

Greetings and Peace in our Lord Jesus Christ! Happy Second Sunday in Ordinary Time!

It's hard to believe that we are already in the first section of Ordinary Time, although it is the shorter of two Sections, the longer section follows Pentecost until Advent. I actually love Ordinary Time. While we all like the extraordinary moments in life – it is in the ordinary moments of life that God is truly at work within us. Most of us have our ordinary routines in life. Mine is to wake up without an alarm, carefully step over my sleeping dogs, make a cup of coffee, grab some dog bones for the now awaken dogs, and then go downstairs to begin my day in prayer. I encourage each of you to look at your ordinary routine of the day and ask this question – where is prayer in the midst of that day? Do you pray only at critical times or is your life one of constant prayer? For example, I conclude my day in the chapel (where I began my day) with a nightly prayer and a particular examen of what I could have done better that day and an act of contrition.


My hope for all of us is that this short time of Ordinary Time will be focused on developing an deep and intimate prayer life that will help us to navigate through all of the uncertainties, challenges and positive aspects of life that we face on a constant basis. I would encourage you each day to find a daily devotional that will help you to focus on your relationship with Jesus Christ. For example, on my phone, I receive 3 daily devotionals from 3 different sources that specifically focus on the priesthood. I also have a daily devotional that I read each day on the spiritual life of First Responders.

Of course, if you have any questions or experience any difficulty with your prayer life – you can always call me, Fr. Bob, Deacon Bill, Deacon Mike, Deacon Paul or any of our retired deacons to help guide you! That's what we are here for!

LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

Relationships are hard to clarify. Determining whether people in our lives are simply acquaintances and associates or a deeper level of friend is a journey that takes time. Identifying and celebrating those people who really care about us is a lifelong adventure that involves both moments of intense elation and heartache. Some relationships are more easily definable than others. Two people who are in love must decide whether the love they share has the freedom and depth necessary for lifelong commitments. Other relationships may look like friendship but may harbor grave dysfunction and toxicity. Discernment is needed on all fronts. Our relationship with God also needs definition and discernment. God has taken creation as His spouse and human beings as His children. God delights in us and all that He has made. The wedding feast at Cana demonstrates God's investment in all of this, especially our happiness. Life is a time for celebration and great rejoicing!



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Not much is known about the life of St. Sebastian (256 – 287), except that he was a Roman martyr whose name has been mentioned throughout history since early 350.

We see St. Sebastian many times in art, especially from iconic paintings from Guido Reni, Andrea Mantegna and Hendrick ter Brugghen. Historical scholars now agree that a spiritual story has the beloved saint entering the Roman army because only there could he assist Christian martyrs without arousing suspicion on himself. Eventually he was found out, brought before Emperor Diocletian and delivered to Mauritanian archers to be shot to death. Pierced with arrows, he was left for dead, but managed to survive. He recovered from his wounds but still refused to leave.

One day, St. Sebastian took up a position near where the emperor was to pass. He confronted the emperor, condemning him for his cruelty to Christians. This time the sentence of death was carried out, and St. Sebastian was beaten to death with clubs. Today he is the patron saint of athletes.




A Note on Second Collections





IT TAKES ALL KINDS

"If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote St. Therese of Lisieux, "spring would lose its loveliness."

Who is God asking you to be today? There is an obvious answer that springs to mind right out of the gate. God wants me to be a good person (a good father, a good husband) today; today, God wants me to be a saint.

But this answer fails to get to the heart of the question. We are all striving today to serve the same Spirit, but we are given different gifts to do so. The one who has the gift of knowledge may fail if today he decides he wants to be a healer. The one who has the gift of "varieties of tongues" might falter in the expression of wisdom. Think about the wedding at Cana and the players in the scene: the servers, the guests, the bride and groom. They all have a unique role to play, and though it is to the servers that Mary gives the instruction, "Do whatever he tells you," her words apply to all.

Today, are we called to be the servers — do we wait on God's instruction and carry it out, no matter how foolish or impossible it may seem to our human ears? Are we asked to be the disciples, to bear witness to a miracle and to give our testimony? Are we called to imitate the Blessed Mother herself and give encouragement to follow God's word?


Let us examine our gifts and listen in the silence of our hearts to the direction of the Spirit. Then and only then, let us do whatever He tells us.
