



## PASTORAL REFLECTION



#### WHY WORSHIP THE DEVIL?

Back in 1971 our newspaper brought us a horrible and almost unbelievable news story. In Vineland, New Jersey, a 21yrs old Mike Newell persuaded his two best friends to tie his hands and feet and drown him. Yes, you heard correctly. Mike convinced his two friends to push him into a pond and watch him die. Why? Mike was a worshipper of the devil. As such he had the wild idea that if he was murdered by his friends, he would be reborn as a leader of 40 legions of devils.

Today, a growing number of Americans are turning to worship the devil. On California St. in San Francisco there is a church of Satan with more than 10,000 dues-paying members. The movement is so important that Fordham, a catholic University in New York, has enrolled a class of 35 students to study all about the devil.

Why would human beings want to worship the devil? One reason is that many have given up the true religion and worship of the true God. Men must have some kind of religion. They turned to the opposite of God – the devil. Others are mentally unbalanced. Another reason is our modern urge to violence, to the unusual, the striking and shocking idea. Devil worship involves all of this. The young man who persuaded his friends to bind him and drown him, had conducted a service in honor of Satan in which he crushed two hamsters in the hands and wiped the blood on his sleeves.

How does a Catholic Christian look at this startling and abnormal honoring of the evil one? Worship of the devil is a complete flip-flop from the opinion of so many that there is no devil at all. Many refuse to believe anything that cannot be fully explained and understood. Put it in this way. Those who refuse to worship and serve the Good One, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, turn to the worship of the evil one.

In today's gospel Jesus meets the devil face to face. Christ answers all his so-called arguments and false promises. As followers of Christ you and I began our life in Christ, by rejecting Satan in the ceremony of Baptism. Again and again we are invited to repeat that renunciation of the devil. Reject him today. Reject him at the end of Lent as we repeat in the ceremonies of Easter Vigil, "I do reject Satan." In this Mass or celebration of Christ's victory over Satan which we just witnessed in the Gospel, we renew our loyalty to Jesus and our rejection of his greatest enemy Lucifer.

Instead of turning stones into bread, as the devil tempted Him to do, Jesus turns bread into His own living body. Instead of falling down and worshipping the evil one, we honor Christ with all our mind and all our heart. How the devil hates the Holy Mass! No wonder some of the most shocking ceremonies in the devil worship take the form of ridiculing and making fun of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

Keep the picture in today's Good News clearly in mind during this Mass and all during Lent. The devil wants murder and cruelty, selfishness and hatred. Christ wants kindness and life, generosity and love. Which one will you honor — the Good One or the evil one? The answer is in you... God bless!



- · Infant baptism includes children from birth thru their 6<sup>th</sup> year (Children 7 or older must attend RCIC).
- Must be registered parishioners and attending Mass (3) months before the Baptism.
- Parents must have original birth certificate of the child when filling out a Parish Infant Baptism Registration Form at the Church's office.
- · Single Godparent must have Certificate of Confirmation, and in good standing in the Catholic Church.
- · Married Godparents need Marriage & Confirmation Certificates from the Catholic Church.
- Parents and sponsor must attend a Baptism Preparation class at the parish.
- St. Joseph offers a Baptism Preparation Class for Parents and Godparents every 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday of each month from 9:00 AM – 12:00 Noon in classroom #4.
- · Baptism can be scheduled every Saturday; there are no baptisms during Lent and Holy Week.
- Parents and/or Godparents may give a donation to the Deacon or Priest who is officiating the Sacrament.
