~ “Get behind me....”

To days readings are about perceptions of how maybe we see things. The first reading speaks of how we might see ourselves as being “tricked.” The word that is used is “duped.”

It mentions that we let ourselves be duped. To be duped is to be easily deceived. Maybe the question might be is that, why would I allow myself to be deceived? How could I benefit from it? What is in it for me? In this material world we get duped into almost all kinds of things, can't we? Er hear of things all the time that affects what it is that we do, or buy. Remember the gas shortages way back in the 70's? Why did we buy into that? That was over 50 years ago and we still have gas today. I also remember when grocery store shelves were empty and people were scrambling to try and buy what they needed. Sometimes they fought in the store. Why? Lets look at how we have been duped in our faith. *“I keep praying to God to help me and I wonder if He hears my prayers?”* how many times have I heard that comment. Sometimes people loose faith because they felt that God doesn't listen to them. But the fact is that He does. St. Augustine talks about how his heart was set on fire for God. In the 1st reading we hear, [His name] *“becomes like a fire burning in my heart.”* I think it is the same for all of us. I remember what Fr. Greg Heidenblut said one time when we were at In~n~Out standing in line waiting to order, and a young man asked Father if he could sit with us and ask some questions. After we got our orders, Father mentioned to me *“that people were hungry for God.”* Yet still had questions. This young man had faith, but he also had questions. The Responsorial Psalm reiterates this, *“My soul is thirsting for you, my God!”*

In The 2nd reading St. Paul reiterates this beautiful relationship we have with God in our bodies, our temples of God's Spirit. That we need to change how we see ourselves and not conform to this age. Today people don't see God's dignity in themselves. Satan wants to separate us from that dignity. But The will of God will prevail to what is good pleasing and perfect. In the Gospel message we hear that Jesus tells His disciples what is going to happen to Him. I'm sure that they were not ready to hear this and so Peter's response is challenged by Jesus. Peter's perspective is to protect his Lord and Savior, but Jesus's perspective is much different than that of Peter. Jesus understands why He was sent to earth, for our salvation, that He must undergo horrible things. But we must remember that Rocky Jon's son is a tough fisherman and that he will protect Jesus with his life.

That nothing bad will happen to Him. Remember when Satan took Jesus up the mountain, and Satan tried to tempt Him. That he would make things better for Him, giving Him all those things if He would bow down and worship him. But Jesus sets Satan straight. You don't challenge Him. Much in the same manner, Jesus tells Peter to be supportive in Helping Him do what the Father has sent him to do. *“get behind me,”* and be supportive. Don't be like the evil one! Jesus begs the question, “why would you want to forfeit your life for something that does nothing for you? It is about our relationship with Jesus! would you go beyond yourself for your Lord; would you take up your cross and follow Him. Remember that Jesus is the WAY, the TRUTH, and the LIFE!!! Yes Lord you duped me and I let myself be duped! I will follow you Lord wherever you go!

~ “¡Ponte detrás de mí...!”

Las lecturas de hoy tratan sobre cómo percibimos las cosas. La primera lectura habla de cómo podríamos vernos a nosotros mismos como víctimas de un engaño; se utiliza la palabra “engañado” o “embaucado”. Menciona que nos dejamos engañar. Dejarse engañar implica ser crédulo o fácil de embaucar. Quizás la pregunta sea: ¿por qué permitiría yo que me engañaran? ¿Qué beneficio obtendría de ello? ¿Qué gano yo con eso? En este mundo material, nos dejamos engañar con casi cualquier cosa, ¿verdad? Constantemente oímos hablar de cosas que influyen en lo que hacemos o compramos. ¿Recuerdan la escasez de gasolina allá por los años 70? ¿Por qué creímos en aquello? Eso fue hace más de 50 años y hoy en día seguimos teniendo gasolina. También recuerdo cuando los estantes de los supermercados estaban vacíos y la gente se apresuraba a intentar comprar lo que necesitaba; a veces incluso peleaban dentro de la tienda. ¿Por qué? Veamos cómo hemos sido engañados en nuestra fe: *“Sigo rezando a Dios para que me ayude, pero me pregunto si escucha mis oraciones”*. ¡Cuántas veces he escuchado ese comentario! A veces, las personas pierden la fe porque sienten que Dios no las escucha. Pero la realidad es que sí lo hace. San Agustín habla de cómo su corazón ardía de amor por Dios. En la primera lectura escuchamos que [su nombre] *“se convierte en un fuego que arde en mi corazón”*. Creo que nos sucede lo mismo a todos nosotros. Recuerdo lo que dijo una vez el padre Greg Heidenblut cuando estábamos haciendo cola para pedir comida en un restaurante In-N-Out: un joven le preguntó al padre si podía sentarse con nosotros y hacerle algunas preguntas. Después de recibir nuestros pedidos, el padre me comentó que *“la gente tiene hambre de Dios”*, aunque todavía tenga preguntas. Aquel joven tenía fe, pero también tenía dudas.

El Salmo responsorial reafirma esto: "¡Mi alma tiene sed de ti, Dios mío!". En la segunda lectura, San Pablo reafirma esta hermosa relación que tenemos con Dios a través de nuestros cuerpos, que son templos del Espíritu de Dios. Necesitamos cambiar la forma en que nos vemos a nosotros mismos y no conformarnos a los criterios de esta época. Hoy en día, la gente no percibe la dignidad que Dios ha puesto en ellos. Satanás quiere separarnos de esa dignidad, pero la voluntad de Dios —que es buena, agradable y perfecta— prevalecerá. En el Evangelio, escuchamos a Jesús decirles a sus discípulos lo que le va a suceder. Estoy seguro de que no estaban preparados para oír esto; por eso, Jesús cuestiona la reacción de Pedro. La perspectiva de Pedro es proteger a su Señor y Salvador, pero la visión de Jesús es muy distinta. Jesús comprende la razón por la que fue enviado a la tierra —nuestra salvación— y sabe que debe padecer sufrimientos terribles. Sin embargo, debemos recordar que Pedro es un pescador recio y decidido a proteger a Jesús con su propia vida, convencido de que nada malo le ocurrirá. Recordemos cuando Satanás llevó a Jesús a la montaña e intentó tentarlo, ofreciéndole mejorar su situación y darle todo aquello si tan solo se postraba y lo adoraba. Pero Jesús pone a Satanás en su sitio; a Él no se le desafía. De manera similar, Jesús le pide a Pedro que lo apoye en la misión que el Padre le ha encomendado: "¡Ponte detrás de mí!" y bríndame tu apoyo. ¡No actúes como el Maligno! Jesús plantea la pregunta: "¿Por qué querías perder tu vida por algo que no te aporta nada?". ¡Todo se reduce a nuestra relación con Jesús! ¿Serías capaz de ir más allá de ti mismo por tu Señor? ¿Tomarías tu cruz para seguirlo? ¡Recuerda que Jesús es el CAMINO, la VERDAD y la VIDA! Sí, Señor, me sedujiste y me dejé seducir. ¡Te seguiré, Señor, adondequiera que vayas! ~Padre Tom
