



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About the Easter Banners



"I am the Resurrection"

The risen Christ stands triumphantly atop the empty tomb. He is surrounded by an almond-shaped aureole of light, symbolizing His power and glory. Blue and gold rays are the colors of divinity, and the outer ring of water is a symbol of life and calls back to Jesus' words in John 3:5, "I assure you, no one can enter the Kingdom of God without being born of water and the Spirit."

The gold sky represents the glory or light of God, which surrounds Jesus, flooding the scene and overpowering the deep dark blackness of the tomb at His feet. Jesus holds a staff with a cross, which has become a symbol of victory.

"Mystical Union"

Mystical union refers to humanity's ability to be united to God, which was made possible by Jesus' sacrificial death and resurrection. In

the scene, Jesus has entered the realm of Hades, or the place where faithful people from past generations have been waiting to enter heaven.

Jesus stands on crossed, broken gates over a black abyss which contains locks, hardware and sarcophagi. This symbolizes that the power of death to bind humanity has been destroyed.

Jesus takes Adam by the wrist, showing that it is by His power that anyone is saved. Behind Adam are Eve, his son Seth, John the Baptist, Kings David and Solomon, and others. Behind Jesus in the gold center of the aureole are a host of angels waiting to welcome the faithful into heaven. An escort of angels also flies above them.

Far off in the distance on the right, we see a remembrance of the three crosses on Golgotha, now bare and standing in the rising sun.

Why Do Catholics Do That?

Why do Catholics need annulments if they are divorced and want to remarry?

Catholics believe that the joining of a man and a woman in matrimony is a sacred act. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, marriage is a permanent

partnership of a man and a woman. Because a marriage lasts "until death do us part," no one can enter into a second permanent partnership while his or her first spouse is living. An annulment is a declaration by the Catholic Church that after careful investigation, flaws

were discovered in the relationship that prevented it from becoming a sacramental marriage. An annulment does not remove the civil contract, and it does not render the children illegitimate.


SIR
