's and altar boys' vestments, careful to dodge the bell rope that hung from the center of the ceiling. Someone pulled on the bell rope and the result was a reverberating sound as if originating in Heaven. The doors were opened and the throng began to file inside, all dressed in their finest clothing, clambering to be the first inside, as if they had never seen the interior before, as if they had not spent untold hours, days and years creating this miracle themselves. The first thing that hit you upon entering was the smell of the Adobe bricks, mixed in with the smell of the wood emanating from the newly built pews (the pews were provided by the members themselves and built to the size of each family). You didn't look down at the packed dirt floor, rather you tried to concentrate on the blue slate laid down the center aisle, also along the walls under the windows, by a couple of thoughtful Corral brothers. The altar was a small wooden box at the front of the nave; not to worry as there was a new and freshly pressed cloth covering it. A small crucifix sat on the altar. Remember the promise of the Catholic Society? A single picture of the Holy Mother hung on the wall above the altar. The stained-glass windows glistened. Rather bare bones indeed; however, the look of pride on the faces of the participants appeared as if they were inside the greatest cathedral on earth. Father Davis stepped forward and made the Sign of the Cross ... it was like the hand of God had reached down and touched everyone inside. (To Be Continued)


