


It's important for us to remember that the fact of the birth of Jesus—the Son



- 1) Continue to play Christmas carols in your home, in your car,... You might be a little embarrassed to be caught at a stop-light playing carols in your car, and getting those "That's so last week" looks from people. If so, I give you permission to "cheat" just a little and play Handel's "Messiah" or Bach's Christmas Oratorio instead.
- 2) Have a Christmas party DURING THE CHRISTMAS SEA-SON. We cram way WAY too many of our social gatherings into the season of Advent and neglect the Christmas Season. Schedule an Epiphany Party and gift exchange!
- 3) Read THE BEST CHRISTMAS PAGEANT EVER by Barbara Robinson to your kids. Or pick up Dickens' CHRISTMAS CAROL for yourself. Even better: Continue to enter more deeply into the actual events of that first Christmas by opening up your Bible at home and reading the first couple of chapters of the Gospels of Matthew and Luke.
- 4) Keep those Nativity scenes up in your homes until the conclusion of the Octave of Christmas (January 1st), or even 'til the feast of the Baptism of the Lord (January 9th this year).

In these and many other ways we can prolong our celebration of the birth of the Lord. Shoot! I milk MY birthday for days and weeks after the fact. And this is THE LORD JESUS we're talking about here, people! His birthday is one that we should be celebrating for quite a while!

CHRISTMAS DAY READINGS

2nd Reading: Hebrews 1:1-6

Brothers and sisters: In times past, God spoke in partial and various ways to our ancestors through the prophets; in these last days, he has spoken to us through the Son, whom he made heir of all things and through whom he created the universe, who is the refulgence of his glory, the very imprint of his being, and who sustains all things by his mighty word. When he had accomplished purification from sins, he took his seat at the right hand of the Majesty on high, as far superior to the angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

For to which of the angels did God ever say: You are my son; this day I have begotten you? Or again: I will be a father to him, and he shall be a son to me? And again, when he leads the firstborn into the world, he says: Let all the angels of God worship him.

Gospel: Luke 2:1-14

In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that the whole world should be enrolled. This was the first enrollment, when Quirinius was governor of Syria. So all went to be enrolled, each to his own town. And Joseph too went up from Galilee from the town of Nazareth to Judea, to the city of David that is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family of David, to be enrolled with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. While they were there, the time came for her to have her child, and she gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.

Now there were shepherds in that region living in the fields and keeping the night watch over their flock. The angel of the Lord appeared to them and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were struck with great fear. The angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Christ and Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was a multitude of the heavenly host with the angel, praising God and saying: "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."





Button batteries are small, round discs used in anything from toys to key fobs to watches. If these batteries end up being swallowed or placed in a child's nose or ears, they can cause serious damage — from electrical currents to tissue burns. Keep an eye on the power sources for the toys your children get this Christmas, and consider taking extra safety measures for anything with a button battery. 




