

PARISH CAMPOUT: AUGUST 11-14, 2022 L.L. Stub Stewart State Park



WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY January 18–25

"We saw the star in the East, and we came to worship Him." ~Matthew 2:2

The Middle East Council of Churches selected the Epiphany as theme for the 2022 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, originating from the churches in Lebanon, where life is extremely difficult and economically disastrous. Adding the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, the situation is quite stressful. The power of prayer in solidarity with those who suffer is a demonstration of Christian unity and a sign of communion.

Each year in January, the Church recalls the visit of the Magi to Bethlehem, highlighting God's invitation to all of humanity to a new covenant in the Incarnation of Christ. In the Eastern Churches, Epiphany is joined to the mystery of the Baptism of Christ, a baptism all Christians hold in common as testimony to their faith in the Son of God.


