



Guidelines for Fasting & Abstinence

Good Friday is a day of fasting and abstinence; all Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence.

Abstinence - No meat (milk, eggs, & fish are fine) Fast - eating only one normal size meal and two small meals, with no snacks.

ALL Catholics aged 14 and older are required to abstain from meat on the days of abstinence; those aged 18-59 are required to fast on the days of fasting unless special medical conditions prevent them from doing so.

NO Regular Mass Schedule on Holy Thursday, Good Friday or Holy Saturday.



Saint of the Week - St. Vincent Ferrer



St. Vincent Ferrer is the patron saint of builders because of his fame for "building up" and strengthening the Church: through his preaching, missionary work, in his teachings, as confessor and adviser. At Valencia in Spain, this illustrious son of St. Dominic came into the world on January 23, 1357. In the year 1374, he entered the Order of St. Dominic in a monastery near his native city. Soon after his profession he was commissioned to deliver lectures on philosophy. On being sent to Barcelona, he continued his scholastic duties and at the same time devoted himself to preaching.

At Lerida, the famous university city of Catalonia, he received his doctorate. After this he labored six years in Valencia, during which time he perfected himself in the Christian life. In 1390, he was obliged to accompany Cardinal Pedro de Luna to

France, but he soon returned home. When, in 1394, de Luna himself had become Pope at Avignon he summoned St. Vincent and made him Master of the sacred palace. In this capacity St. Vincent made unsuccessful efforts to put an end to the great schism. He refused all ecclesiastical dignities, even the cardinal's hat, and only craved to be appointed apostolic missionary.

Now began those labors that made him the famous missionary of the fourteenth century. He evangelized nearly every province of Spain, and preached in France, Italy, Germany, Flanders, England, Scotland, and Ireland. Numerous conversions followed his preaching, which God Himself assisted by the gift of miracles. Though the Church was then divided by the great schism, the saint was honorably received in the districts subject to the two claimants to the Papacy. He was even invited to Mohammedan Granada, where he preached the gospel with much success. He lived to behold the end of the great schism, and the election of Pope Martin V. Finally, crowned with labors, he died April 5, 1419. His feast day is April 5.


Jesus' Entry Into Jerusalem

Going Deeper to Understand the Gospel

Jesus is about to die, and He knows it, but the thing He is most concerned with is keeping His friends safe. He knows they will desert Him when He needs them most. Jesus knows Peter isn't up to the task of vouching for Him. But Jesus still tells them what's going to happen, because they are His friends, and He loves them.

This gospel is an opportunity for us to sympathize with Jesus. If your best friends stopped talking to you in the middle of a time you were going through a personal tragedy, would you still reach out to them? Would you forgive them? Or would you blame them for not having the strength to accompany you through your loss? Jesus is about to go through great physical and mental peril, and His primary concern is preparing His friends to help Him, even though He knows they probably won't step up and follow through. There is a deep tenderness in these friendships—filial, platonic, and masculine—that exemplify the depth of Jesus' fraternal love for His friends. Jesus knows that Judas is going to hurt Him, but Jesus doesn't call him out or shame him. Jesus lets Judas exercise free will, because Jesus loves every single one of those men praying with Him, and He wants them to try.

When we go down silently on our knees, rising up to hear the faith of a non-Gentile proclaim before the human wreck of a dead man: "This man was innocent beyond doubt", this is the faith that will take us through Holy Week and through the killing fields in our own world.



Tales from the Mission #14

"The Great Irish Invasion"

Following WWII, Bishop Daniel J. Gercke loaded the Diocese of Tucson with Irish priests, referred to at the time as the "Irish Invasion". Our own Father Maguire would say, with a chuckle, "We're every place!" At one time the roster of priests within the Diocese of Tucson listed 55 Irish priests that resulted in a lot of Horse Trading.... and golf. Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish received our share, saving the best of the best for us. Fr. Eugene Maguire, a graduate of St. Patrick's Seminary at Carlow, Ireland, arrived on the scene. "In like a Lamb, out like a Lion" would best describe this beloved priest. Father was at the Queen of Peace Church in Mesa, when he received a letter from Bishop Gercke on December 18th, 1952, directing him to depart the very next day to become the pastor in Scottsdale. Oh boy! Father Maguire stories? When the Father arrived, there was a small church named St. Philomena at the Yaqui community on 64th Street to which OLPH was required to say one Mass each Sunday. Father would often say, with a broad grin, "They were a poor lot. Each Sunday the collection would vary from, \$4.00 to \$6.00." Meanwhile, at our main church he issued collection baskets affixed with a long handle where the ushers could reach way into everybody in the row. Father then instructed, "Reach way in, and if they don't give you something, you tap them on the knee with the basket." You may be laughing right now but it worked, would you want to be tapped on the knee with the collection basket? (More Maguire to come).




