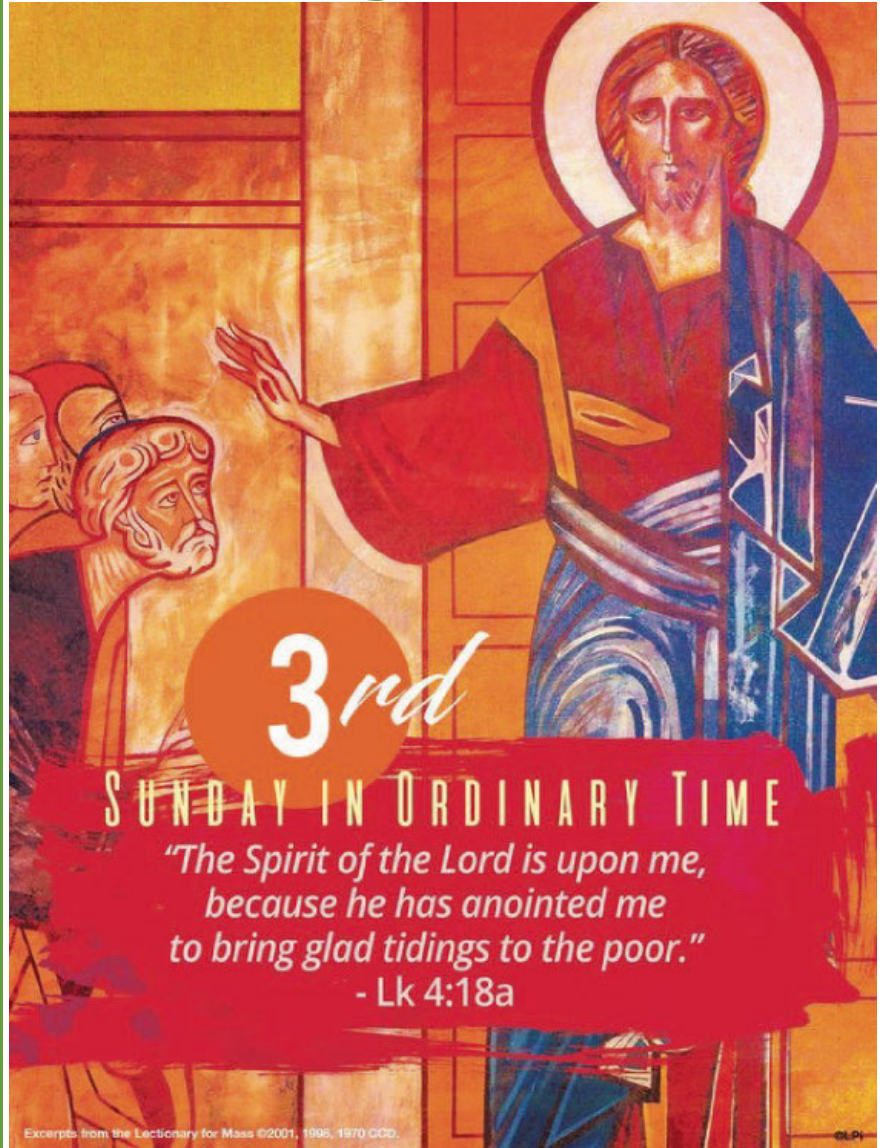

PASTORAL REFLECTION



FAITH NEEDS RENEWAL...

This Sunday's Gospel tells us this: 'Christ had this sad experience'. When He went to his hometown and declared in the synagogue of his messianic mission, He was met with opposition and criticism. "This is Joseph's son surely?" they grumbled. (Lk. 4:22) His town mates could not accept this hometown boy, who had become a teacher and a prophet. Sensing their negative attitude, Jesus said, "No prophet is ever accepted in his own town" (Lk. 4:24). This sad rejection happened almost 2000 years ago, yet it is still happening today. How is my personal relationship with Christ? Or is there a relationship at all?

Why do we good people who speak so much about God, make so little impact on the world and those around us? Think too, of many baptized who are remiss in their duties and responsibilities as Catholic Christians. Some have been brought up in the finest Catholic Schools, yet fail to exemplify the Christian values of honesty, justice and love.

Are we so used to religious matters, so familiar and so conformist that they no longer challenge us? How about our relationship with others? Do we tend to take for granted those we live and work with just because we rub elbows with them day in and day out? Do we see their values and positive traits and occasionally express appreciation? Strange, but we would speak well of others only when they are gone, like in their neurological service! Somebody once said, "He spoke so glowingly about me, I thought I was dead!"

Christ's disappointment over his town mates was due to their Lack of Faith. "He was astonished by their lack of faith" (Mk. 6:6). Perhaps we must be reminded that 'Faith is not a once-for-all decision. Faith must be constantly renewed in our everyday lives.' Christianity is such a decision. So is marriage or ordination to the priesthood, and so are the final vows of the religious brothers and sisters.

In all of these, they are made solemnly and for life. Yet in every case, they need to be renewed and reaffirmed daily. We pray: Lord Jesus, increase my Faith, help my Unbelief. AMEN!

The 28th is the feast St. Thomas Aquinas, Priest, Angelic Doctor of the Church and patron of Catholic Schools, colleges and universities, of philosophers, theologians and booksellers. 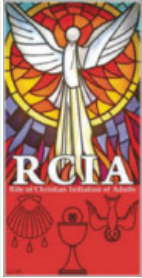

- Infant baptism includes children from birth thru their 6th year (Children 7 or older must attend RCIC).
- Must be registered parishioners and attending Mass (3) months before the Baptism.
- Parents must have original birth certificate of the child when filling out a Parish Infant Baptism Registration Form at the Church's office.
- Single Godparent must have Certificate of Confirmation, and in good standing in the Catholic Church.
- Married Godparents need Marriage & Confirmation Certificates from the Catholic Church.
- Parents and sponsor must attend a Baptism Preparation class at the parish.
- St. Joseph offers a Baptism Preparation Class for Parents and Godparents every 3rd Saturday of each month from 9:00 AM – 12:00 Noon in classroom #4.
- Baptism can be scheduled every Saturday; there are no baptisms during Lent and Holy Week.
- Parents and/or Godparents may give a donation to the Deacon or Priest who is officiating the Sacrament.

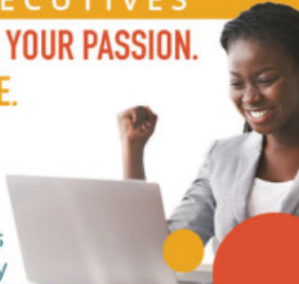
