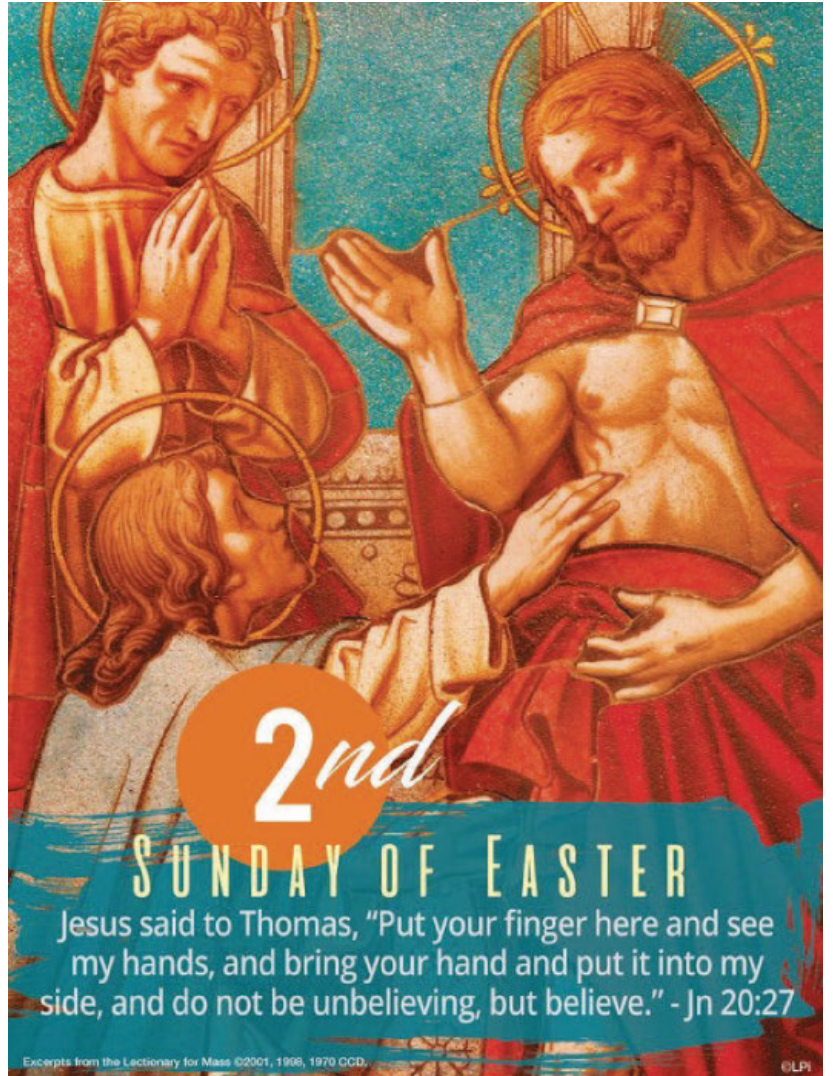

PASTORAL REFLECTION



WHEN GOD SAYS 'LET GO':

"To See is To Believe" goes a worn-out saying or the "Show Me First" attitude can be a cruel saying; for these imply hard-headedness and lack of trust in another. The apostle Thomas in this Sunday gospel, manifested a lack of trust. And of this doubt, the term "doubting Thomas" was coined to describe all doubters and skeptics. Maybe we should not be too hard on Thomas. At least he was doubting the right thing, whether Jesus had actually risen from the dead and was actually alive. After all if Jesus had not come back to life, despite all the wonderful things He had done while alive, He would not have been essentially different from any of us.

Thomas got his wish when the Lord called him by name and mildly censuring him, said: "Put your finger here and look at my hands. Touch and feel my side. Cease to doubt but believe (Jn. 20:27). Confronted with the real Person, there was no more need for Thomas to touch, to feel Christ's side. Instead he fell on his knees and cried; "You are MY GOD and MY LORD!" Jesus acknowledged that Thomas had come from doubt to faith. "You became a believer because you have seen me. You believe because you have proof." But Jesus refers to his friends who were not present, declaring what has been called the last and the greatest of the beatitudes; "Blessed are they who have not seen, and yet have believed." (Jn. 20:29) The word 'blessed' here means happy. We who have never seen Jesus in the flesh but who believe in Him, belong to that happy company.

