Merry Christmas!

For us Catholics, Christmas does not end, but rather it begins on Christmas day. We just started celebrating on Friday or Thursday evening, for those of you who attended the Christmas eve Mass. We celebrate that the Word of God manifested himself being born as a baby.

The Gospel reading used during the day on Christmas day, was the prologue of St John's Gospel. We heard that "the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth."

The very Word that sprang all the universe into being became a human being like us. From his innermost being, the divine power of God was present alongside a total goodness, understanding, and kindness...full of what we mean by humanity in the best sense of the word.

Unlike wise figures of the past such as Socrates or Buddha, compared to them we have relatively few sayings of Jesus. Although Jesus was a teacher full of wisdom, it was his presence both authoritative and kind, powerful enough to calm storms and full of mercy to forgive sins, that made a difference. His personal encounter with his disciples and the women like Mary Magdalen, that connected their desire for God with the everlasting love present in Him.

The pure humanity of Jesus Christ allowed him to connect with anyone with an open heart. He related to us as a brother at times, when he taught us to call God "Our Father," and at other times, he related to us as a father figure himself, like when he called his disciples "little children." In all cases, he was compassionate, and he experienced the breadth of all human emotions.

That same connection is available to us. Although we cannot experience his physical presence like they did, through one another, we can make his love present, and through the Scriptures, and the Sacraments, he becomes present for us as well.

Whenever we decide to be present to someone, and to give ourselves by our time and resources, especially to someone who cannot repay us, and perhaps even anonymously when we gain nothing, except the joy of giving, we are in touch with our own humanity in its pure form. Christmas is a season that elicits from us these desires to be like Christ.

Christ's birth brings joy because the long awaited Messiah came in such purity to cleanse humanity of all impurity. He was born in a precarious situation, and would die a shameful, painful death --yet through his human assent to the will of the father, and his human love for us, he truly is God present. He rose from the dead, and ascended into heaven, yet he remains with us in various ways, but in a special way through the sacraments. In the Eucharist Jesus Christ is made present by the power of the Holy Spirit to offer us His love, His mercy, His joy, His very Self for these times of 2020 and for all times.

The Good King by Dan Keays, Parishioner

(Adapted "Good King Wenceslas," written in 1853 by John Mason)

Prince Vaclav of Bohemia rose from his chair and strode slowly, pensively, across the upper room of his castle. The sun had just set, and a full moon was rising over the soft, gentle, snow-covered landscape. It was the day after Christmas, the feast of St. Stephen, in the year of Our Lord, 931.

The young prince had much to consider. He was heir to the throne of this immensely beautiful land, but there was treachery afoot. Rivals coveted his authority and were actively plotting against him. His Catholic faith was dear to him, but it placed him on the wrong side of the political power struggle. He feared for his kingdom, for his family, and for his own life.

As he looked out upon the moonlit panorama, the sight of a poor man gathering firewood caught his eye. The night was bitterly cold, and this man had little to wrap him. Vaclav called his young page to his side and enquired about the forlorn peasant. The man lived about three miles from the castle, near the fountain of Saint Agnes. Forgetting his own troubles, the prince called for food, wine, and pine logs. He and the page would trek to the man's home and share a warm meal with him and his family.

As they set out, the harsh winter weather worsened. The temperature dropped even further, the wind was fierce, the journey arduous. Suddenly, the young page dropped to his knees, looked up at the monarch and feebly proclaimed he could go no longer. He felt he was to die there. Prince Vaclav looked at him with understanding, and told him to walk in his own footsteps. As he did, warmth from the earth where the prince had walked filled his body, and he was revitalized. The two made their way to the peasant's home, and the prince's charity and love prevailed.

(Prince Vaclav was, indeed, later killed, by his own brother. After his death, word of his love and charity spread, and he became known as Wenceslas the Good. He was canonized a saint).

Amici has discussed how we can never presuppose what God is thinking, and how sometimes faith is not about having all the answers.
