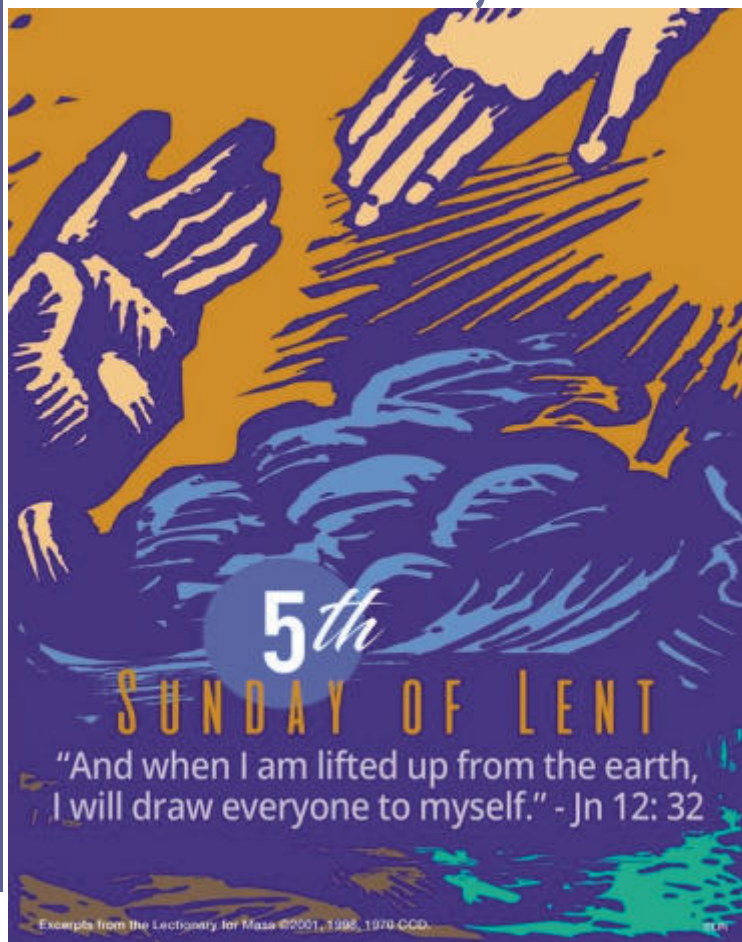

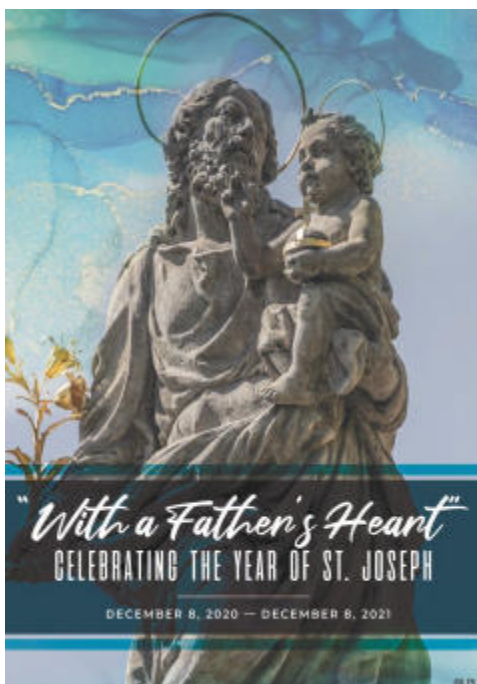

PASTORAL REFLECTION



A SEED THAT SPROUTED

It was a stormy night. The wind blew in all directions; the rain came down in torrents. An elderly man and his wife stood up to the desk of a small hotel in Philadelphia. Half in apology the old man asked, "Can you possibly give us a room? All the big hotels are filled." "All and every room is taken, sir," replied the young clerk, "but I can't send a nice couple like you out in the rain at one o'clock in the morning. Tell you what, sir, you can sleep in my room." "But where will you sleep? Asked the guest." "Oh, I will make out," replied the kind clerk. Next morning as the couple paid their bill, the man told the young clerk who had given up his room: "You are the kind of manager, who should be the boss of the best hotel in the USA. Maybe someday, I will build one for you."

Two years later, the young clerk received a letter with a round-trip ticket to New York and a note from the guest of that stormy night asking the clerk to meet them in the big city. The old man led the young man to the corner of 5th Ave and 34th St. Pointing to a towering new building, the old gentleman declared, "There is the HOTEL I have built for you to manage." Almost speechless, the young man, **GEORGE C. BOLDT**, stammered his thanks. His benefactor was **WILLIAM WALDORF ASTORIA**. The HOTEL was the most elaborate of that day. The original Waldorf Astoria Hotel.

Here is striking proof of what Jesus tells us in the Gospel... "Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat, but if it dies, it produces much fruit." Young George Boldt buried his own comfort and convenience by giving up his own room. That sacrifice sprouted and brought forth the reward of being the manager of the most outstanding hotel in the world.

A seed must die before it can bring forth fruit. This is also true in spiritual things. We, followers of Christ, know that any effort, any sacrifice, any penance, any giving up of comfort or convenience will bear 'much fruit'. This is especially true, when the effort is made out of love for Christ and out of love for our fellowmen, as was the case of our story. Jesus was preparing his followers for His own supreme sacrifice. He permitted his own body to be torn apart in his passion and death, to be buried and then spring forth in the glories and fruits of the resurrection. That death, burial and resurrection, we renew here at this altar this very hour. We just have this week and the Holy Week that are left. It is not too late yet to start 'burying' ourselves, giving up of ourselves for the love of Christ and love for our brothers and sisters in Christ. Find out for yourselves how true the words of Christ in today's Gospel are: namely that **SEED OF SACRIFICE** will bring forth precious gifts. Join Christ, in his sacrifice and you will be with Him as He springs forth joyful and victorious on **EASTER**. God Bless!

#69 A STORY ON THE PARABLE OF DYING: A wealthy businessman recently bought a 200-acre mountain resort. He paid more than the property was worth because of a rare magnificent pine tree, reputed to be 400 years old that was growing there.

Back in the city, many of his friends didn't believe that the tree was that old, so the owner called Tante, his caretaker, to verify the tree's age. Four days later, Tante reported his findings, "Good news, boss!" he exclaimed. "This tree is even older than we thought — 444." "Good work, Tante," said the boss. "How did you pinpoint the age?" "Simple!" the caretaker knew some forestry but little of history said, "We cut it down and counted the rings."

The boss almost suffered a heart attack! Unless you cut down the tree, you can't count the rings on the trunk. The caretaker did the right thing, but with the wrong method.

Baptism PREPARATION

- Infant baptism includes children from birth thru their 6th year (Children 7 or older must attend RCIC).
- Must be registered parishioners and attending Mass (3) months before the Baptism.
- Parents must have original birth certificate of the child when filling out a Parish Infant Baptism Registration Form at the Church's office.
- Single Godparent must have Certificate of Confirmation, and in good standing in the Catholic Church.
- Married Godparents need Marriage & Confirmation Certificates from the Catholic Church.
- Parents and sponsor must attend a Baptism Preparation class at the parish.
- St. Joseph offers a Baptism Preparation Class for Parents and Godparents every 3rd Saturday of each month from 9:00 AM – 12:00 Noon in classroom #4.
- Baptism can be scheduled every Saturday; there are no baptisms during Lent and Holy Week.
- Parents and/or Godparents may give a donation to the Deacon or Priest who is officiating the Sacrament.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.
