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

KINGDOM BUILDER UPDATE



As we anticipate Easter and embrace the season of spring we are constantly reminded of how God brings life from the ashes, a tomb, and barren soil.

The generosity of Kingdom Builder Foundation donors provides a front row seat to God causing streams to springing up in the desert. This season has been hard – threatening isolation, uncertainty, and disruption.

In 2020 when the pandemic started Kingdom Builder Foundation granted \$50,000 to meet the immediate needs of food insecurity and other basic needs as society worked to find a new norm. These grants enabled organizations like Casa De Amistad, Pathways to Citizenship, and Solana Beach Presbyterian Church to assist individuals and families most immediately impacted by the crisis.

As the pandemic has progressed we continue to see needs around us, but more importantly, we see the creativity and ingenuity of organizations persevering to meet the needs and demonstrate the love of Christ in tangible ways. Casa de Amistad's local tutoring has continued. Pathways to Citizenship continues to help immigrants from around the world navigate the complexities of obtaining U.S. Citizenship. Foundation Matthew 633 has increased efficiency, now providing twice-weekly provision of food and diapers to vulnerable families in North County. Lakeside Community Presbyterian Church started an Eat and Greet program to build relational bridges to reduce hunger and feelings of isolation in their community. The people of the Afar continue to experience increased quality of health services and access to safe drinking water. A Village outreach program in Pakistan is teaching hygiene and prevention and cures for common diseases while conducting worship services, bringing life and hope.

Our mission at Kingdom Builder Foundation is to support the building of God's Kingdom by providing grants to Christ-centered missions through legacy gifts of members and friends of Solana Beach Presbyterian Church.






