

In December, we were blessed by another generous gift from Del Mar Healthcare to help bridge the gap as we move forward into 2024. To extend the financial gifts given, and ease our way into the new reality of meal costs, we are raising the lunch price by \$1, effective January 10th. Meals in Debin Hall will be \$9, and to go meals will be \$10.

PLEASE NOTE: The increase in meal price does not change our desire to have everyone enjoy a great meal and fellowship on Wednesdays. Do NOT let the cost of meals keep you away! If you would like to join us for lunch and are unable to pay for lunch, please see Cindy. We want to include everyone, regardless of ability to pay.

KINGDOM BUILDER UPDATE

Kingdom Builder Foundation Changing Lives Through Faith in Action

Kingdom Builder Foundation completed it's fall 2023 granting cycle, granting just over \$70,000 dollars to 9 grantees. This granting was made possible by the faithful legacy giving of members and friends of Solana Beach Presbyterian Church (SBPC).

Ministries that received grant funding this fall include:

COMPA Campus Outreach Tijuana (Mexico) - SBPC Missionary Alejandra Ortiz has received a scholarship to pursue a PhD at the Oxford Center for Mission Studies. This grant provides assistance with relocation costs for her and her family from Tijuana to Oxford, UK so she can pursue these studies.

Foster Hope Ministry (San Diego) - This grant will procure 300 Christian gratitude journals created by former foster youth Irene Ekdahl so that she can promote them to 25-40 churches throughout the San Diego County area as well as use them in her mentoring of foster youth in group homes.

Mission Flight (Mexico) - Provides three medical and dental clinics over 2024 to the remote Huichol Indians in Mexico, an unreached people group.

One Collective (Kenya) - Training, Empowering, and Facilities Development to rehabilitate accommodations at the Matumaini Rehabilitation Center for disabled children.

Pathways to Citizenship (Solana Beach) "Love the Stranger: Serve 20% more immigrants". Pathways' Love the Stranger Legal Expansion project will address the urgent need for low-cost and pro bono legal immigration services in San Diego County by accrediting an additional DOJ representative and cross-training volunteer attorneys and legal interns to represent and assist qualified, low-income immigrants and refugees.

South Sudanese Presbyterian Fellowship (San Diego) - This grant funds a Bible Study for the Youth/Children Ministry and Women Ministry.

Urban Life Ministries, Inc. (City Heights) - *UrbanLife College Achievement Network* Funding will provide after-school tutoring, English Language Development (ELD), and college admissions guidance for 250 Low-to-Moderate Income (LMI) students in City Heights.

United World Mission (SBPC Missionary- Kathy Saracoff) (Mexico) - Funding Latin American Mission for a ministry retreat and a vehicle for the Carretas Community Center.

Young Life (La Mesa) Seed funding to help launch a Next Generation Leader candidate for the teen mothers ministry or ministry to kids in crisis with their two year training program.

This "glorious" revelatory biography from a Pulitzer Prize winner is about the most essential Founding Father (Ron Chernow) - the one who stood behind the change in thinking that produced the American Revolution.

<u>February Discussion:</u> The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek by Kim Michele Richardson

The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek is a 2019 novel. The story is a fictionalized account of real subjects in the history of eastern Kentucky. Cussy Mary is a "Book Woman" — one of the Packhorse Librarians who delivered books to remote areas of the Appalachian Mountains during the Great Depression, from 1935 to 1943, as part of President Franklin D. Roosevelt's Works Progress Administration (WPA) program. Cussy Mary is also a "Blue" - the last of a line of blue-skinned people, whose skin appears the unusual shade due to a rare genetic disorder. As a Book Woman, Cussy Mary is highly regarded, but as a Blue, she is feared and reviled, and experiences racism, discrimination and violence.