Nowadays, a lot of people are excited about apparitions and miracles. Like the doubting Thomas, they say in effect: "Unless I see a sign or an apparition, I refuse to believe." If miracles and unusual phenomenon are granted by God, fine! However, faith in God should not hinge on these. FAITH involves a decision to move beyond what could be proven, to cease demanding proof and to trust in God's word. Concretely, there are times when God tells us to trust Him even when it difficult to do so... Here is a story.

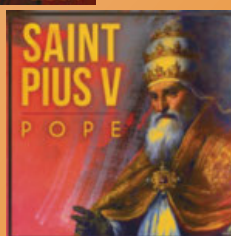
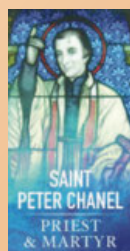
#124. A STORY OF AN 'UNBELIEVING MAN'. While out on the mountain exploring, a young man slipped and fell. Down he rolled over a steep precipice. It meant sure death, but fortunately he was able to grab the branch of a tree which arrested his fall. Hanging precariously with the branch cracking and about to give way, he prayed aloud; "LORD, IF YOU ARE UP THERE, SAVE ME!" A booming voice answered, "YES, THIS IS GOD." "Dear God, please help me", said the man desperately. "Yes, I'll help you," replied the Lord. "But first, do you trust me?" "Of course, Lord. I trust you." The man replied. "THEN, LET GO OF YOUR HOLD!" ordered God. "I'm begging God to save me and He's telling me TO LET GO! What nonsense!" muttered the perplexed young man to himself? So he looked up again and cried, "If there is anybody else up there...Help!

Poor guy! God's command was too much to accept. There are times when God tells us to "LET GO" to trust in Him even when the situation looks helpless and absurd. The right situation ought to be a combination between Faith and Work. As St. Augustine put it: WORK as if everything depends on you, TRUST in God as if everything depends on HIM." God Bless! Amen!

This Sunday is also Divine Mercy Sunday, a day of total forgiveness of sins who approach the Eucharist and the Sacrament of Penance. All sins and punishments are washed away in Jesus' Divine Mercy. On the 25th, we have the feast of St. Mark, Evangelist and author of the oldest and shortest Gospel of St. Mark. He was Patron of Egypt, Venice, Italy and of notaries. On the 28th, we celebrate the feasts of Saints Peter Chanel, Priest and Martyr, protomartyr and patron of Oceania; Louis Mary of Montfort, Priest and founder of the Missionaries of the Company of Mary (S.M.M.). On the 29th, it's the memorial of St. Catherine of Siena, Virgin and Doctor of the Church, patroness of Italy and co-patroness of Europe. On the 30th, we have the feast day of St. Pius V, Pope and implemented the reforms of the Council of Trent. This is all for now, watch for next bulletin.

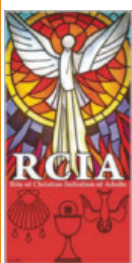

- Infant baptism includes children from birth thru their 6th year (Children 7 or older must attend RCIC).
- Must be registered parishioners and attending Mass (3) months before the Baptism.
- Parents must have original birth certificate of the child when filling out a Parish Infant Baptism Registration Form at the Church's office.
- Single Godparent must have Certificate of Confirmation, and in good standing in the Catholic Church.
- Married Godparents need Marriage & Confirmation Certificates from the Catholic Church.
- Parents and sponsor must attend a Baptism Preparation class at the parish.
- St. Joseph offers a Baptism Preparation Class for Parents and Godparents every 3rd Saturday of each month from 9:00 AM – 12:00 Noon in classroom #4.
- Baptism can be scheduled every Saturday; there are no baptisms during Lent and Holy Week.
- Parents and/or Godparents may give a donation to the Deacon or Priest who is officiating the Sacrament.
