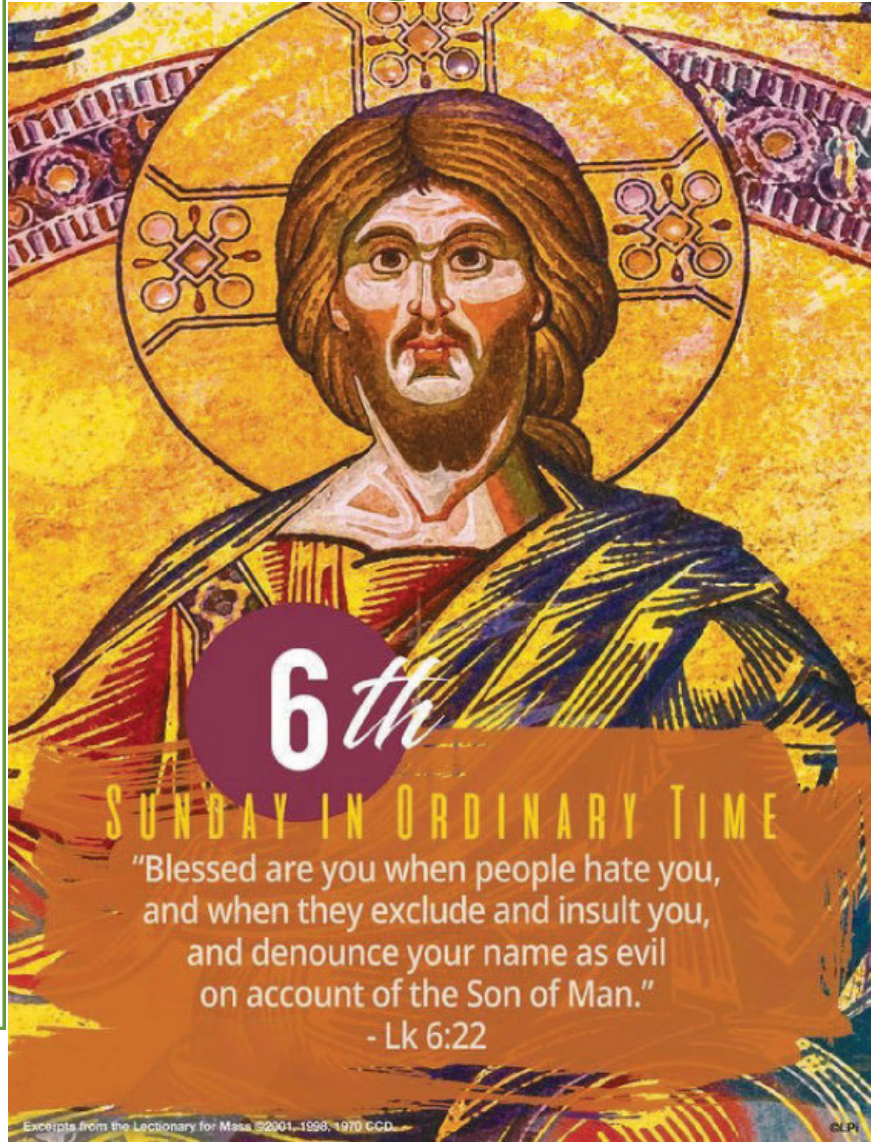

PASTORAL REFLECTION



WHEN A PERSON IS TRULY BLESSED:

This Sunday's Gospel is the shorter version on the BEATITUDES from Luke. Unlike Matthew, Luke addresses the beatitudes directly to his listeners ("Blessed are you...") and not in the third person. This makes the Lucan version more personal and direct. Also, while Matthew speaks of "the poor in spirit," Luke speaks absolutely of the poor." Hence, the Lucan formulation seems to point more to material poverty (which the word 'poor' primarily evokes), although he may also have other forms of poverty in mind.

In any case, those who have no security in life, those who have little or no power, will possess the Kingdom in the future. On the other hand, those who enjoy material blessings in this life are praised and honored, and persecute those who are poor and disadvantaged now, can only expect the opposite woes await them

What is the message of the Beatitudes? Two things addressed to two groups. FIRST, those who are poor and persecuted now, especially because they are disciples of Jesus, are given hope and encouragement to endure whatever they are suffering because God will surely reward their faithfulness and perseverance. SECOND, those who are the cause of the sufferings of Christ's followers (who may also be fellow disciples in Christ) are given a warning to change their lives before it is too late, as they surely will experience what the poor and the persecuted are now undergoing. There will be a reversal of fortune in the life to come.

#115. A STORY OF HAPPINESS LIVING EACH DAY: Three elderly Chinese schoolmates were relaxing in the shade, smoking their long-stemmed pipes and philosophizing. One was a government official, one was a university professor, and the third was a simple farmer.

They were daydreaming about what they would have in the future. The official said all that he would like were two things: a precious porcelain cup filled with tasty tea, and a tall white horse to carry him around the countryside. The professor said that all he wanted was a cup of hot sweet cocoa and two good eyes so he could spend the day reading a nice book. The Farmer said he did not want anything special for tomorrow, but just the regular things that happened every day, like the sunrise and sunset, a well full of sweet water, and the birds resting and singing in his fruit trees.

That night a strong intensity 7 earthquake rocked China. It smashed the politician's dream cup to bits and a falling wall killed his white dream horse. And for the professor, he too, was handicapped: all the cups in the cupboard smashed. And what was worse, the library full of books burnt down. But the farmer's wishes were not in the least affected by the tremor. The sun rose as usual, his well was full of sweet water, and the birds rested and sang in the branches of his fruit trees.

This story exemplifies the truth of an ancient Chinese saying: "Happy is the man who does not dream great things for the future but takes each day as a gift from the hands of God. All presents are GOOD! Amen!

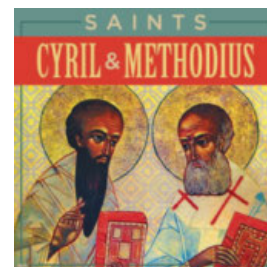

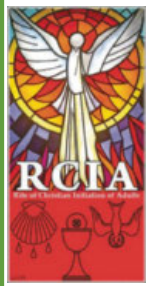

- St. Joseph offers a Baptism Preparation Class for Parents and Godparents every 3rd Saturday of each month from 9:00 AM – 12:00 Noon in classroom #4.
- Baptism can be scheduled every Saturday; there are no baptisms during Lent and Holy Week.
- Parents and/or Godparents may give a donation to the Deacon or Priest who is officiating the Sacrament.

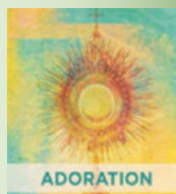

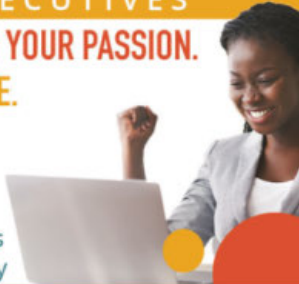
