Feast of the Annunciation of the Lord

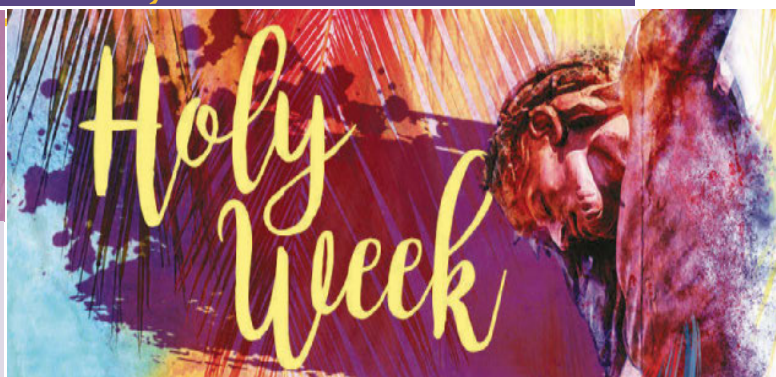

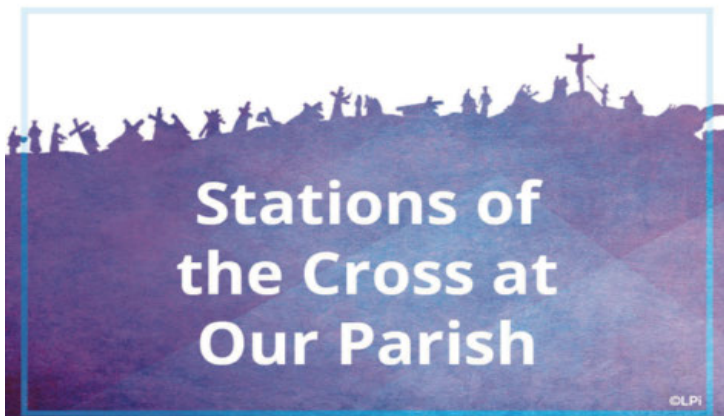

Guidelines for Fasting & Abstinence


Good Friday is a day of fasting and abstinence; all
Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence.

Abstinence - No meat (milk, eggs, & fish are fine)

Fast - eating only one normal size meal and two
small meals, with no snacks.

ALL Catholics aged 14 and older are required to
abstain from meat on the days of abstinence;
those aged 18-59 are required to fast on the days
of fasting *unless special medical conditions pre-
vent them from doing so.*

***NO Regular Mass Schedule on
Holy Thursday, Good Friday or
Holy Saturday.***

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Deserts can be lonely, isolated, and treacherous places. When a person wanders in a desert, they can easily get disoriented, dehydrated, confused, lost, and vulnerable. Temptation is at its peak, especially when confronted with something that may offer some respite or relief, even a mirage. Deserts can bring us to our weakest moment and

tempt our faith. The Christian journey can be described as a desert experience as we vacillate back and forth, falling victim to the mirages of our lives versus the true, life-giving water offered by God. We need a burning bush experience in our lives that convinces us of the power of God and reveals Him as the “I am” of all existence.

Moses was leading his flock across the desert when he found himself at Mount Horeb. Mountains give us a fuller perspective of life, a panoramic view of what would otherwise be hidden from the limitations of our sight. That’s when Moses met God. We have to find our way to a mountain experience where our vantage point can take on a wider view of life. Many things can do this for us: the birth of a child, the death of someone we love, the joy that comes from marveling at the beauty of God’s work, the pondering of life’s mysteries, and the ache of longing found deep within our souls. There are many things in life that can wake us up, give us a clearer, better view of things and become occasions where a bush may burn and God’s presence as the eternal uncreated One is revealed.

God is very patient and gives us the time and space we need to figure things out and bear some good fruit. He doesn’t rush to cut us down or get frustrated with our barrenness. But we have to remember that the desert journeys of our lives come with some risks. The major risk is that we will mistakenly believe that the mirages are real. Thus, we fall victim to thinking that the respite and refreshment we seek is discovered in a place other than where it actually is. Our faith and the life of the Church are the safeguards we need to keep us properly orientated so that we don’t get lost or confused and stay on course.

Prepare Yourself for Next Sunday's Mass

March 27, 2022
Fourth Sunday of Lent

First Reading: Joshua 5: 9a, 10 - 12
Responsorial Psalm: 34: 2 - 3, 4 - 5, 6 - 7
"Taste and see the goodness of the Lord."
Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5: 17 - 21
Gospel: Luke: 15: 1 - 3, 11 - 32

Was there ever a time you were the Prodigal Son? Or the father? Or the other brother?

Going Deeper to Understand the Gospel

Today's gospel is well known for the value it places on welcoming those who have turned away. However it is worth looking at where Jesus stands when He shares this parable; in the midst of tax collectors and sinners. Jesus isn't preaching to faithful Jews; He is preaching to a group of people whom the faithful Jews want nothing to do with. By physically aligning Himself with sinners, Jesus delivers His message in a way that the Pharisees find threatening. They are used to avoiding sinners and keeping themselves "clean" by staying away from those who threaten their holiness. Jesus does not espouse this mindset. He goes into a crowd of sinners and shares a story of a sinner being accepted.

How do you think the father in this parable felt during the time that his son was away? Do you think the father turned all of his attention to the second, faithful son? Do you think the father thought and prayed about his far-off son? "While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion." His father saw him coming before he had arrived. Perhaps the father was even waiting. Perhaps he had been waiting a long time. Jesus does not stand in a crowd of faithful to welcome home sinners. He goes to the sinners, seeing them even though they are a long way off.

During Lent, the church calls us to remember the gifts of God that we have squandered and that have led us into the small or greater mess of our spiritual "pigsty." With great wisdom, the church also knows that we need this time of heightened awareness of our compassionate Father who embraces us in the outstretched arms of the Crucified.
