

## PASTORAL REFLECTION



#### **REJOICE... THE LORD IS NEAR!**

We are at midpoint in our Advent journey. Today is called "Gaudete Sunday" or "Joyful Sunday." Aside from the usual purple or violet vestment that we use in our Advent celebration, we have the option to use rose-colored pink, denoting gladness and joy. We are glad and we rejoice because we know that the Messiah will come very soon.

The Book of Zephaniah is brief (only three chapters), and a large part of this book has overtones of sadness. The sins of the inhabitants of Jerusalem are listed here, and the projected destruction of the city is mentioned along with the people's anger, anguish, despair and sadness. But towards the end of the book, Zephaniah reveals how the Lord will lift the verdict against Jerusalem. "The Lord... will rejoice over you with gladness, and renew you in his love, who will sing joyfully because of you, as on festival days." (Zep. 3:17-18)

Paul in the Second Reading is overflowing with gladness as he calls upon the Philippians to rejoice and give thanks to the Lord. In the Gospel, a multitude of people experience great joy as they approach John the Baptist asking for baptism. Although John has many followers, he considers himself a mere servant who is unworthy to untie the thongs of Jesus' sandals.

What preparation does John propose to the crowd as they await the Messiah who will baptize them with the Holy Spirit and fire? He advises them to share their goods with the needy and carry out their duties faithfully. The publicans are taught to collect taxes justly, and the soldiers are told to refrain from extortion and to be contented with their salaries.


If we heed John's admonitions, we can bring back joy to Christmas and celebrate it as a truly rose-colored feast!!


#106. A STORY OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST'S ADMONITION: Dr. Karl Menninger, a psychiatrist, tells this story in his book; 'One sunny day in September 1972, a street preacher appeared on a busy corner in downtown Chicago. As office workers hurried by on their way to lunch, the street preacher would suddenly raise his right arm, point a bony finger at an office worker, and shout, "Guilty!" "The effect on the pedestrians was almost eerie," said Dr. Menninger. They would glance at the preacher, look away, glance back, and then hurry on." Application: Would we feel guilty if this preacher pointed at us? For what?

In this 3<sup>rd</sup> Week of Advent, we have only two saints to commemorate. On the 13<sup>th</sup>, we have St. Lucy, Virgin and Martyr, also known as the patroness of oculists and of those afflicted with diseases of the eye; she is also the Patron Saint of Syracuse and all Sicily. On the 14<sup>th</sup>, we have the feast day of St. John of the Cross, Priest and Doctor of the Church, also known as the "Mystical Doctor". The other days are Advent weekdays. This is all for now, watch for the nest bulletin. Happy "Gaudete Sunday" to all!

## PREPARATION

- · Infant baptism includes children from birth thru their 6<sup>th</sup> year (Children 7 or older must attend RCIC).
- Must be registered parishioners and attending Mass (3) months before the Baptism.
- Parents must have original birth certificate of the child when filling out a Parish Infant Baptism Registration Form at the Church's office.
- Single Godparent must have Certificate of Confirmation, and in good standing in the Catholic Church.
- Married Godparents need Marriage & Confirmation Certificates from the Catholic Church.
- · Parents and sponsor must attend a Baptism Preparation class at the parish.
- St. Joseph offers a Baptism Preparation Class for Parents and Godparents every 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday of each month from 9:00 AM – 12:00 Noon in classroom #4.
- · Baptism can be scheduled every Saturday; there are no baptisms during Lent and Holy Week.
- Parents and/or Godparents may give a donation to the Deacon or Priest who is officiating the Sacrament.
